

## **OUR VALUE: Pursue Holiness**

We surrender ourselves to God's continual conversion of heart, mind, and soul.



## How do we pursue holiness in today's world?

Becoming holy is a journey. If you have set your heart to seek Christ and obey Him, you are on the path to holiness.

While we often get discouraged when we stumble and fall into sin, don't give up—ask for God's forgiveness, accept His mercy, and keep walking. Be reminded that the Saints had their weaknesses too. Holiness is surrendering ourselves to God's continual conversion of heart, mind, and soul, one day at a time.

Being holy, or set apart for God, doesn't mean we are to remove ourselves from the world, or worse, becoming judgmental of others. Jesus was a friend of sinners, he ate with sinners—yet He remained holy; never participating in their sin. We too are called to be in the world but not of it. This often means we must make difficult choices, saying no to activities, thoughts, and trends that go against God's will even if "everyone is doing it." But it doesn't mean we avoid those who aren't living holy lives—how else will they see Christ's light and come to know His love if we don't engage with them?

True holiness actually gives us the grace to love sinners more, because we are not looking to get something from them or join in their sin; we simply care about them as God does.

So, yes, abstain from gossip and avoid the college party scene, because you know it's not edifying—and embrace being seen as "odd or "different!"

Remember, holiness is attractive when combined with humility and genuine care. It's not about saying, "I'm better," but "God has something better for us."

Holiness should permeate every part of our lives. Ask God each day to guard your mind, since that's where much of the battle takes place.

Holiness flourishes with a close relationship with God—make prayer, worship, and Scripture reading a priority, so that the Holy Spirit can encourage and transform you.

We also grow in holiness best within a community of believers. Find friends in faith who also desire to follow God's will and lift one another up in their journey. Holiness was never meant to be a solo endeavor. If you don't have someone you can be open with about your struggles of faith and growth in discipleship, pray for a mentor or one who will keep you accountable.

Finally, keep in mind that while we cooperate in becoming holy through our efforts, it is ultimately achieved by God's grace and responding to His love by yielding to His Spirit.

## REFLECTION

## The BIG 10

A mission statement helps an organization to focus on what they are doing and why they are doing it. I call this the "why" to the "what."

Our St. Dominic mission is to "seek Christ, know Christ, become Christ each one for the sake of all." When a mission statement animates the lives of people in the organization, then it becomes a living document. But I ask you, how can you become that which you do not know?

We have spent the last two years focusing on helping one another pray with each other, not just for one another. We have been encouraging you to share how God is working in your life so that His presence is known in a world where He is sorely missing. We have invited everyone to get to know one another, to extend a hand of friendship and welcome. These actions are the heart and soul of The Way. Our hope is that you have grown comfortable with that and are open to stretching yourselves to the next level of becoming more for Christ and for one another.

You may have noticed signs for The Big 10. The Big 10 will help us grow in the habits that result in knowing Christ better in order to live out our mission as Christ's disciples.

Each month, for the next 10 months, as a parish family we will support one another in growing in a habit of discipleship. If you were unable to join us for Mass this weekend, please pick up the Introduction or Master Card in the narthexes for keeping track of these habits. I invite you to hang it on

your refrigerator or put it in a prominent place to stay focused. Indeed, there are more than 10 habits a disciple should have, but these are the 10 we will focus on together. In two weeks, we will focus our attention on the first habit: Pray Every Day. On the weekend of August 23/24, you will be able to pick up your first action card. On this card will be all sorts of tips to help you grow your prayer life. Failure to grow is failure to thrive.

In my role as Director of Discipleship and Formation, multiple people reach out to me each month asking for guidance on their faith journey in becoming missionary disciples. Reflecting on these conversations, it is very clear that the foundation of our faith journey, our closeness to Jesus, is based upon these 10 habits, the Big 10! So, we want to turbo charge your skill set and your confidence in living these habits, by sharing the Big 10 with everyone, everywhere in our parish.

As we move from one habit to another each month, a new card will be presented to you. Not only that, you will receive a sticker to cover the icon for the habit you just completed. We invite you to cover all 10! Who knows, there may be a "prize" for those who do.

Most of all, this isn't a new program that we are offering at St. Dominic. Hardly. This is encouragement to keep pursuing Jesus. As JPII said, a life with Christ is an adventure. We shouldn't just settle. God certainly doesn't. God has so much more to show you! Join me in this adventure and see what God shows you through each of these 10 habits.






## Meet Mrs. Lisa Taubner





## House Blessing, Explained!

Catholics who move to a new place of residence often wish to have their dwelling blessed, to call the favor and help of God upon all those who live in the house and all those who will enter it.

The Roman Ritual (Book of Blessings) provides two formats for house blessings: one during the Easter or Christmas season (specifically for the Epiphany) and one for Ordinary Time. Those who live in the home must be present for a house to be blessed. A priest, deacon, or lay person can administer the blessing, although if a lay person does so they must use the rites accorded to lay ministers in the Roman Ritual.

A house blessing includes Scripture readings, intercessions, and a prayer of blessing.

## Day 1: Tuesday, August 11: Depart USA

Private coach to Chicago O'Hare. Overnight flight to Vienna. Complimentary dinner, breakfast, and beverages on board.

## Day 2: Wednesday, August 12: Vienna

Arrive in Vienna, proceed through Passport Control, claim luggage, and meet our Peter's Way tour manager to board the touring bus and be on our way to **Klosterneuburg Abbey** overlooking the Danube River. Tour the Abbey Church, medieval cloister, the Tomb of St. Leopold, the world-famous Verdun Altar, the sevenbranched candlestick of Agnes, and other art treasures of the 14th and 15th centuries. Celebrate Mass at the Tomb of St. Leopold. Independent lunch at the abbey. Return to Vienna and check in to our hotel for a 3-night stay. Dinner and overnight in our Vienna hotel.

