

OUR VALUE: NURTURE COMMUNITY

We encourage and accompany one another in our journey to Christ.

"Being of one heart and one mind does not mean walking in lockstep with one another, voting the same way, or agreeing about everything... (Community) is about having a set of relationships I can count on.

We are built for community. The God we worship is a community of persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. . . the history of salvation is that God has saved a people. No one is saved alone. . . I can't live the gospel on my own. I need the encouragement, and the challenge, of other men and women who are *striving for holiness*. Otherwise, I get flat. I stop seeing the grand vision of what a redeemed humanity is meant to look like. . .

Community is a gift. People don't form communities. God does. God moves in our hearts. He places a call. The desire to share my life with others may come from gratitude or deep need. Whatever its source. God is always on the move to draw me to himself. For many of us, community was a place where we discovered that we had a voice, and gifts. A place where we were noticed, listened to, and encouraged... Many of the holiest people I know grew up in dysfunctional families. Others have substance abuse issues. Others have suffered physical violence or sexual abuse ...a woman once said at our community prayer meeting, "You wouldn't give up on me. You wouldn't let me give up on myself, even when I wanted to."

The self-acceptance that enables me to move forward with my life is the fruit that comes from sharing life, speaking the truth in love to one another. It is usually not "high octane" stuff, but it is one of the greatest helps we can give each other. It is a deliverance because it exposes all the lies we carry around inside. I have seen strong men weep in pain or sorrow, or because of experiencing the overwhelming mercy of God. But most of it is quite ordinary. I do not spend my life in the heavenly realms; I spend it going to work and doing chores, meeting deadlines and taking care of my family. But in sharing life with others, I have learned that we are a lot more alike than we are different ... in community I experience a power for healing and change that I never knew anywhere else.

One of the main things that holds a community together is forgiveness. We mess up all the time. We need to ask, and offer, forgiveness frequently. . . it is easier to live in the truth and in the light when we do it together than when we attempt it on our own. When we share the experience of conversion and a hunger for more of God's kingdom, we have the foundation of an authentic culture."

Hypocrisy

Hypocrisy is moral standards or beliefs to which one's own behavior does not conform.

We often see Jesus in the Gospels chastising the Pharisees for their hypocrisy. The Pharisees place themselves above the law while teaching the law. Jesus found it infuriating and didn't hesitate to call it out. Hypocrisy is one of the greatest reasons given for why people leave the Catholic Church. It points to our ability, or inability, to live the Great Commandment to love God above all things and to love your neighbor as yourself. While the figureheads of our church shoulder the burden most, it comes down to all of us.

According to the world view, Catholics are supposed to be something more than the average sinful human being, evidently, we aren't allowed to be broken and imperfect. But we are. When we fail to love God above all things, when we fail to love our neighbor as ourselves, it has ramifications beyond the burden of sin. This is why we are set apart. We are to be better, "So be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt. 5: 48). But that's impossible. We need to own our imperfectness, our brokenness, and give each other a little grace.

As a culture, we are angry and skeptical. We lack the ability to trust. We are turning each other off to all those things we need in order to thrive. We say we love but we don't. We've confused what love is- willing the good of the other- with something less. Every single major religion advises us to turn down the judgementalism and turn up the forgiveness (The Anxious Generation, by Johnathan Haidt, p. 211). Consider this:


Religious practitioners, like all people, are often hypocrites. Nonetheless, religious injunctions to be slower to judge and quicker to forgive are good for maintaining relationships and improving mental health. Social media trains people to do the opposite: Judge quickly and publicly. (Return, by Brandon Vogt, p. 153).

Mother Teresa once said, "Often we Christians constitute the worst obstacle for those who try to become closer to Christ; we often preach a Gospel we do not live" (Return, p. 153). As disciples and members of the Body of Christ, we need to acknowledge the hurts that exist because of our leadership and our own conduct in the world, and apologize for it. We then need to leave it in the past and do better; count the cost and forgive the debt. That is the fruit of the sacrament of Reconciliation. We need to help others realize that it isn't worth cutting yourself off from the source of spiritual nourishment because of something one human being did or said. If this is the reason why someone you know and care about has left the Church, it is time to bring them home. Help them see the love of Jesus that does exist.






The Hail Mary, Explained

The words of the Hail Mary, undoubtedly the most recognizable Catholic prayer after the Lord's Prayer, are deeply rooted in scripture. The opening lines of the prayer are taken from the words of the angel Gabriel at the Annunciation — "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." This line is known as the Angelic "Blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Jesus" — echo the sentiments expressed by Elizabeth at the Visitation.

The Angelic Salutation is regarded as the earliest devotional prayer to Mary, since it forms the very first words spoken to her as the Mother of God, but Catholics did not begin to utilize the Hail Mary praver in its current form until around the 11th century.

An in-depth explanation of each line of this prayer is provided in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2676-2677.

Leave Your Comfort Zone to Reach More

Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others. Have this mind among yourselves, which was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men.

- **Invite** a homeless person out for a meal and conversation.
- Talk to someone about a question or topic you feel called to bring up but have shied away from out of fear or discomfort.
- Say hello to someone you always see at Mass but have never talked to and learn their name.
- Ask some coworkers to grab drinks or food after work.
- Gently ask a friend or family member why they stopped going to Mass and listen compassionately to the answer without trying to fix or defend.
