A Loving Communion

The famous 20th century Saint, Padre Pio, said once that he would wait outside the gates of heaven until the people in his life had entered. I'm not sure that I, or frankly many people I know, would say that and mean it. Yet that is precisely the kind of attitude we see in Jesus as he prays for us in the Gospel today. Having celebrated the Ascension of the Lord just a few days ago, we now hear the Son of God at the Last Supper pray to his Father "that they may be brought to perfection as one" (John 17:23). What does this mean for us?

I'd wager that we are not surprised that Jesus wants to make us perfect — that is, happy, whole, and healed. The shocker is that he desires this for us collectively and not just individually. Perfection is a team sport. We need each other to be perfect. Jesus is like a mother longing for her adult children to learn how to be in loving support of one another.

He wants the perfection of his disciples to be not some individualistic plan of moral uprightness, but a loving communion of brothers and sisters.

Let's apply this practically:

Do I see my participation at Mass as something I do merely for my own peace and edification, or as something I do with and for the people around me?

Do I see my ongoing need for forgiveness as something that simply makes me feel better, or as a task that heals those around me, too?

Is my dearest hope to individually get to heaven when I die, or is it to be part of the great procession of souls, together marching towards the heavenly Jerusalem?

Do I want to be in heaven with people I currently find difficult?

How would my life change if I did?

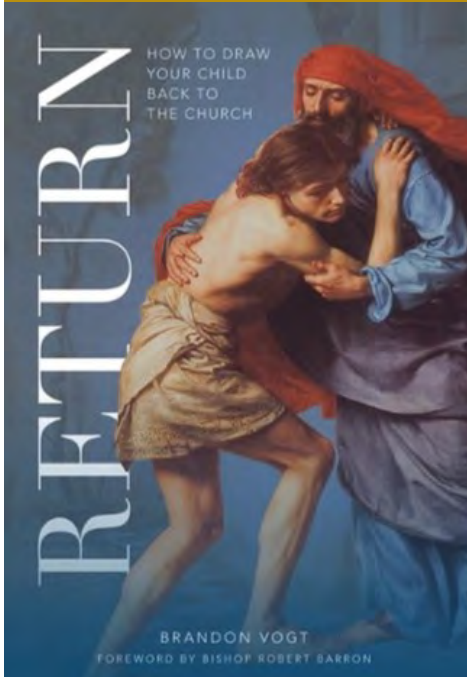

BEAR WITNESS

Two Holy Men

As disciples of The Way, we should be placing Jesus at the center of our lives. We have terrific models of that in today's Gospel from Matthew 16:13-19. While Sts. Peter and Paul couldn't have been more different in personality and background, they have one essential trait in common. Both believed the message that Peter declares in today's Gospel: Jesus is "the Christ, the Son of the living God" (Word Among Us, June 2025, p. 50).

We see it in our first reading, when Peter is imprisoned in a heavily guarded jail. Why? Because despite the threats of authorities, he kept talking about Jesus. He was convinced of His power and authority. No doubt Peter's miraculous deliverance from sixteen guards that night only helped confirm his conviction!

We also see it in our second reading, when Paul speaks some of his last words to Timothy. He knows that he is being "poured out like a libation." And yet he is confident that he has "finished the race" and "kept the faith" (2 Timothy 4:6-7). Why? Because as he looked over his life, he recalled all the ways that Jesus had stood by him, giving him strength and rescuing him from danger.

When you look over your life, even if it is just the last week, can you see God's hand in it or is it all you? If you can see God's hand in your life, share that Good News and bear witness to Him in your life.

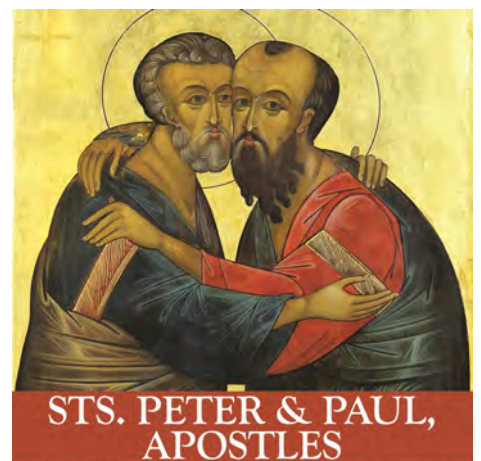
This truth that Jesus is the Christ, the

Son of the Living God, became the very foundation of Peter and Paul's lives. It was the reality that spurred them to keep following the Lord. It motivated them to testify to Jesus before massive crowds, to their closest friends, and in front of religious and secular authorities. And it strengthened them as they faced martyrdom for their faith.

As you consider these two holy men today, you can almost hear them saying, "See how Jesus has changed our lives! Who do you say that He is? How does that make a difference in the way you live?"

Sts. Peter and Paul don't have anything that you don't have. The difference is that they knew God, loved God, and therefore served God. They trusted that He would pull them through any adversity because He had already shown Himself to be faithful. You can do anything through God who strengthens you! Don't sell yourself short. Thank God Sts. Peter and Paul didn't.

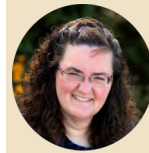

The 3 Signs of the Cross, Explained

Many people go to Mass or other devotions doing and saying things out of habit or reverence and not really understanding the reasons behind them. But everything we do has a meaning or purpose that helps us to worship better, proclaim our beliefs, or focus the attention of the people on something that has a greater importance or significance. Knowing the meaning of various gestures and practices can help us have a deeper appreciation for what we do.

There is a little prayer that goes with the three crosses before the Gospel:

"May the words of the Holy Gospel be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart."

In standing to hear the Gospel, we acknowledge that Jesus is present, and the words of the Gospel are addressed to us. All of the gestures and special postures we adopt before the Gospel are intended to help us prepare for hearing the Word as well as act on it. The incense, the Alleluia, the deacon or priest, and the special dialogue and announcement that introduces the Gospel help us focus our attention on the Good News we are about to hear. The three signs of the cross show our desire and good intention to hear and live the Gospel.
