Joyful Witness

"Proclaiming Christ means showing that to believe in and to follow Him is not only something right and true, but also something beautiful, capable of filling life with new splendor and profound joy, even in the midst of difficulties. To be evangelizers of souls, we need to develop a spiritual taste for being close to people's lives and to discover that this is itself a source of greater joy. To be Mission is at once a passion for Jesus and a passion for His people." ~ *Pope Francis*

Does this quote from Pope Francis enlighten your understanding of the last part of our vision statement?

The Body of Christ, the Church grows through witness; a particular kind of witness – one that is joyful and also authentic. It is this type of witness to Jesus that will lead other people to seek, know, and become Christ.

Fr. Ben J. Cameron, C.P.M. in his article, "Joyful Witness to Christ or Proselytism?" shared what his idea of witness includes:

Evangelization: bringing the Gospel to those who have not received or accepted it yet.

New Evangelization: bringing the Gospel again to those persons and societies that had once embraced it, but have essentially lost the Faith.

Catechesis: education and formation of those who have the Faith so that

they grasp it more deeply and live it more authentically.

Apologetics: being ready "to give reasons for the hope that is within you" (1 Peter 3:15), which can be a powerful way of bringing people to Christ and our Catholic Faith.

Christian Charity: a life which is truly based on the teachings of Jesus Christ and His Church should be attractive to others, and lead them to Christ.

Martyrdom: the martyrs are the ultimate witnesses to Our Lord Jesus Christ; the word "martyr" means "witness," and the willingness to die for Christ has led many, many souls to embrace our Catholic Faith – "the blood of the martyrs is the seed of Christians," as Tertullian said in the second century.

Pope Francis has called each and every one of us to live and witness to Christ much more authentically and joyfully. And this joyful witness to Christ will attract other people to the Church. In the 17th century, St. Francis de Sales said that you "attract more flies with a teaspoon of honey than with a whole barrel of vinegar." A true joyful witness will attract many persons to the truth, beauty, and goodness of our Catholic Faith.

May we all be such joyful witnesses, leading others to Christ!

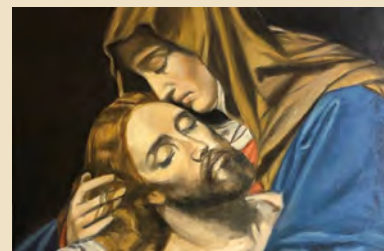

BEAR WITNESS

On Holy Ground

As disciples of The Way, we should be ready to share the goodness of God in our lives with anyone we may encounter. The Holy Spirit places people in our path all the time who depend on our witness to God's presence to move them on their own faith journey. Sharing how God works in the big and small ways makes Him known. Today's column is a story from one of our parishioners, Leo V, who wanted to share how God worked in his life.

"In our Catholic Church calendar, Lent is period set aside for fasting and prayer. A time when we celebrate the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, accepting His death on the cross as an atonement for our sins.

I'd say about 8 years ago, at St. Dominic, Holy Thursday to be exact, I experienced something that I will never forget. After the prayer service that Thursday afternoon, my wife and I decided to go home with the plan of coming back later in the evening for the vigil. Around 9:00 PM, we headed to small chapel where the monstrance was now displayed.

I looked inside and saw a number of people already there. I slowly walked towards the door when a "gentle persuasive spirit" or "invisible but loving being" stopped me from entering the chapel. It was as you would imagine - unexpected, so I did not know how to react. I waited for a few seconds outside the door when I heard these words echoing in my heart.



'Remove your shoes for you are entering holy ground.'

Immediately, I remember the scriptural passage in the Bible taken from Exodus 3:5 'Moses, Moses!' And he said, 'Here am I.' Then God said, 'Do not come near, put off your shoes from your feet, for the place on which you are standing is holy ground.'

I paused and asked myself, 'Am I just imagining things or is this really true?' The scripture passage that came to mind is perfect for what is about to happen. Jesus Christ is truly present in the monstrance that is displayed inside the chapel. I am approaching this living God!

