God Desired You

In speaking with a group of students about the two Great Commandments, love God and love your neighbor as yourself, one wise student stated, how can we love our neighbor as ourselves when we don't love ourselves to begin with, it would be easier to treat a neighbor better than we treat ourselves. The reality of how much we struggle to love ourselves and in turn love others really struck me, for this is very true, especially in our world today. The question I have been pondering since that conversation is, why is it so hard for us to love, cherish, and be confident in who God created us to be? The greatest response I have found to that question is from one of my favorite saints.

On October 22 the Church celebrated the feast day of St. Pope John Paul II, who loved young people and desired so deeply that people would understand that they are created, loved, and valued by God. Each and every person is created simply because God desired them. He desired you! Take a moment and let that sink into your heart. You are here because God desired it. He wanted you! St. Pope John Paul II's formal teaching on humanity is called the Theology of the Body. In this teaching St. Pope John Paul II begins by calling us to reflect on the beginning of Creation, when God created man and women and saw that they were very good. God created humanity to be a

gift to each other, to give and receive, to live in harmony, to love each other and to bring new life into the world. In the very beginning of creation the two greatest commandments were lived out, man and woman loved God above all and they beheld and loved themselves and each other the way God intended. As we all know the story, sin entered the world and humanity became broken. We are no longer living in the original state that God created, we are living in the consequences of original sin. However, we also live in the glory, joy, and hope of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection—as people saved. We are called to live with the goal of heaven inscribed in our hearts, we are called to help other people to journey toward heaven, so that one day we can rejoice together with God forever.

So why is it so hard for us to love, cherish, and be confident in who God has created us to be? Because sin entered the world and we have been wounded. Yet, St. Pope John Paul II's teaching gives us hope because he reminds us that in the beginning it was not so and Christ has conquered sin and death, and so sin and death are not the final end. God is calling you to love Him and love your neighbor, but first take a moment to simply relish with joy that God desired you, for only when we live in this confidence of God's love for ourselves will we be able to look at another person and see God in them and be able to love them as ourselves.

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Accompaniment Strategies

An important element of discipleship is the ability to accompany others. Many of us don't know what this means or how to do it because we may never have experienced it ourselves. Accompaniment is, by definition, "to go with as an associate or companion" (www.merriam-webster.com). If you accompany someone, you are going along with them to a particular destination. We are all on a journey of faith. Jesus models the process on the Road to Emmaus (Lk 24:13-35). Fr. Christopher Martin breaks down the process in his booklet, "The Art of Accompaniment," from the National Conference of Diocesan Vocation Directors. Take note of how Jesus exercises these accompaniment strategies:

Foster a closeness that awakens trust. – Jesus enters into the travelers reality and brings light into their darkness.

Pay attention to your intuition that discovers veiled expectations and requests for help. - Jesus knows the answers to their questions but allows them the opportunity to explain without judgement.

Give credible witness through your own life of joy and self-giving. – Jesus' response to them reveals his understanding, his hope, and his fidelity. He provides encouragement to keep going.

Be flexible with your time and always be available to listen. - Jesus made time for these two disciples because He knew it was important.

Maintain a spirit of reverence before those in whom the grace of God

manifests itself, from whom a free response is expected. – Jesus allowed them to grow in knowledge and acceptance slowly over time.

Clarity in disclosing the demands of discipleship without ambiguity – Jesus reminds the disciples that this will be difficult. Being a disciple is challenging but well worth it.

Patience in order not to pressure or hurry the other in their process which may be slow. – Jesus conducted this interaction with reverence and patience. So, too, should we when journeying with another.

Create moments of genuine encounter without pressuring the other. – Jesus gave them space to carry on without him. We need to give that space as well while remaining connected, just as Jesus did through the Holy Spirit.

Offer consolation in difficult moments. - Jesus doesn't take away every trial and tribulation. Our role is not to shield others from the experience of sacrifice or to help them avoid the cross, but to offer them consolation that they can bear it well. Share your own experiences.

Intercede for the grace of his/her vocation and light in his/her discernment. – Jesus shared the Eucharist with them. We need to make Eucharist part of our accompaniment. This is the goal: Bring our loved ones to Christ.

Alexandra Buchlmayer & the Laboure Society

You know about the critical shortage of priests, sisters and brothers. Here's the rest of the story...

Every year, thousands of priestly and religious vocations are unable to answer God's call for one simple reason, outstanding student loans. It may come as a surprise, but many individuals discerning a vocation in the U.S. each year are prevented from entering seminaries and religious institutions for financial reasons. Most people today graduate from college carrying heavy fiscal burdens; unfortunately, dioceses and orders, desperately in need of new vocations but already stretched to the limit, are unable to assume their debt.

Alexandra Buchlmayer from Pewaukee, is one such vocation. To overcome this obstacle, the Passionist Nuns of St. Joseph Monastery and Alexandra have

partnered with the Laboure Society, a Catholic 501(c)(3) nonprofit. AROUND CAMPUS

Outside Projects

Many projects have occurred on campus since June. THANK YOU, our parishioners, for your patience and providing the funds to beautify our grounds, improve our environment, and keep us safe. Here is a short update:

Stone edging near south narthex:

Each year salt and snow plowing wreak havoc on the grass areas. We repair and seed only to have tire tracks the next day. We are trying this solution with the help of American Landscape (parishioner, Shea Hughes). When this works, we may expand to the entrances that face "corner cutting".

North Church lot islands: American is installing decorative rock in the beds and mulching some of the adjacent areas to beautify our grounds. Funding was from a generous estate bequest.

Drainage work was completed by J&M Services (parishioner Mike Parker) near the columbarium and the ball diamonds to alleviate the puddling and deterioration of the asphalt. Funded through the Long-term Capital budget which comes from your generous gifts.

