#### REFLECTION

Fr. Dennis was installed as pastor of St. Dominic Catholic Parish in October 2018, after serving for one year as parish administrator. His faith is based on the belief that we are all called to respond to God's love. He loves us first, and in that invitation is answered a desire that is deep within all of us.



Well, this year's festival is over. We had a little rain, but overall, we enjoyed great weather. And, as we were showing hospitality to the people of Brookfield, this week we heard from Jesus, the definition of our neighbor. The story of the Good Samaritan captured the exact experience I had as I watched the myriad of volunteers work at making everyone feel welcome. On Friday, we had the added opportunity of honoring Kendall Corder, the Milwaukee police officer who died in the line of duty. Our festival stopped and we stood on Capitol Drive in respect as the procession to Wisconsin Memorial Park made its way past our campus. It was a solemn, beautiful moment. May God welcome him into his arms.

Our readings last week captured several themes that were evident in action, making our festival not only fun, but a spiritual experience. In our first reading from this past weekend, Moses relates the heart of the Law given to him by God. In presenting it, Moses speaks to the Law as not a limit to our happiness, but rather a binding agent; we to God and also one to the other. It is a Law not foreign, but written in each of our hearts. We know, and when we search our hearts, we feel this bond and "discover" the law of love in our hearts which guides our interactions. It is

this recognition that we are all one, which prepares us for the gospel parable; a story Jesus uses to answer the question, "And who is my neighbor?" Our community lived the Good Samaritan as we welcomed everyone to our celebration.

When we feel compassion, when we see another in need and "suffer with" them, we lose all identifications that may hinder us from helping. When we see each other as one, we are not hampered by their ethnicity, their politics, their nationality. When we recognize that everyone is our neighbor, we stop thinking of, "What will happen to me if I help?" and begin to think, "What will happen to him/her if I don't help?" Our gospel, our festival, is calling us to a change of perspective to add "suffering with" as a lens in which we see each other.

Thanks to the festival committee for all their hard work to help make our 2025 Dominic Days another success. Thanks for all of our sponsors, all who worked, and all who supported the festival. Take the experience of volunteerism and make it spiritual. Next time someone tells you of a need, or next time you have a need, offer to pray WITH that person, or ask that person to pray WITH you, right now. After all...they are your neighbor. Have a blessed rest of the summer.



## OUR VALUE: PURSUE HOLINESS

## Stillness: The Ordinary Path to Holiness

Here we sit in the depths of Ordinary Time. While it feels like nothing important is going on, hence ordinary, it is far from a time of nothingness. Ordinary Time is really ordinal time. We are counting the time between seasons. It is a time to abide, to rest in the love of our Lord. Amazing things, extraordinary things, can and do occur in the ordinary. God appears in the ordinary.

God is a pure spirit, and the way He ordinarily communicates is beyond what "the eye can see and the ear can hear" (1 Cor 2:9). For God to speak to us now, as He desires to speak with us for all eternity, we must be willing to go beyond the senses. Be assured that this is not a complicated method of prayer; it is, in fact, a much simpler process than hoping for a voice, vision, or miracle ("And You Will Find Rest," Fr. Wayne Sattler, Sophia Institute Press, 2024, p.18). This is what may be termed the ordinary path to holiness. This ordinary path is stillness.

The summer provides a welcome respite to the busyness that is the rest of the year, or at least it should. Our schedules should be more relaxed. Our pace should be slower. The ability to be still becomes wider. The ordinary path is a simpler one, to "be still and know that I am God" (Ps. 46:11). "To be still requires a committed effort to place our trust in the ordinary way God desires to lead our soul into His rest. If we are waiting for God to speak to us through a voice, vision, or miracle, it will prove difficult to be still when He comes to prepare our hearts to see Him as He really is" (p. 19).

The organ with which we see God best is not our eye; it is our heart. For the heart to see anything worth noting, the heart must be pure. Purity of heart requires an ongoing two-part process of purification. The first part is our own efforts to be pure. The second is the activity of God, which is able to purify us at a level we alone are not capable of doing. Without this activity of God, our heart could never hope to be led to the purity necessary to see Him (p.19).

Use this ordinary time to be still, or at least a little more still than usual. Take in the wonder of all that is around you and connect with your heart. Your heart is where God resides. He is always there. You simply need to access Him. How do you do that? Spend time in prayer where you can receive what the Lord is giving to you without rushing. This might be a period of time in uncomfortable silence. Give yourself 5 minutes of quiet stillness to "just be." Participate in the sacraments especially reconciliation and Eucharist. Open up the Bible and ask the Holy Spirit to show you what you need to see. Might I suggest starting with the Letter of Paul to the Ephesians. Connect with holy friends who will engage in conversation that will reveal the love of God to you.

## OUR CATHOLIC FAITH



### St. Bridget Prayers, Explained!

St. Bridget of Sweden (d. 1373) was a noblewoman of the Middle Ages whose renowned mysticism centered on the passion of Christ. A mother of eight and an attendant at the royal court in Sweden, as a widow she founded the Order of the Most Holy Savior, advocated for reform in the church and for the return of the Pope to Rome from France.

The St. Bridget Prayers refer to 15 prayers attributed to Bridget which evoke the imagery of Christ's suffering and death, plead for the forgiveness of the supplicant's sins, for a happy death, for fear and love of the Lord, and for a renunciation of worldly desires.

For many years, these prayers were associated with divine promises, though in 1954 the Catholic Church declared that it could not be said that these promises were of supernatural origin. The prayers themselves remain beloved and popular devotions to Christ's passion.
