A New Adventure

"I made known to them your name...that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them." Today's Gospel is part of Jesus' farewell to his disciples. In it, we see his passionate desire to make the Father known to them. Even as he is about to be handed over to death, his concern is that he did what he was sent to do: to draw people to God.

This Gospel passage is perfect for me today, as I use this article to let you know that I am resigning from my position as Adult Minister at St. Dominic Catholic Parish. My family and I will still be parishioners and our children will still attend the school. So it isn't really goodbye. I will see you at least every Sunday. But I feel the Lord calling me to leave the comfort zone that St. Dominic has become for me and begin a new adventure at the Archdiocese.

It was a really difficult decision to make, leaving my job here. I love this community so much. And I am so comforted to know I will still be a part of it, just in a different capacity. As I pray through today's Gospel, I have a new appreciation for the complex emotions Jesus must have felt as he said goodbye to his disciples. He loved them deeply, was united to them in community and in spirit. And yet, he also knew he was called away. I feel this deeply in my own human way. I am following the Father's will for my life and am excited about where he is taking me, but I am sad to say goodbye. I hope that in my time here, I have served you well. I hope that I have brought you closer to Christ. My prayer, as I transition out of this role, is that the love I have been given from the Father may be passed on to you.

Thank you for making me a better person. Thank you for making me a better minister. And thank you for making me a better disciple. I am grateful to continue the journey with you all as a regular old person in the pews.

The Awesomeness of God

Today we see the apostles stand in awe of Jesus ascending into Heaven. To be in awe is to be so overwhelmed by the goodness of God in that moment that you have no words.

When was the last time that you stood in awe of something?

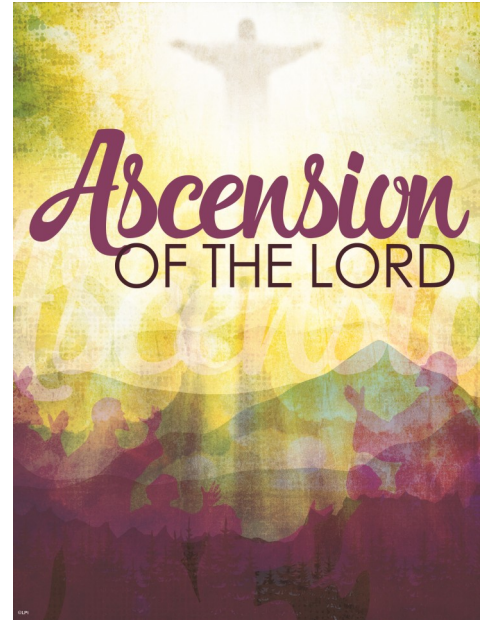
In the realization of God's magnificence, the apostles did Him homage. This means that they paid Him public honor and respect. They didn't hide their appreciation for this graced moment if not for the entirety of their experiences with Jesus.

When was the last time you paid homage for the awesomeness of God? Did you thank Him in the moment that you stood in awe?

After paying homage, they returned to Jerusalem and spent significant time, in fact verse 53 says "continually," in the temple. The temple was where all good, God-fearing Jews went to give glory and honor to God. They were keenly aware and rightly ordered to God's presence in their lives and made no bones about thanking Him. It was a top priority.

Have you ever felt like that about coming to Mass?

Our inability to rightly order God in our lives is a dismissal of His goodness and love for us. If we were rightly ordered, if we had Christ as the center of our lives because we are aware of His awesomeness and love for us at every moment, our churches would be full to overflowing. This far exceeds a weekly



obligation. If we appreciated what we have in being so very loved, we wouldn't want to be anywhere else but in His presence at all times. We would crave the Eucharist. We would crave the sacraments. We would be in tremendous awe constantly. Mass is our opportunity, our temple, for praising and thanking God in the manner He deserves. Anything less than our full engagement is a disservice to the God who gives so much. Unless, of course, you are not thankful, then, by all means, carry on. We can and should do better for a God that loves us so well.

When was the last time you couldn't wait to thank Jesus for all that you are and all that you have? What is taking so long?

OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

Lectio Divina:

*Praying with the "ear of your heart"
to hear God through scripture*

Lectio Divina Explained

St. Benedict desired his monks to live in community, praying the Liturgy of the Hours together, contemplating sacred texts, and doing manual labor. The monks developed a technique to facilitate a spiritual and devotional reading of the Bible known as Lectio Divina, the holy reading of a text. This method encourages the reader to hear the biblical text with an open heart and focus on whatever God wants to highlight and then apply it to daily life.

There are variations on Lectio Divina, but essentially, the technique consists of a three-step process of reflection. When the reflection is done with a group, the responses are shared by all the participants. Once the text is selected, it is read meditatively, and the following are then explored: a word or phrase that attracts you; how and where the content of this reading touches your life today; what you believe that God wants you to do during this coming week (month, year, lifetime).

Thanks to Benedict, the Christian community has been gifted with this special way of entering into the biblical text.

Parish Financial Update

2025-2026 Budget

Finance Council, in conjunction with the Trustees and Fr. Dennis, has approved our operating budget for the fiscal year of July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

St. Dominic is blessed with generous parishioners and a growing community. We have budgeted a small surplus for the coming fiscal year.

We prioritize use of your stewardship gifts on:

- Forming missionary disciples
- Keeping Catholic education affordable
- Strengthening our parish school for the future
- Sustaining robust student ministries

Parish budgeted income reflects:

- Continue to cover most formation fees via stewardship
- Projected continued growth in membership resulting in increased stewardship and offertory
- Stability in our revenue sources such as interest/ investment income, facilities usage fees, parish festival profit, and columbarium niches
- Pastoral ministry and outreach donations supporting partner groups are not reflected as revenues

School budgeted income reflects:

- Continued growth of school enrollment. Budget based on 440 students, up from 425 (K3-8)
- K3/K4 tuition increase commensurate with increasing costs to serve an expanded pre-school program
- A modest increase in school tuition for K5-8 to cover consumables
- Lunch program and milk/snack fees increase to better cover the expense of food/milk.

Parish & school budgeted expenses reflect:

- Continued robust investment in discipleship and formation programs and parishioner engagement and enrichment
- Adding a second K4 School classroom
- Adding 8 interactive flat panel displays in classrooms
- Compensation and insurance benefit increases
- Archdiocese assessment and liability annual increases
- Limiting discretionary buildings and grounds and administrative expenses to offset increased utility and non-discretionary expenses

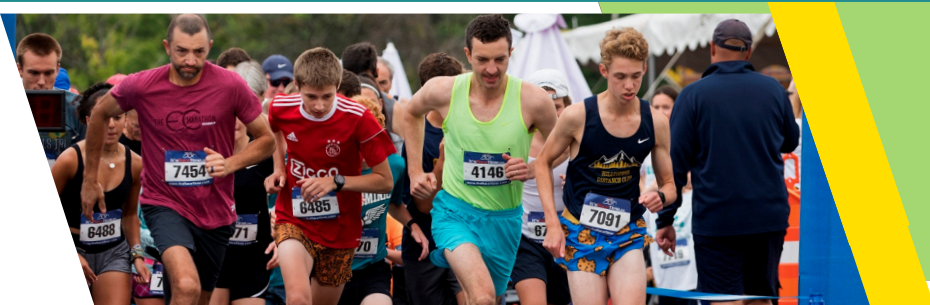
