The Cost of a Burrito



Once at an evening Mass as a poor college student, the collection basket was fast approaching and I only had a ten-dollar bill. I was planning on using that to buy my favorite Chipotle burrito that night for dinner. Should I keep the money? Who would know if I did? If I gave it away, what would I eat? Would I be okay? I kissed my future burrito goodbye, dropped the money in the basket, and winced. But strangely, during the rest of the Mass I felt more engaged than usual. I had skin in the game. I left the Mass excited to see how God would take care of me. And he did, in amazing ways.

When the poor widow places two

copper coins in the temple treasury, Jesus doesn't pity her. He praises her. He blesses her. He brags about her. He celebrates her as the temple's largest benefactor. Her giving is an act of radical, concrete trust in God. It is as if she is entering a new level of giving that excites Jesus, because she contributes not out of her abundance, but she gives "everything she had."

What a challenge this is to each one of us! How easy it is to ignore this! But imagine the eruption of the energy of faith, hope, and love that would be unlocked if our financial sacrifices to the Church actually tapped into daily bread and not only our disposable income. This coming week, I challenge us to try this in some way and see what happens in our hearts. Even if it costs us a burrito. ©LPi

SCHOOL & SAFETY & SECURITY

Campus Updates

Updates are a continuation from last week.

THANK YOU for your patience and providing the funds to beautify our grounds, improve our environment, and keep us safe.

School Entrance was re-landscaped by American Landscape. This main entrance used by guests, perspective families, and staff is now more inviting. (Funded from a bequest.)

Flagpole landscaping was completed as part of an Eagle Scout (Logan Wambach) project. This makes the entrance to the PAAC more inviting.

Certified Playground chips (110 yards) installed by Natural Solutions to keep our kiddos safe. (Operating Budget)

Middle school classrooms received new countertops and sinks, and had cabinets refinished. This is the third of four phases addressing the aged facility. The early childhood wing is scheduled for next summer. (Longterm Capital Fund)

Floor coating in six main restrooms, the foyer near the drop off doors, and the foyer in the middle school entrance to cover dated and deteriorating tile. (Long-term Capital Fund)

Three new Interactive Flat Panel Displays were installed, bringing the total to nine. These are replacing the Smart Boards on a planned schedule. (Knights Move and Technology Fund.)

School HVAC received some welldeserved maintenance and upgrades allowing better control of the classroom temperatures. (Love One Another Capital Campaign)

Church HVAC. Replaced four condensers for air conditioning, new air handler system to provide better and more efficient air flow, connected the newer, high efficiency boilers located in the school to the air handler to replace four furnaces. Updated software to control the system. (Love One Another Capital Campaign)

Safety and Security

External school doors received safety film coating to mitigate forced entry.

Additional cameras placed in the school hallways allow the monitoring of any nefarious activity.

Existing cameras (internal and external) upgraded to the newest technology.

Several doors received electronic access control to limit access. The access fobs replaced with a more secure version.

All external entrances on campus have electronic access. This allows us to identify the fob used to access the buildings. No external keys are distributed.

New LED parking lot lights installed and programmed. Lights are one of the best deterrents available, and LED lights reduce electricity costs

All of the above safety and security projects are funded by a FEMA grant.





SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Gemma Galgani (1878-1903) was born in Tuscany. After her mother's death, Gemma was educated by Sisters of St. Zita at a day school.

In 1897, Gemma's father died, leaving his children destitute. Taken in by relatives, the orphan fell seriously ill. She suffered a curvature of the spine, was paralyzed, and struck deaf. She had large abscesses on her head and her hair fell off. On her deathbed, she received a vision of St. Gabriel of the Sorrowful Mother who promised to pray a novena to the Sacred Heart with her. Miraculously, when the novena ended, she was cured.

Gemma lived an intense prayer life. She experienced ecstasies and was reported to levitate. In 1899, Gemma received the holy stigmata. Each Thursday evening, the marks of the wounds of Christ would appear, disappearing on Friday or Saturday. She is called the "Daughter of the Passion" because of her deep union with Christ's Passion. In January 1903, Gemma contracted tuberculosis and died in April of that year. ©LPI