Parking lots received an annual line painting by Pentagon Properties (Kurt Whalen) keeping us safe and helping us park between the lines. (Operating Budget)

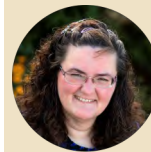

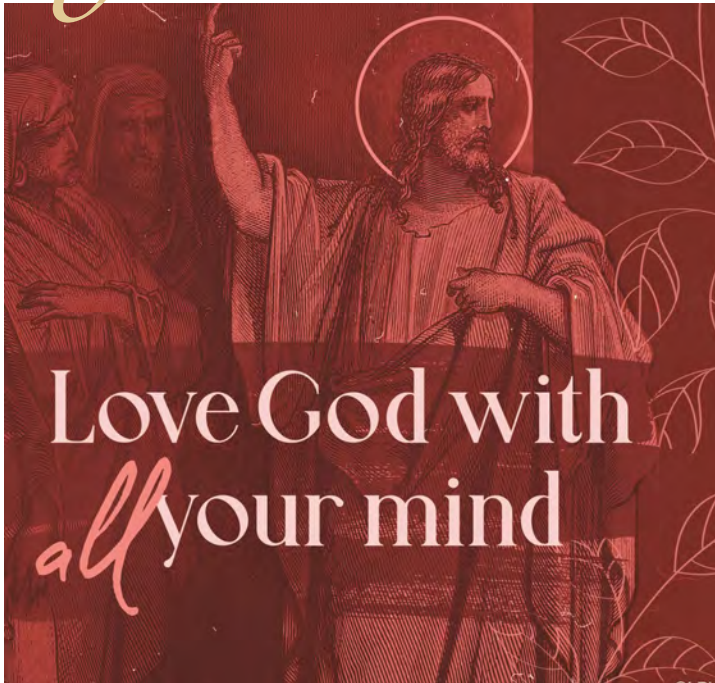

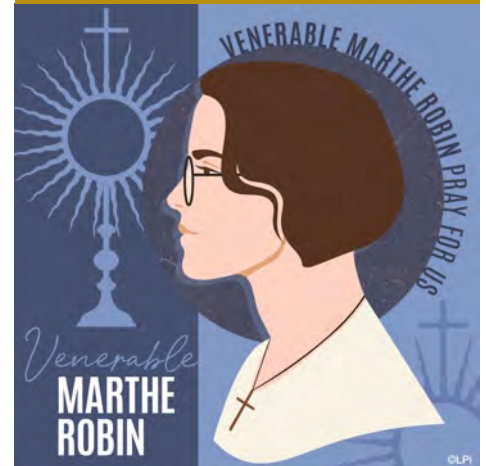

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Venerable Marthe Robin (1902-1981) was a French layperson and mystic. As an adolescent, Marthe was struck by encephalitis, a swelling of the brain. By the age of 17, the disease paralyzed her legs. She suffered from headaches, pain in the eyes, fainting, fever, vomiting, and periods of coma. In 1925, with her arms now paralyzed, she offered a solemn prayer consecrating her life and her sufferings to God to help spread love in the world.

Marthe entered the Franciscan Third Order in 1928. Two years later the disease paralyzed her digestive track. From this time on, she would survive on the Eucharist alone, unable to take any other nourishment. Beginning in 1930 she suffered an intense reliving of the Passion of Christ each Friday, bearing the stigmata.

In 1939 her illness attacked her ocular nerve, leaving her in near darkness. With the help of Fr. Georges Finet, she founded the “Foyers of Charity,, homes of light and charity run by single people, couples, and priests living in

Our conference meets with the people who call for help personally in their homes to determine their needs and how we can help.

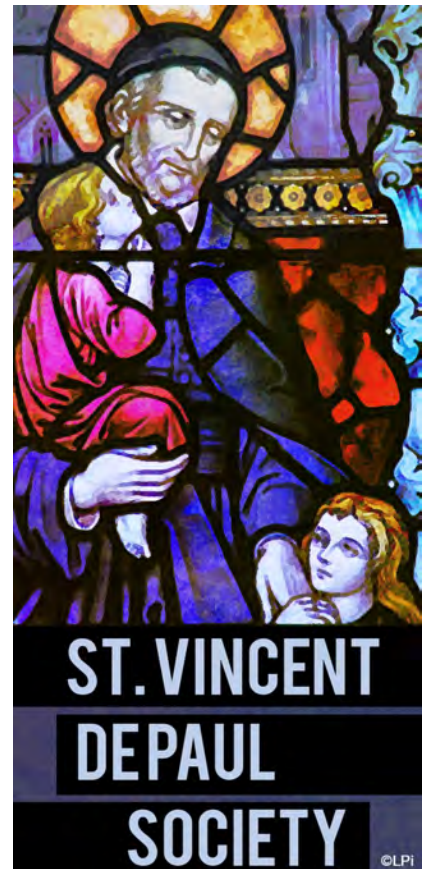
Here are the stories of two different patrons we have recently assisted. These are real situations with the names changed.

She also recently lost her job of almost 20 years. She was able to find a new one quickly, but they made a mistake in her banking information and so she did not receive her first paycheck. We were able to help her with gift cards for toiletries and gas. These gift cards were donated by St. Dominic through the Giving Tree. And we were able to give her a voucher to the St. Vincent de Paul store for clothing and a mattress for her grandson.

“Susie” is a divorced mother of four. Her ex-husband was deported and left her in debt with no child support. One of her children is disabled due to a surgery to repair a hip issue and is in a wheelchair. Susie cannot leave him alone. She has found a roommate to help with the rent and she works for Door Dash when she is able to find someone to watch her son. She also does some work from home. We were able to help her with vouchers for some bedding and clothing.
