

#### The Light of the World

Joy to the world! The Lord is come! Today's Feast gives us much to ponder. The Presentation of the Lord does not always occur on Sunday. In some traditions, this feast is the official conclusion to Christmastide. In some countries, today's feast is called Candlemas Day, named as such for the candles which are blessed today.

With the cycle of readings that we follow this year, it may seem a little odd that in the past month, we heard of the visiting Magi, we witnessed Jesus' baptism, and saw water changed into wine. But wait! Today, Jesus is a baby again, a little over a month old (40 days to be exact) and brought to the temple with the Blessed Mother for their purification rites. The Presentation in the Temple is the final manifestation of Jesus in his infancy, as Light of the World, thus we bless candles on this day.

Another unusual occurrence specific today, is that we hear from three prophets in Sacred Scripture: Malachi (For he is like the refiner's fire, or like the fuller's lye. He will sit refining and purifying silver, and he will purify the sons of Levi), Simeon, (behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many and proclaiming the Child Jesus as a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel), and Anna (she gave thanks to

God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem).

How does today's feast speak to you and me? The Feast of the Presentation calls each of us to reflect on how we bring Christ into the world—how we carry the Light of Christ, presented to us in baptism to be "kept brightly burning." Just as Mary and Joseph offered Jesus to God, we are invited to offer our lives to God in service and love of our neighbor. Simeon's words remind us that Jesus is a light to all nations. In a world that too often feels divided and dim, even dark, how can you and I become a bearer of His light? Small acts of kindness, a listening ear, or a word of encouragement can be powerful ways to be the light of Christ.

As we reflect on the many manifestation of Christ in recent gospels today, moving forward into the weeks and months ahead to contemplate the life and light of Jesus, let us carry the themes of this Feast. Let us welcome the King of Glory into our hearts, trust in His refining work, and share His light with those around us, in great or small yet powerful ways. May we, like Simeon and Anna, rejoice in encountering Christ and share that joy with the world. Let Earth receive her King! Happy Sunday, friends!

#### Hypocrisy

"Being in a church doesn't make you any more Christian than being in a garage makes you a car."

Sit with that quote for a second. What comes to your mind when you ponder that statement?

At first blush, it is rather humorous, but when you start to really think about it, it isn't so funny. It is surprising how many of us may actually be taking this approach to our relationship with God and His Church. Just because you occupy a pew from time to time doesn't make you any more Christian or Catholic than the person that doesn't and vice versa.

This quote was one that I quickly wrote down while listening to Fr. Mike Schmitz's Bible in a Year while out for a run. I literally stopped in my tracks, rewound the episode, and made a note in my "notes" app so that I could remember it. What a phenomenal call to action! If I want to call myself a Christian/Catholic, I need to make sure I talk the talk and walk the walk as much as I am humanly able to. My first and foremost priority is my relationship with Jesus. It is from that relationship that everything else flows.

Hypocrisy is just as unattractive today as it was in Jesus's time. As disciples, we must talk the talk and walk the walk with humility and grace. We must not fall into the trap of self-righteousness. The effort put into trying to be all for Jesus is what is to be seen, as if it really matters what others see or think. It matters

what God sees. To judge or place blame is not the approach to take as we don't know what any person is going through. We don't know their story. What we need to do is approach with love and care and go from there. That is why The Way at St. Dominic encourages talking to others, learning their story, and praying together. It may very well be the difference between a pew dweller and disciple. Disciples are in love with God and it shows in how they talk and how they walk. Can you identify the disciples among us vs. the pew dwellers? I bet you can but be sure you look in the mirror first (Mt 7:3-5).

Want to move beyond being a pew dweller into being a disciple? Try applying a few simple things to your routine:

Prioritize Jesus – make Him a first thought not an after thought

Pray, like really pray, not just recite a bunch of words – what is it that you truly desire for yourself and for others

Participate in the sacraments, our sources of God's grace

Go to Mass and receive the Eucharist regularly even if you have to start small, at least start

Engage with others in like-minded community, a community centered in helping your soul get to heaven
