

The Seventy-Two

Today's Gospel really strikes a chord with me. We see Jesus sending out not just the twelve, but seventy-two, who are going out in pairs to do the work Jesus has been preparing them for. He gives them all very specific directions yet leaves things very open. If I were one of them, I would have lifted an eyebrow. And yet, I find myself in this situation every day.

I realize that I may be an anomaly as I have chosen to serve the Lord by working in His Church. My experiences are not the norm. In fact, today's Gospel is one that I depend on to assure me when I grow weary and frustrated. If the apostles struggled, who am I to think that I won't. They had Jesus right there. I have this story. Regardless, the work of discipleship that all of us are called to is not for the faint of heart. It takes effort. It takes perseverance. It takes trust. It takes faith. People may not like what we have to say, but we have to say it. When people don't want to listen, we have to shake off the dust and move on. This is a hard saying especially when you want them to love the Lord as much as you do.

My brothers and sisters in Jesus, we are the seventy-two. When we go out and do what the Lord has called us to do through our Baptismal promise, we will always marvel and be compelled to rejoice just like our ancestors in faith. When we are convicted to the Gospel message of Jesus Christ, we will be in awe of what will transpire. For Jesus is saying directly to us:

I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven. (Luke 10:20)

Take up your place among the seventy-two. Be a laborer in the vineyard. Go be a disciple and trust that you will have all that you need when the time comes to bear witness to the goodness of God. You are not alone.



REFLECTION

How God Works

I came upon a new term that I had never heard before: Moralistic Therapeutic Deism. It is a sociological term that is in vogue. It is a misguided view about God. Here are the tenets that it purports:

A God exists who created and ordered the world and watches over human life on earth.

God wants people to be good, nice, and fair to each other, as taught in the bible and by most world religions.

The central goal of life is to be happy and to feel good about oneself.

God does not need to be particularly involved in one's life except when God is needed to resolve a problem.

Good people go to heaven when they die.

This is not how God works and therefore not entirely true.

God is not distant or uninvolved. He is very much present. Catholicism holds that a personal God continually interacts with His creation. Our God is so involved that He became one of us (Jesus) and remains with us (Holy Spirit). He is present in the Eucharist, an everlasting gift of Himself.

The goal of religion is not simply to be nice to others. "True Christianity is about Christ's death and Resurrection, His forgiveness of our sins, and His reconciling all creation into a new and glorious kingdom, which begins through his Church." (Return, Brandon Vogt, Word on Fire, 2021, p. 9). Reducing this to "just be nice" is like saying the

Sistine Chapel are pretty colors.

This is a very selfish way to go about living your life. "True Christianity leads to more than happy feelings, although they may come. Instead, it offers everlasting joy. As we all know, that sort of deep joy sometimes involves difficulty, pain, and discomfort along the way...the goal of life is not to feel good about ourselves; it's to find joy in knowing and loving God" (Return, p. 10).

If you hold the first three views about God, this is where they all come together. We assume that God exists to solve our problems. While we are encouraged, even told, to bring our worries to God, a problem arises when this is the only time we turn to Him. We become like that friend who only calls when they need help. What kind of a relationship is that?

This assumes that we earn our way to heaven. This reduces religion down to morality. Decent people are already saved. We can only lose salvation by doing something really, really bad, but even then only God knows what is on your soul, in your head, and on your heart. He will judge accordingly for He is a good, loving, and just God. At best, for most of us, we will have to spend time in purification prior to entry into heaven. The length of that time is dependent upon how well you know, love, and serve God.

OUR CATHOLIC FAITH



St. Michael the Archangel Prayer, Explained!

The prayer to St. Michael invokes the protection of the archangel Michael in the ongoing spiritual battle for the souls of all mankind. This prayer was composed by Pope Leo XIII and its use was instituted in 1886, a tradition which continued until the liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council. A popular story regarding its origin claims that the Pope wrote this prayer after having a vision of demonic spirits descending on Rome.

Michael is mentioned as one of God's seven archangels in the Book of Enoch and is presented by Revelations 12:7-12 as the warrior angel who cast Satan from heaven. He is therefore venerated as a protector against the forces of evil and a guardian of the Church. The Prayer to St. Michael is still commonly said at the end of the rosary.


