The price of eggs is crazy! That was the opening comment made by my sister as we sat around the dinner table contemplating Easter. My sister, who has no children, graciously opens her house each year to a mad-cap day of Easter egg hunts, morbid consumption of candy, and overactive grandchildren who are shaking off their indoor winter doldrums to traipse fresh new spring mud into her house.

This year, we all watched the price of eggs skyrocket and heard or experienced restaurants charging an "egg" fee to bills. Fortunately, the price of eggs have reentered earth's orbit. We wondered whether people would dye less eggs this year. With eight grandchildren, we are usually into the third dozen before colored dye marks every work area.

What's with dyeing eggs anyway? (Nothing like a few extra dollars out of your pocket to reassess a life-long tradition.) Easter has always heralded the end of winter; a time for humankind to experience new life, from the daffodils pushing their way up despite our cold weather, to the tulips which in their beauty come and go so quickly. Christianity has absorbed many of the pagan springtime traditions and "repurposed" them as signs of Jesus' resurrection. The Easter egg is one of them. Eggs have been an ancient

symbol of new life. Christianity has revalued this oval wonder to symbolize the resurrection of Jesus; new life, forever. According to some sources, decorating Easter eggs is a tradition dating back to at least the 13th century. One explanation for this custom is that eggs were formerly a forbidden food during Lent, so people would decorate them to mark the end of penance and fasting and eat them on Easter as a celebration.

According to Good Housekeeping magazine, early Christian missionaries dyed the eggs colors to represent different aspects of the Easter story. Yellow represented the resurrection, blue represented love, and red the blood of Christ. Cracking a hard-boiled egg is opening the tomb. I guess the question is, did you dye less eggs this year because of the cost?

It makes me reflect on the cost Jesus paid for our sins. What is the price you would pay for salvation? What response can you offer to a God who paid with his only Son to bring us back to him?

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live in righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed (1 Peter 2:24). This Easter, ponder the price Jesus paid and the trivial distractions which we think are so important, such as the price of eggs. Have a blessed Easter!

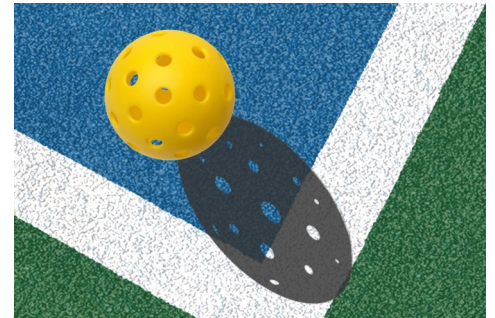

He is Risen

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." John 20:1-2

What did Mary do? She ran and told. Why? This was amazing news! Jesus did what he said he was going to do. She is a missionary disciple! She went away from there and shared the Good News. As we continue the story, Simon Peter and John returned home. They didn't run and tell because they didn't quite understand, but not Mary! It didn't matter if she understood or if she had all the answers, Jesus was enough. He had risen!

My dear friends in Christ, let us follow the example of Mary today. Let us run and share with joy what we have experienced these last forty days; the difficulty, the suffering, the sadness that results in promises kept and love restored. We don't have to understand how it works but relish in the fact that it works. We don't have to have all the knowledge of the ages just the knowledge of what a relationship with Jesus does for us. We don't have to have all the right words, only the words for what we know. We don't have to be afraid, for Christ has won the victory for us.

When the excitement wears off, then what? Again, let's follow the example of Mary. In verses 11-18, Mary goes

back to the tomb and sits there. She is in awe and confusion questioning what just happened. She is consoled by two angels and then met by Jesus. Jesus consoles her and affirms her asking her to "Go to my brothers and tell them." Bolstered by the encounter, she runs and tells. What a lesson to be had here, just when you think Jesus is done, He is not done. "Every day Jesus is working in your life in big and small ways.

Sometimes it takes time to realize what he has been doing, but he is always at work. So, ask the Lord to show you all the blessings he has given you, and then go and share the good news with everyone" (Word Among Us, February 2025, p. 34).

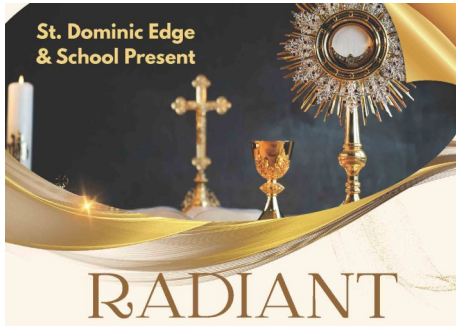

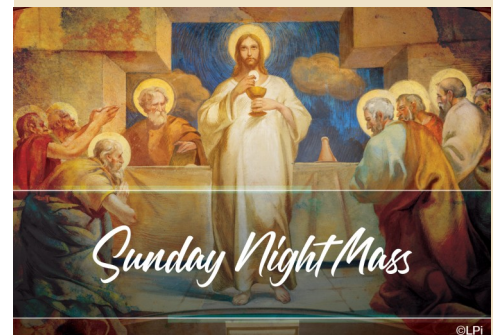

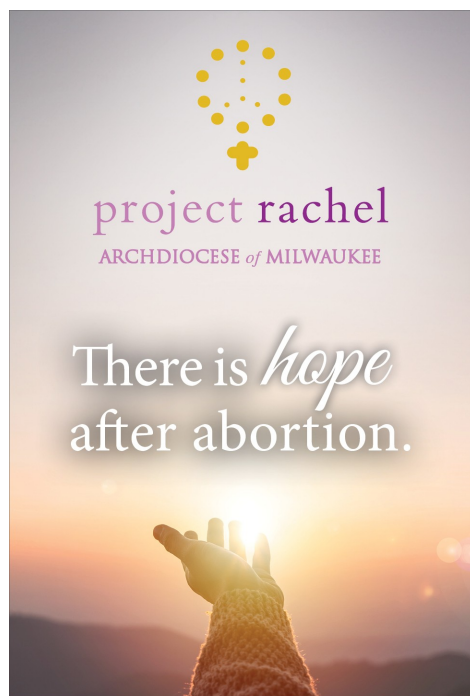

Why do you seek the living one among the dead?

- Luke 24:5

Hello Everyone,

As you may recall, some women who followed Jesus awoken with a plan that first Easter Sunday morning — to prepare his body properly for eternal rest. They gather the customary supplies and set out for the tomb. If they were concerned about moving the heavy stone at the tomb's entrance, it's unknown to us.

We do know this — two angels greet them with a question: “Why do you seek the living one among the dead?” What a strange and somewhat chiding thing to say to these poor, grieving, well-intentioned women.

However, it is the key question of the first Easter morning and the key question we should ask ourselves as believers every morning: **Why do we seek the living One among the dead?**

In a moment of graced insight, the women remember Jesus' words, and that remembrance — along with the empty tomb — became the impetus for their new plans: to go and tell his story, to tell their/our story.

He is risen! It is not over. In fact, it has only begun. Don't think that you can go and hide in the empty tomb. He is living in our midst. Go into the streets and look for him! Go to the prisons and soup kitchens, to the ghettos and the fringe areas of life. Go home to your families and acquaintances. He is there among your spouses and children, your coworkers and friends, your classmates and teammates.

In other words — like the women — remember what he told you.

And please realize — like the women — the best part of the story is ahead of you! Happy Easter!
