“Jesus is calling you.” When the disciples said this, the blind man threw his coat, sprang up, and came right over to Jesus. I was praying about how this is not always my response. Sometimes I am hesitant. Sometimes I am nervous about what He might tell me. Sometimes I am afraid of what He may ask of me. Sometimes my perception of Him isn't who He actually is. I've been doing a 30-day devotional on the Litany of Trust. It's been personally convicting, realizing I have much more to grow in trusting Jesus. Yet He is always trustworthy.

When the blind man comes over, Jesus asks him, “What do you want me to do for you?” He simply presents his desire to Jesus. He wants to see. Jesus told him that his faith saved him. Immediately, he received his sight. Jesus calls each of us, personally. What's your response?

From the belief that I have to earn Your love...Deliver me, Jesus. From the fear that I am unlovable...Deliver me, Jesus. From the false security that I have what it takes...Deliver me, Jesus. From the fear that trusting You will leave me more destitute...Deliver me, Jesus. From all suspicion of Your words and promises...Deliver me, Jesus. From the rebellion against childlike dependency on You...Deliver me, Jesus. From refusals and reluctances in accepting Your will... Deliver me, Jesus. From anxiety about the future...Deliver me, Jesus. From resentment or excessive

preoccupation with the past...Deliver me, Jesus. From restless self-seeking in the present moment...Deliver me, Jesus. From disbelief in Your love and presence...Deliver me, Jesus. From the fear of being asked to give more than I have...Deliver me, Jesus. From the belief that my life has no meaning or worth...Deliver me, Jesus. From the fear of what love demands...Deliver me, Jesus. From discouragement... Deliver me, Jesus. That You are continually holding me, sustaining me, loving me Jesus, I trust in You. That Your love goes deeper than my sins and failings and transforms me Jesus, I trust in You. That not knowing what tomorrow brings is an invitation to lean on You Jesus, I trust in You. That You are with me in my suffering Jesus, I trust in You. That my suffering, united to Your own, will bear fruit in this life and the next Jesus, I trust in You. That You will not leave me orphan, that You are present in Your Church Jesus, I trust in You. That Your plan is better than anything else Jesus, I trust in You. That You always hear me and in Your goodness always respond to me Jesus, I trust in You. That You give me the grace to accept forgiveness and to forgive others Jesus, I trust in You. That You give me all the strength I need for what is asked Jesus, I trust in You. That my life is a gift Jesus, I trust in You. That You will teach me to trust You Jesus, I trust in You. That You are my Lord and my God Jesus, I trust in You. That I am Your beloved one Jesus, I trust in You.

Political Decisions

"Decisions about political life are complex and require the exercise of a well-formed conscience aided by prudence. This exercise of conscience begins with outright opposition to laws and other policies that violate human life or weaken its protection. Those who knowingly, willingly, and directly support public policies or legislation that undermine fundamental moral principles cooperate with evil" (Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, USCCB, 2015, p. 14, #31).

These are very powerful words from our bishops. The whole section of the USCCB's document on "Making Moral Choices" within Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship was particularly helpful to me, but share a few key sections here:

#34 Catholics often face difficult choices about how to vote. . . A Catholic cannot vote for a candidate who favors a policy promoting an intrinsically evil act, such as abortion, euthanasia, assisted suicide, deliberately subjecting workers or the poor to sub-human living conditions, redefining marriage in ways that violate its essential meaning, or racist behavior, if the voter's intent is to support that position. In such cases, a Catholic would be guilty of formal cooperation with grave evil. At the same time, a voter should not use a candidate's opposition to an intrinsic evil to justify indifference or inattentiveness to other important moral issues involving human life and dignity.

#36 When all candidates hold a position that promotes an intrinsically evil act, the conscientious voter faces a dilemma. The voter may decide to take the extraordinary step of not voting for any candidate or, after careful deliberation, may decide to vote for the candidate deemed less likely to advance such a morally flawed position and more likely to pursue other authentic human goods.

#37 In making these decisions, it is essential for Catholics to be guided by a well-formed conscience that recognizes that all issues do not carry the same moral weight and that the moral obligation to oppose policies promoting intrinsically evil acts has a special claim on our consciences and our actions. These decisions should take into account a candidate's commitments, character, integrity, and ability to influence a given issue. In the end, this is a decision to be made by each Catholic guided by a conscience formed by Catholic moral teaching.

Heavenly Father,

We come before you during this election season, seeking your divine wisdom and guidance. As we prepare to cast our votes, we ask that you grant us discernment and understanding. Help us to see beyond partisan divisions and focus on the qualities that reflect Your justice, mercy, and truth.

We trust in Your generous promise to provide wisdom to those who ask. In Jesus' name, we pray,

Today's Gospel Reading

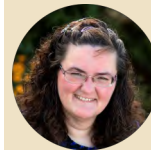

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Venerable Anne de Guigné was born in France in 1911. Her early years were shadowed by the First World War. Her father was killed in action when she was just 4 years old. Anne had a profound understanding of Jesus’ presence in the Holy Sacrament. She developed a strong personal relationship with Jesus, whether in Mass, after Mass in prayer at the tabernacle, or at home. She declared that she loved to talk with “little Jesus.” The grace of these prayerful conversations gave her a deep understanding of the reciprocal love between Jesus and his faithful.

When Anne was 8 years old the first symptoms of meningitis appeared. She offered her suffering as a sacrifice to God. She is attributed with saying, “We have many joys on earth, but they don’t last; the one that lasts is to have made a sacrifice.” At just 10 years old, Anne died. The cause for her sainthood was begun in 1932 and on March 3, 1990, she was declared venerable by Pope John Paul II.
