

Leaving the Room

I was a full-grown adult before I realized that Pentecost is known as "the birthday of the Church," and it only resonated with me because someone showed up to a church function with cake and candles. Leave it to buttercream frosting to drive home a theological reality I had been missing for 25 years.

I knew what Pentecost was, of course. It simply went over my head that, despite all the incredible, worldchanging things that had come before the moment of Pentecost,



prior to this day, the Apostles were just a group of guys in a room. It wasn't until Pentecost that they became the Church.

So what makes the Church...well, the Church, capital C? What makes it more than just a group of guys in a room?

It's true, they were a very special group of guys. They had the Truth — capital T. They had borne witness to Christ's miracles, to his life and to his passion and death.

But they were still in that room.

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they received graces and gifts that made them fit to carry out the Great Commission. The Truth wasn't enough, even with a capital T. They needed the Spirit — capital S — and more than that, they needed to receive it with the courage and faith necessary to do what needed to be done.

To get up and leave the room.

Because what good is any of it unless they leave the room? What does it matter, the tongues of fire and the miraculous bilingualism and, frankly, the coming of the Spirit, if no one ever hears about it?

The mission is what made them the Church. It's what makes us the Church. Without it, we're just a bunch of guys in a room.




DISCIPLESHIP

Worthy of Love

Many people express that they don't feel worthy of God's love. That is a lie of the enemy and should be rejected completely. Feelings of unworthiness stem from shame, embarrassment, and rejection. Our lived experiences, our sinfulness, mask our ability to know and understand the love God has for us because we are incapable of loving like God. He draws us in, but we run away.

Let's look at John 21:1-14. In this passage, seven of the apostles are out for an early morning fishing excursion. Peter is leading the charge. This is days after Peter, dare I say all of the apostles, rejected Jesus in His time of suffering and death. They walked away out of fear. Now they are gathered, possibly feeling remorse, maybe some hope, for the risen Jesus had appeared to them, going about their daily business. I imagine they are trying to figure out what to do next. This moment of respite and companionship is interrupted by an encounter with Jesus. Notice, Peter jumps out of the boat and excitedly swims to shore. Peter, the one who should be most cautious about approaching Jesus out of sheer humiliation for his horrible actions, can't get there fast enough. He can't wait to get to the shore! Jesus welcomes Him. Loves Him. Charges Him. He who should be most unworthy is made worthy through the love of God. This, my brothers and sisters, is us. Peter is us. While we may at times feel unworthy, we most certainly are. Stop telling yourself that lie.

"The only way out of shame is not in running from Jesus but running toward him. That instinct to run toward Jesus develops over time through a growing relationship with him. Jesus' magnetism had drawn Peter from the start. Then, as his relationship with Jesus deepened, he was drawn more and more deeply toward him – even as he maintained his impetuous passionate ways" (Word Among Us April 24, 2025)



Run (swim, hop, leap, walk) to Him to receive the full benefit of His love.

Open your mind. Open up your heart to what is already there waiting for you.





OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

Incense Explained

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).


