

The Power of the Holy Spirit

Do you believe the Holy Spirit is at work in you? Though we cannot see Him, we can recognize His presence and when we allow Him to guide, instruct, and change our hearts and minds. As we invite Him into our lives and surrender to His power, we may experience strength during difficult times, a greater ability to forgive, and an increase in His spiritual gifts.

The excerpts below from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops article entitled, "What is Evangelization" speak to the transforming work of the Holy Spirit.

"We must be open to the transforming power of the Holy Spirit who will continue to convert us as we follow Christ. If our faith is alive, it will be aroused again and again as we mature as disciples. (14)

Tranformation speaks of the change of heart that, as a member of the Church, each one must undergo. The Gospel speaks across time and space to each human being, each mind, each heart. It asks us what we think about our lives, how we hope, whom we love, and what we live for. If faith is not transforming each heart and life, it is dead. (16)

The Gospel must overflow from each heart until the presence of God transforms all human existence.
Sometimes this means that, as believers, we must confront the world

as did the prophets of old, pointing out the claims of God to societies that are blind to God. More often, however, this means that we must let our faith shine on the world around us, radiating the love of Jesus by the everyday way we speak, think, and act. (17)

This gospel message gives us a different vision of what life is about. We see a pattern of love, hope, and meaning because the intimate relationship with God in which we were created, lost through sin, has been restored by Jesus, whose death has destroyed our death and whose resurrection gives us the promise of eternal life. We do not see a world of blind forces ruled by chance, but a universe created to share God's life . . . to live for God and others in love. We do not calculate what we think is possible, but rather, know the Spirit of God always makes new things possible, even the renewal of humanity. (21)

This vision we share is the power of the Good News. As it compels us, we believe it can compel, by its beauty and truth, all who sincerely seek God. (22)"

How have you seen the Holy Spirit at work in your life? If not, ask Him in daily to give you the mind and heart of Jesus, to lead and guide you, and watch what happens!

Being Disruptive

I have been reading a new publication from our mission partner, Evangelical Catholic, entitled "Mission Ready Friendship," by Jason Simon (Ave Maria Press, 2024). It is meant to assist the reader in their approach to sharing the Good News of Jesus within their circle of influence. It is full of practical advice and stories. In fact, the subtitle is "A blueprint for deeper relationships and life-changing faith." As disciples, we are called to share the Good News of how Jesus working in our lives with others because we know that a life with Jesus is one worth living. As JPII said. "A life with Jesus is an adventure!" Well, not everyone is open to hearing about that especially while enjoying an adult beverage over dinner and friendly conversation. So how is this supposed to happen without awkwardly forcing the issue?

A nugget from the book is this: When we love another person, it means that we are willing the good of the other; we care about their wellbeing. Knowing that the best thing for them is a relationship with Jesus, we have to let them know. It is the relationship you have with them that dictates how and when you let them know or move them forward. This is called being disruptive. It is also what we call accompaniment. Take what is a normal flow of conversation or interaction and subtly disrupt it. The author suggests taking a leap to move the conversation/interaction/ relationship deeper. "Let those of us then who are mature be of the same mind: and if you think differently

about anything, this too God will reveal to you. Only let us hold fast to what we have attained" (Philippians 3:15).

The primary disruptive task Jesus gives us is to help people "hold fast to what they have already attained." If you know that your friend has stopped attending Mass, invite them to go with you. If you know your friend is struggling, offer to pray with them. Our friends drop us hints all the time about what they need. We need to help them pursue it. We would encourage our friends in other aspects of their lives, why do we hesitate when it comes to a beautifully healthy relationship with Jesus that really has no downside? As disciples, we are to walk with those we love where they are at first, then allow the Holy Spirit to work through us to move our loved ones into relationship with Jesus (p. 121). It is not of us, but of the Holy Spirit. The great usurper is when we strive to show that as disciples we are right and the other is wrong. This is not a proper discipleship mindset. Our mindset is to be one of love and companionship, a "let me show you" mindset. We don't change people, God does that through us, in us, and with us. Our job is to get out of the way! If you want to move a person's heart toward Jesus, it is not through confrontation and argument. It is done through love, prayer, and attentive companionship (accompaniment).




