In the End, Does it Matter?

When I was a teenager, the priest I would go to for confession used to tell me over and over: "In the end, we all get the same dirty hole in the ground."

What he meant was, it doesn't matter how rich or smart or well-liked we are. We're all heading to the same place. This life comes to an end for every person. All the money earned, all the stuff, all the worldly esteem, will at some point be of no further use. We all get the same dirty hole in the ground.

It was an important message for me to hear, because at the time, it all seemed so important: my after-school job, my FAFSA application, and my grades. The admiration of my friends and teachers. I was so consumed with what I was going to become that I wasn't spending a lot of time thinking about who I was **BECOMING**. But the who is the only thing that lasts until the next life.

And to be honest, it's all still too important to me. Avoiding sadness and disappointment. Saving money and being liked. Focusing on "the five -year plan" when it comes to career, house plans, and a whole bunch of other things I can't take to my dirty hole in the ground.

Jesus was radical in his teaching that the "stuff" in life wasn't all that important. It was radical for him to say that the worldly signs of success — wealth, popularity, pleasure — did not amount to a whole lot in the grand scheme of things, and that suffering could sanctify us. It was radical in the ancient world, and it's radical today.

Worth & Sacrifice

What is your soul worth?

How about this: what is the soul of your child worth, your spouse, your best friend?

This, my friends in Jesus, is what our religion is all about; a thing is worth what someone is willing to sacrifice for it. That "thing" is you. That "someone" is Jesus. That "sacrifice" is His own life. If we take another step out, that "thing" remains you. That "someone" is God. That "sacrifice" is Jesus.

You are worth what someone is willing to sacrifice for you.

Jesus sacrificed His life for you. God sacrificed His son for you. A thing is worth what someone is willing to sacrifice for it. In the eyes of the Divine, you are so worth it. God loves you and wants to be with you for all eternity. You are His most prized and beautiful creation. What are you willing to sacrifice for your soul? What are you willing to sacrifice for your child's soul? What are you willing to sacrifice for the soul of your spouse or friend? Well, consider this, the best thing that you can do for the sake of your soul, and the souls of those whom you love, is to have a relationship with Jesus. To be very clear, the best thing you can do for the sake of your soul and the soul of those whom you love is to bring them to Mass to partake in the best thing ever – Jesus Christ, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. What are you willing to sacrifice to do the best thing for yourself and for your loved ones?

God was willing to humble himself to be a human being, to suffer and die. You are pretty worth it to Him. Is He worth it to you? The God of all Creation, the giver of all that you have, the source of all goodness waits to learn through the example of our lives if He is worth it to us. We sacrifice for sports. We sacrifice for work. We sacrifice for any number of things, but is there the return in investment from those things that even comes close to having a relationship with God? Can sport or work bring you peace? Can sport or work bring you joy? Can sport or work give you eternal life in Heaven? So then, what are we doing here folks? In the secular world, everything and everyone is replaceable as one trend or one influencer is replaced by the next, yet we sacrifice our time and energy to these things all the time. We sacrifice our lives for those things that don't sacrifice for us. Why?

The first commandment says that we should not have false gods, yet we do it all the time. We do that because we are made for worship, but we worship what we are drawn to. So many of us are drawn to the wrong thing. It is time to check in. A thing is worth what someone is willing to sacrifice for it.

The parish has a vibrant Marriage Enrichment Ministry, Women's and Men's groups, a Young Adult Group, a community service group, a liturgical group that focuses on special liturgies, and a large number of catechists forming people for the sacraments.

This growing community needs our help to repair and renew their campus to better serve their members. They are eager to learn how to care for their facility and to build community with us. 
