In the midst of my first spring as a priest, I am quickly learning that spring is the season of Sacraments. Here is a rundown of recent and upcoming Sacraments in my calendar:

April 19: Easter Vigil (6 Baptisms, 9 Confirmations, 9 First Communions)

April 26: Ordination of Deacons for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee (6 men)

April 27: Reconciliation for Divine Mercy Sunday

May 2: the Wedding Mass of my younger sister (a unique joy as a priest!)

May 3-4: First Holy Communion for 102 children

May 8: Confirmation for 45 teenagers

May 17: Ordination of Priests for the Archdiocese of Milwaukee (3 men, including a son of St. Dominic Parish, Deacon Aaron Siehr)

That's quite a month! In addition to this list, several infants are baptized every weekend here at St. Dominic, countless people frequent the sacrament of Reconciliation, and Fr. Dennis and I remain busy making visits for the Anointing of the Sick.

In today's Gospel, we hear about the

miraculous catch of fish. As a parish priest, I feel like a fish caught up and swept along in a stream of Sacramental Grace! It is astounding to see the power of God's grace at work in real people's lives. One of the images for the Church is the Barque of Peter. Our Lord is still telling the successors of the Apostles, the Church's bishops, to cast their nets over the side of the boat. And the nets are still hauling in miraculous catches.

As a fisherman, I appreciate the excitement of a big catch. This Friday, I'll teach a lesson on fishing at the school's High Interest Day. Hopefully many St. Dominic students experience the excitement of a big catch this summer. Far more importantly: hopefully we all experience the excitement of being hauled in by our Blessed Lord's net throughout this Easter season. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn.

(First Notice)

The Charter of St. Dominic Catholic Parish states that our congregation will have two trustees serving as officers of the parish to assist in attending to its affairs. THE SOURCE OF OUR BELONGING

Encounter Jesus

For the past few months, I have found myself triangulating the content of three books: *Cultural Catholics: Who they are, How to Respond*, by Maureen Day (2024), *Return: How to Draw Your Child Back to the Church*, by Brandon Vogt (2021), and *The Anxious Generation: How the Great Rewiring of Childhood is Causing an Epidemic of Mental Illness*, by Johnathan Haidt (2024). I now have a greater appreciation for where we are at in the Apostolic Age.

I hope we all realize that the former reality, when the vast majority of people were Christian, or at least had a concept of God/Jesus, is all but gone, and that the need for us to engage in the world as disciples is apparent. This is not a point for despair, but a point for hope. As we remain in the Easter season, we know that Jesus has won the battle and conquered evil, but we are called to engage and activate the hearts of others to know and love Jesus until He comes again.

When Jesus ascended into Heaven, He said to go and make disciples of all nations. This daunting command is our marching orders. Every human being has a God-shaped hole whether they realize it or not. How we fill that hole is what discipleship is all about. Many times, we need help, guidance, and support. One of the greatest sources is right within the walls of any Catholic church—the source of our belonging – Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ present in the Blessed Sacrament, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, most definitely fills

the God-shaped hole.

In reading the texts above, the reason many give for leaving the Catholic Church, or hover around the edge, is “I just don’t have time for church right now. I’m too busy.” A response suggested by author Brandon Vogt is “Mass becomes the highest priority only when you realize it offers a direct encounter with God.” Many, especially those who don’t prioritize Mass or find Mass boring, should consider that Mass is something different from all the other activities that fill their schedule. (Return, p. 145). Vogt goes on to make this suggestion for how to shift perspective:

Suppose you are watching TV when a breaking news story splashes on the screen. Miraculously, Jesus Christ has returned to earth, in the flesh, and tomorrow morning he will be appearing at a nearby building. Wouldn’t you do anything to make sure you were there? Wouldn’t you clear your calendar, summon the energy to get up early, and make sure you arrived well before he did? ... That’s exactly what happens at Mass. The Mass isn’t just some casual gathering where we exchange pleasantries, sing songs, and listen to a nice message. The Mass is the place where we encounter Jesus, in the flesh. That’s what the Eucharist is: the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus.
