

One of the unique aspects of being a parish priest is the rapid swing between life and death. In the span of a few hours last week, I went from visiting a parishioner in a hospital to a game of ultimate frisbee with middle schoolers to a deathbed call at a nursing home. Just yesterday, I spent the morning laughing and running with the Vacation Bible School kids and the afternoon walking the halls of two large hospitals to make visits. Parish life constantly teaches the same lesson from Jesus' parable: the transition from life to death can happen in an instant.

The inevitability and unpredictability of death might frighten us into a state of petrification. Fear of death binds us so that we build up walls to prevent its onslaught. But our fortress walls become prison walls, and we realize this fear of death has enslaved us. This is only one view of death, however, and it's exactly the perspective Jesus warns against in today's parable.

Quite the opposite, Jesus encourages us to view death as a liberating force. When we realize that all of the stuff we accumulate in this life will come to nothing, like chaff in the wind, we are free of our concerns over it. We can be detached of temporary things and hold fast to those that eternally endure.

I experienced this in my discernment of seminary and the priesthood. I was sitting at the base of a tree during a spring turkey hunt, contemplating death (with thoughts like that, I should have realized sooner that God made me to be priest!). I thought to myself: "I will die..." and then, "I should be a priest!" It's fair to ask how the premise follows the conclusion. And to be sure, this was but one reflection during a course of five years of discerning seminary. But the logic is that acknowledging our inevitable death allows us to ask. "what am I so worried about?"



Like looking down from a high mountain, an eternal perspective allows us to see how small our concerns really are. It's then that we realize Jesus' parable today is good news: we don't have to worry about storing up treasures for ourselves—we are free to be rich in what matters to God!

REFLECTION

Is God a person or an idea to you?

This was an interesting question posed as part of coursework I am participating in for a certificate in spiritual direction. It was posed by the instructor in recounting a story of when he encountered a novitiate struggling to take her final vows. The novitiate came to him for direction as she questioned her dedication to a life with Jesus, and fear that she was missing out on finding Mr. Wonderful. This gave him pause because isn't Jesus Mr. Wonderful?

Do you really know the living Jesus, not through books or podcasts or apps, but by being with Him in your mind and heart? Do you find yourself waiting for something more and in doing so dismiss the most wonderful thing right in front of you? Are you building a relationship with Him or simply checking boxes because that is what you've been told to do?

This is exactly what is happening in the story of the rich young man (Mt 19:16-30, Mk 10:17-31, Lk 18:18-23). He is so concerned about doing all the right things and checking all the boxes that he misses THE "thing," the most important "thing," standing right in front of him - Jesus. And what does he do? He turns and walks away. He couldn't give himself to Jesus. Jesus offers us eternal life, but it is no easy task to follow Him. We must detach from this world, all those things that the world tells us we must do and have and be, while in the meantime accept the most wonderful thing eternal life. "Eternal life for [the rich young man] was an idea in his head,

something to be obtained by doing certain necessary things, just as there were things he needed to do to gain his many other possessions. The rich young man was diligently trying to check off the right boxes to inherit eternal life. Eternal life, however is not an idea. 'Eternal life,' Jesus tells us in the Gospel of John, is this: 'that they should know you, the only true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ (Jn 17:3)'. Eternal life is a person" (Remain in Me and I in You, Fr. Wayne Sattler, Sophia Press, 2025, p.9). The rich young man walked away from eternal life. He walked away from Mr. Wonderful.



My friends in Christ, I challenge you to truly consider your relationship with God right now. Is He a person you have a relationship with or is He an idea you've grown accustomed to?

Are you waiting for Mr. Wonderful or is Mr. Wonderful already yours?



In allowing the man to have less, Jesus opens a space for him to become more: a man free to love. In that much more meaningful sense, perhaps he was better off than his parents.



Is your child baptized?

Baptism typically happens for infants but what happens if the reception of that sacrament is delayed? Children under the age of 7 are able to be welcomed into the Church at any time. Children 7 years of age or older are welcomed through the Order of Christian Initiation for Children. This Order prepares a child to receive all Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation) at one time. If your child has been baptized but reception of Reconciliation and Eucharist has been delayed, they are able to receive the sacraments after proper formation.

Holy Hour, Explained!

A holy hour is the practice of spending one hour's time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, praying and meditating on the agony of Jesus Christ. More broadly, a holy hour can also refer to any 60 minutes set aside in prayer and reflection, whether in church or elsewhere.

The holy hour devotion dates to the late 17th century, when St. Margaret Mary Alacoque received visions of Jesus Christ. In these visions, the Lord requested that St. Margaret Mary spend one hour every Thursday evening lying prostrate and meditating upon his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. This practice calls back to the Gospel of Matthew, which tells of Jesus' desire for the disciples to "remain here and keep watch with me" (Mathew 26:38) as he awaited his passion.

Holy hours can be made privately or in community, and the USCCB has created a variety of different holy hour formats that can be found at usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/prayers-and-devotions/eucharistic-devotion.


Society of St. Vincent de Paul

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable about the rich man who selfishly stored all his grain and goods only to die and not enjoy his abundance anyway. What we struggle all our lives to learn is that life does not consist of possessions nor our perceived security, but of being possessed by God.

This week, as you give your gift to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, you are realizing that in giving you indeed receive.

The St. Dominic conference meets personally in the homes of the people who call for help to determine their needs and how we can help. We continue our relationship with them indefinitely afterwards to support them while they get back on their feet. What we receive in return is more. They teach us how to be grateful for what we have, humility in learning what true resourcefulness is when figuring out how to live with very little, and faith when God and prayer are your primary source of security.

Currently, the requests for assistance and the amounts needed to get someone back on their feet are increasing. Recently, a Wall Street Journal article stated that the Milwaukee area is one of the most difficult to find affordable rental housing. The average rent in the Waukesha area is \$1600 (per Zillow). Many of our patrons pay more than half their monthly income to keep a roof over their heads. One missed paycheck and they are unable to catch up without assistance. And once they lose their home, it is difficult to get into another one. The waiting lists for low income subsidized housing are long. The homeless shelters are full and have waiting lists.
