#### **BEAR WITNESS**

#### **Answered Prayer**

Today's column is a story from Mike B, who shares how God worked in his life.

On Holy Thursday, I was at work when I received a voice mail from my mom saying that my dad was not doing well. He had been out with my mom running errands when he started feeling bad. He knew he couldn't drive home, so he called their neighbor as my mom is unable to drive. Three neighbors came: a retired nurse, a retired firefighter, and a retired Marine. They drove my mom home and took my dad to urgent care. I started praying the Sorrowful Mysteries. While in prayer, my sister alerted me that dad had a really high fever and was septic. He was being moved to the ER. I started praying the Joyful Mysteries.

My plans quickly changed from managing the busyness of our children's activities and evening services to going to the hospital to meet my sister. I called my pastor to solicit his prayers. On the way to the hospital, I continued to pray the Luminous and then Glorious Mysteries. Having not yet reached the hospital, I prayed a Divine Mercy Chaplet.

I prayed for healing for my dad, if it be God's will, and that when the time comes, he will be taken right to heaven. But I was really worried about mom as she depends significantly on my dad for her daily needs, so I asked our Blessed Mother and guardian angels to watch over her. I asked all the saints and angels to pray for mom and dad. And I especially asked for my dear friends in Purgatory to pray for them. I poured it all out in prayer.

I arrived at the hospital at the same time as my sister. We talked to the neighbors in the waiting room. They said dad couldn't walk at all and had to be lifted in and out of the car and was incoherent. His blood pressure was really high, in addition to the fever. At the very least, we were expecting that he would stay the night and get an IV antibiotic to fight the sepsis.

When we got in to see dad, he was coherent and the fever was gone. Blood pressure was back to normal. He had only received Tylenol and a bag of IV fluid. The urine test didn't show any infection. Blood tests showed higher white blood cells counts, but nothing else. They did a CT scan of his internal organs, and it showed nothing unusual.

The doctor and staff were stumped. They said there was nothing wrong and he could go home. They switched him to a different antibiotic pill to complete the UTI regimen, and then I drove him home.

I am in awe at the power of prayer. I prayed a divine mercy chaplet in praise and gratitude for this miraculous healing and for answered prayers. I thanked God, Jesus, Our Blessed Mother, all the saints and angels, and especially my dear friends in Purgatory. I know I am just a lowly sinner and can't do anything on my own. I have been truly blessed beyond measure. All praise and glory to God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Blessed Mother, pray for us.



## The 3 Signs of the Cross, Explained

Many people go to Mass or other devotions, doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind some of these things. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. Knowing the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel:

"May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart."

In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.




