Bearing Witness

I am fascinated by minor Gospel characters. These people — the rich young man, the adulterous woman, the teachers at the temple — share the stage with Jesus only briefly. They bear passing but powerful witness to crucial moments of his earthly ministry. They breathe the air he breathes. They hear the sound of his voice. Some of them feel the touch of his skin.

And then they go on with their lives and disappear into obscurity. They become just another one of us.

I think of the child who sat in Jesus' lap while he said those famous words: "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the One who sent me."

What did the boy think? Did he understand the words, or did he only know that they were gently spoken? Did he only think to himself how kind was the face of this man, and how consoling and warm his embrace?

I picture this child growing up. Perhaps he married and loved his wife and children. Perhaps he was

happy, or perhaps he was not. Perhaps he became wealthy or was even wealthy to begin with. Perhaps he, like so many other children of that era, had only a very short life, and returned quickly to the arms that enveloped him that day in Capernaum.

We don't know. But we know he was there: he saw Christ, he felt him, he heard him. We sigh to think of it. How lucky. If only we could, too. Then it would be easier. Then we could be holy.

But we are all this child in Capernaum. We are all the woman at the well. We are all the centurion at the cross. Every time we kneel before the Host and hear the words "This is my Body," we occupy the same earthly time and space as the Messiah, and he fixes upon us the same gaze he fixed upon them.

We all bear witness.

We receive him, and then we go back to our lives, our ordinary lives.

Do we carry him with us? Do we dare?

I will praise your name, O Lord, for its goodness. — Psalm 54:6

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Righteousness

I have been stuck on a word that appears regularly in the Gospels: righteousness. More often than not, my mind glazes right over it when reading or listening. It may be that my mind never questioned that Jesus would speak about righteousness because He was always "right," being both God and man. This is not the correct way to understand what Jesus was saying. The understanding that righteousness means that you are always right is a very "worldly" understanding. To understand righteousness in this manner is really what the word self-righteous means. Righteousness and self-righteousness are two very different things. Self-righteousness reeks of pride and arrogance, two of the deadly sins. Whereas, being righteous is virtuous.

I began to ponder this when studying the Gospel of Matthew. John the Baptist is explaining in Matthew 3:11 that he is baptizing with water for repentance. Later, in Matthew 3:15, Jesus is baptized to fulfill all righteousness. John baptizes for repentance and Jesus baptizes for righteousness. But doesn't Baptism result in repentance? Yes, that one time. However, Baptism propels us into a new realm of existing. We receive sanctifying grace, a union with God, which results in being born into righteousness by the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Through Baptism we are set apart and can't go backwards. We are now meant for more. Repentance and righteousness are not synonymous. When you

repent, you are acknowledging that you have chosen incorrectly on your path toward holiness. When you repent, you do not become righteous. Righteousness means to conform to the will of the Father. This means that you are striving to only choose that which God wants for you to begin with. Baptism frees us from Original Sin and opens us to righteousness but does not ipso facto result in righteousness. Likewise, reconciliation absolves us of sin and opens us to righteousness but does not ipso facto result in righteousness. Righteousness is the work of a dedicated disciple, one who grows in holiness through prayer, study, and action. To be righteous means to be committed to doing what the Lord commands as demonstrated by Jesus perfectly. As a disciple strives for righteousness, a disciple is striving for holiness. A disciple acknowledges and pursues repentance toward that end.

As we enter into Holy Week, consider the sacrifice it takes to be righteous. Watch very closely and listen very carefully to all that Jesus does to conform to the will of the Father. He makes no excuses. He does not argue. He doesn't shrink from responsibility, a responsibility given to Him by the Father. Jesus faces each moment head on and in prayer knowing that it is the right thing to do. He acts with righteousness.

Thank you, Jesus. Help me to be more like you.

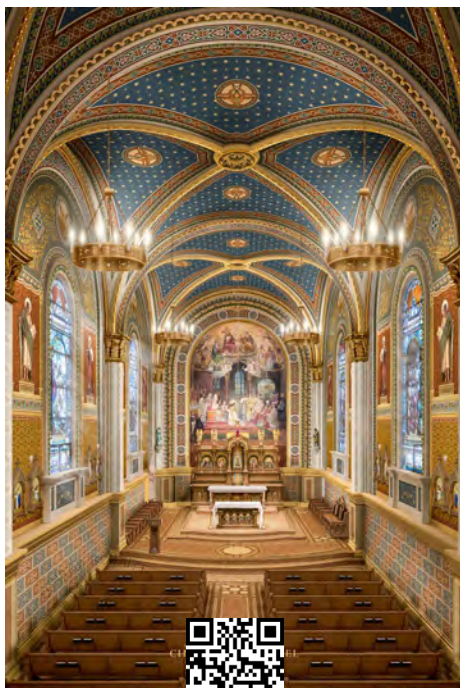
ST. FRANCIS DE SALES SEMINARY CAMPAIGN

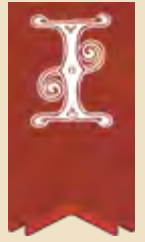

iBreviary

The Missal of the iBreviary contains the Ordinary of the Mass, the Eucharistic Prayers, Masses for the Saints, daily Mass readings, Prefaces, Prayers of the Faithful, Solemn Blessings, rites for various celebrations and other liturgical texts.
- **Catholic Prayers & Rituals:** Are you in a quiet place, finding yourself wanting to pray a rosary or a devotion like the Way of the Cross? The iBreviary offers all the major Catholic prayers and the complete texts of the rites for the celebration of all the sacraments and rituals.