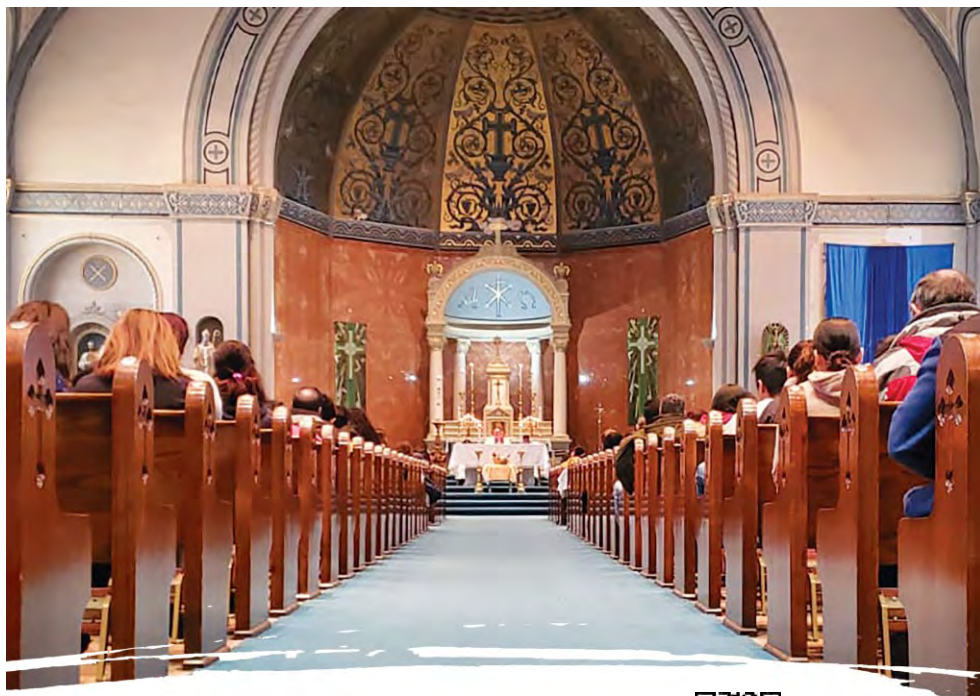
In obedience, I did what I was asked to do. I removed my shoes and hid them away from the public view so as not to attract attention. This experience has changed how I approach the adoration chapel, especially when the Blessed Sacrament is displayed!

Praise be to our God. Now and forever."

Today's Gospel Reading

Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Luke 4:1-13. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.

Why was Jesus tempted?

This passage tells us a lot about the character of the devil. Did he really think that Jesus would fall into temptation? He certainly knows we will. How are you striving to reject Satan and cling to Jesus?

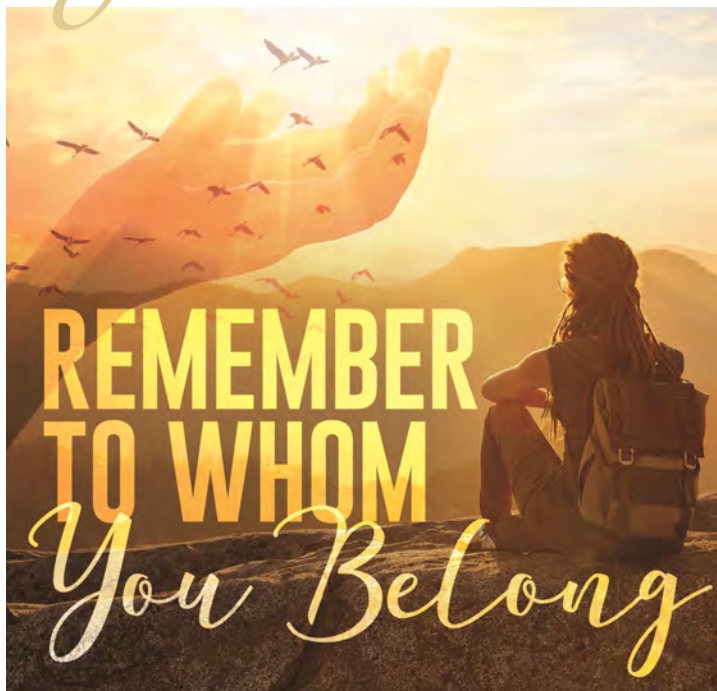

6. Offer a final prayer of thanks and exit quietly after genuflecting.

Current Church discipline on fasting permits one to take a main meal and two lesser meals which together do not equal the main meal.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat and meat products as well as days of fast. The other Fridays of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat and meat products.

All persons who have reached their 14th birthday are bound by the law of abstinence. All adults are bound by the law of fast from their 18th to their 60th year.

St Joseph – A Guide for the 21st Century

Heroic Living in the "Insignificant" Parts of our Lives

Pope Francis calls St. Joseph "an intercessor, a support, and a guide in times of trouble." He adds, "Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation."



We too have a role to play, even in what may seem like insignificant parts of our lives. This presentation will look at St. Joseph as he appears in the Church's liturgy, in the Catechism, and in the Church's social teaching. Joseph can be a companion to us in trying times, a guide to following God's promptings in life, and a reminder to search for Christ in unexpected places and among the least of God's people.

Gary Pokorny is the Board Chair for the National Community of Catechetical Leaders. He served as Director of Catechesis for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee from 2007 to 2023. Prior to that, he served as Director of Lay Formation at Saint Francis Seminary, as a parish director of religious education and as a youth minister. Gary holds a Master of Divinity from Saint Francis School of Pastoral Ministry, and a Post-Master Certificate in Pastoral Theology from University of St. Mary of the Lake.
