

Come Back to the Cross

Two years ago, as our mom began her journey home to God, she held court in the ICU room. There were conversations with spouses, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. One by one the five of us, her children, entered alone to listen. A strong and loving woman with remarkable faith, she chose her words carefully so there could be no argument. Arguing was pointless, you were not going to win, besides, she was usually right. She opened her prayer book, instinctively brought to the hospital, and handed me the prayer Come Back to the Cross.

Dear Lord, you became man, suffered, and died to win salvation for all souls. Look graciously on the souls of those who have drifted away from You and the faith. Grant them Your grace to see the errors of their ways and return to the fold of Your care

Teach me to stay close to them during this trying time and strive to convert them by action and prayer more than by words that may antagonize.

O sweet Jesus, I trust You to do everything to bring Your children back to You. Amen.

Mom said, "Michael, you need to get them back to Jesus, get them back to His Church. Get the babies baptized." Thanks mom. That isn't too daunting. But isn't this what we are ALL called to do? Is there a better time to start than Lent? Is there a better image than THE Cross? You share your favorite restaurant, movie, recipe... why not your faith?

In my early 20's, I was lost, distracted. Working Sunday mornings was a good rationalization. I was busy. God would understand. Decades later, a framed prayer in my office reads: "Lord, I shall be very busy today. I may forget Thou, but do not Thou forget me." Yep, it was mom's, She is still teaching me.

Add these prayers to your daily conversation with God. Share it with those who need to see it. Seek the lost or distracted during this Lent; family, friends, or acquaintances. God will provide the words.

LISTEN to their story...it is still being written and Jesus has the lead role.

SHARE your story of how Jesus is your rock; how He gives you the strength to face the challenges of this world.

PRAY WITH them. It may be awkward at first, but both will move past it.

JOIN them during the Triduum and at Easter. Join them the Sunday after Easter.

There are three players in this story, Jesus, the lost, and those called to "Be Christ" and walk with the lost (that is all of us). Thankfully, all is possible with and through God. He gave His only Son for us. The least we can do is give Him our hearts and tell His story.

ENCOUNTER THE DIVINE

Prayer & Community

As disciples of The Way, we should be ready to share the goodness of God in our lives with anyone. The Holy Spirit places people in our path all the time who depend on our witness to God's presence to move them on their own faith journey. Sharing how God works in big and small ways makes Him known. Today's column is a story from one of our parishioners, Cathy N., who wanted to share how God worked in her life.

"I knew that something was wrong during my routine dental oral exam when the dentist asked to "get the camera." I saw it in his face. He handed me a referral slip and told me to go to an oral surgeon for biopsy. I followed his directions and upon receiving the results of the biopsy, I was found to be at risk for squamous cell carcinoma. The surgeon sent me to a head and neck specialist at Froedert.

Before the appointment I attended the 8:30 AM Friday Mass at St. Dominic, like I usually do. I went forward to receive the Anointing of the Sick which is offered every Friday at Mass. After Mass, I was approached by one of the daily Mass attendees who asked if I wished to be prayed with. I said "Yes." She and another woman took me to pray in the prayer corner in the south narthex. Both women started to pray with me and over me. With my permission, they placed their hands under my chin, on top of my head, and on my shoulders. I felt a strange "lifting" of a spirit going upward at one point, like a release. When prayer was complete, I was given a prayer book by the women. I thanked them and I thanked God for the blessing. I went home and I read the prayer book.

Two days later, the oral surgeon called me to his office. He shared the results of my biopsy. He let me know that my margins were clear, but to see a cancer specialist for treatment. No cancer had spread! I was to pursue regular check ups in order to watch things. I shared the good news with the women who prayed with me. I wasn't totally out of the woods, but for now, things were in a positive place. Since this occurred, with God's help and the prayers of wonderful people, I am cancer free."

Prayer is a powerful thing. While this is truly miraculous, prayer does much to bring comfort to our sorrow and eases the burdens of our pain. When we pray with others, we surround ourselves in community. Prayer and community do so much to lighten the load of anything we might be carrying.

"Come to me all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).
