

#### He's Got This

Apologies to my mom in heaven and sister in Vernon who will roll their eyes as the word "got" is used thirteen times in this reflection.

Walking through the school hallway, you hear some interesting phrases. One that caught my attention was "I got this." This phrase was more popular when our son was in grade school, complete with an inflection at the end. A few years ago, our campus access road was named "you got this." On the softball field, a fly ball is met with "I got it." We are proud; don't need anyone to help us. We got this. Right?

#### Wrong!

While it may be true that you and I think we "got it," the truth is we don't "got this" and we don't need to get it alone. The Good News is God's got it and He provides everything we need to get it.

Fast forward to the Mass of Remembrance, a beautiful part of the grieving process. How else can you explain it? Families coming together to put their trust in God after losing a loved one. Having participated as a grieving family the past two years with the loss of my mom in 2023 and mother-in-law in 2024, it became quite clear. We don't got it. God does.

All of us have or know people who

have challenges or are suffering... medical issues, mental health, relationships, finances, and a host of other things. I am not saying doctors don't play a part (lest the Pastor get upset with me), and we certainly have an important role in dealing with our own issues and those of someone we love or simply know. God puts the people we need right in front of us. Sometimes we are the person who is called to be the support and guidance needed for another.

What can we do? Pray. Pray WITH others...right then and right there. Be Christ to someone in that moment. Don't worry, He will give you what you need in the moment.

Lean in. "Let go and Let God." Give it to Him fully and without reservation. Listen to Him. While we "got a little," He's got it all. All we need to do is ask Him and trust Him. One day we hope to understand His reasons for all that occurs in our lives, the blessings and the challenges. For now, just know . . . He's Got This.



#### Walk with Me

The Catholic Church in the United States has been pursuing a Eucharistic Revival. A major event was the Eucharistic Congress held in Indianapolis this past summer. Thousands of Catholics descended upon the city to welcome and celebrate the Blessed Sacrament. Those in attendance, and those watching from around the country, experienced a renewed love and appreciation for the presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, body and blood, soul and divinity.

As the Eucharistic Revival continues. it is promoting what we are striving to accomplish at St. Dominic: sharing Christ's presence in our lives with others. The Eucharistic Congress is calling us to evangelization through an effort called "Walk With One."

The Church universal is keenly aware that it takes every one of us to help our fellow brothers and sisters see how much God loves them and how a life centered in Jesus Christ can bring a level of peace and happiness that the world can not provide. "You have made us for yourself, Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in you" (St. Augustine). If you have come to know the peace that the Lord provides, you are to help others to know it. This is discipleship. This is accompaniment. This is evangelization. This is The Way. While St. Dominic Catholic Parish is providing opportunities to grow in relationship with Jesus, we know that we are not reaching everyone. The Missionary Discipleship Training Group is an option we have to help

people gain the confidence and learn the skills to share their faith with others. If this option has been a challenge for you to pursue, we would like to encourage you to try "Walk With One." In the words from the Eucharistic Revival website:

"There is someone in your life right now whom Jesus longs to call to himself. He wants to spark a relationship with them and bless them with his sacraments. In this Year of Mission, Catholics across the U.S. are saying "yes" to a special form of heart-to-heart accompaniment called the Walk With One initiative. This is your opportunity to be God's instrument in the life of another person. Imagine how our families, neighborhoods, and country will be transformed if every active Catholic answers this call!"

Whether you pursue Missionary Discipleship Training at St. Dominic or "Walk With One" through the Eucharistic Congress, we must never be afraid to bring the love of Jesus to others in the manner that is most comfortable for each one of us. If Jesus is the center of your life, you shouldn't be afraid to talk about Him. Our world needs to be reminded of His love and He only has us to do it. If not you, who? If not now, when?

Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 13:24-32. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.







#### SAINT OF THE W



St. Justin Martyr's (c. 100 – 165) education was a mix of history, poetry, rhetoric, and philosophy. He was fascinated by philosophy and though he studied in the various schools, felt that the philosophical schools were missing something.

Justin continued to seek a higher truth. He was struck by the Christians he saw being persecuted for their beliefs and the early martyrs who went to their deaths fearlessly and wondered at the truth and peace they carried. An old man spoke to him of the prophecies of the Jewish people and of Christianity. These powerful witnesses worked a conversion in Justin, and he was baptized around the age of 30.

He is most well known as the author of apologies, or explanations, of the early Church. These texts give detailed descriptions of the early Church, the elements of faith, and the Mass.