#### Day 3: Thursday, August 13: Imperial Vienna

Breakfast at our hotel. Celebrate Mass at St. Stephen's Cathedral. Tour the Cathedral, Austria's most eminent Gothic edifice houses a wealth of art treasures and is dedicated to St. Stephen, the first martyr of Christendom. Then, continue our orientation tour as we pass by the Hofburg Palace, winter residence of the Habsburg emperors; the Capuchin Church, which contain the imperial vaults; St. Charles' Church, a splendid example of late Baroque architecture; and the Belvedere Palace, former residence of Prince Eugene of Savoy. Drive around the Ring, one of the most magnificent boulevards in the world, passing the Vienna Opera, Museums, House of Parliament, City Hall, and the Burgtheater. Independent lunch. The afternoon is free to explore Vienna on your own! Independent dinner and overnight in Vienna hotel.

#### Day 4: Friday, August 14: Mariazell

Breakfast at our hotel. Today, we'll drive across the spectacular forested mountains, rushing streams, and small market towns to the little village of Mariazell, a favorite Viennese resort. Visit the **Shrine of Mariazell**. Since its founding, it has become the most popular Marian shrine in Austria, and there is a miraculous wooden statue of the Virgin Mary that is much venerated at the church. Today Mariazell Baroque church has been rebuilt several times in different architectural styles and still houses the old statue. **Celebrate Mass at the Shrine of Mariazell.** Independent lunch with time to enjoy the quaint main square in Mariazell. Midafternoon return to Vienna for dinner and overnight at our Vienna hotel.

Day 5: Saturday, August 15: Melk Abbey , Lake District & Salzburg Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Breakfast at our hotel. Depart Vienna hotel for Melk. Enjoy magnificent scenery along the Danube in a region known as the Wachau, the pride of the historic preservation movement in Austria. At Melk, we will visit the Benedictine Abbey, crowning the rocky hill overlooking the Danube. Its library contains over 80,000 books and 2,000 manuscripts, all on religious subjects. Celebrate Mass at Melk Abbey. Independent lunch. Continue our scenic drive through the Austrian Lake District with marvelous views of the Salzkammergut region. In Mondsee, visit the Basilica of St. Michael which reached international fame for the wedding scene in the movie The Sound of Music. Then, continue to the Baroque city of Salzburg, a jewel set on the beautiful banks of the Salzach River. Evening: Dinner and overnight at our hotel in Salzburg.

## Marian Devotion Pilgrimage to Austria & Bavaria

#### Day 6: Sunday, August 16: Salzburg

Breakfast at our hotel. Celebrate Mass at the Shrine of Maria Plain (subject to confirmation). Begin our guided tour of Salzburg's sights along Getreidegasse, the city's pedestrian street, lined with authentic 17th and 18th century buildings. Pass by the house where Mozart was born and view Monchsberg with the fortress "Hohensalzburg," which overlooks the city. Built into the side of Monchsberg is the Salzburg Festspielhaus, home of the famous Salzburg Festival Operas. See Residenzplatz, the center square of Salzburg, dominated by the dynamic sculpture of the Residenzbrunnen, the largest baroque fountain north of the Alps. Next, visit Salzburg Cathedral and St.Peter's Abbey, next to the cemetery where the escape was filmed in The Sound of Music and where most of Mozart's religious works were premiered. Independent lunch. Enjoy a visit to the Bräustübl tavern and Brewery, Austria's largest outdoor beer garden. Enjoy a festive group dinner in this traditional meeting place a piece of living history in the world heritage center of Salzburg. Overnight at our Salzburg hotel.

#### Day 7: Monday, August 17: Altötting & Munich

Breakfast at our hotel. Leave Salzburg for **Altötting**, often referred to as the "Lourdes of Germany" due to the thousands of pilgrims coming here every year for healing attributed to the intercession of Our Lady of Altötting. A young Joseph Ratzinger came here, and it is known to be one of his favorite shrines. We will see the "Black Madonna," a wooden statue of the Virgin Mary. Opposite the altar, the hearts of the Bavarian Dukes, Kings, and Electors are stored in richly decorated silver urns as a special sign of their deep loyalty to the Bavarian National Shrine. We'll also visit the Basilica of St. Anna, the Holy Chapel, the Collegiate Church, and the treasury housing the gifts donated to the Basilica. **Celebrate Mass at St. Konrad Church**. Independent lunch in Altötting. Depart for Munich, the capital of

Bavaria and the second largest city in Germany. Check in at our hotel. Dinner and overnight at our Munich hotel.

## Day 8: Tuesday, August 18: Neuschwanstein Castle & Ettal Monastery

Breakfast at our hotel. We head to southern Bavaria to explore King Ludwig's majestic Neuschwanstein Castle. Go back to the times of Wagner as you visit the royal apartments decorated with scenes from German sagas and Wagner's operas, the throne rooms and music halls. Independent lunch. Continue to Ettal Monastery, a vibrant place of prayer, community, and Benedictine tradition. Monastic life follows a centuries-old order shaped by the Rule of Saint Benedict. Celebrate Mass at Ettal Monastery. Enjoy a tour that will give you insights into the cloister, the daily routine of the monks, and the spiritual foundations that determine monastic life. After our tour of the monastery, we'll learn how the famous Ettal beer is brewed according to old craft traditions followed by a tasting. Return to Munich. Independent dinner and overnight at our Munich hotel.

## Day 9: Wednesday, August 19: Munich

Breakfast at our hotel. Our local guide will take us to explore the highlights of Munich, including the Marienplatz and world-famous Glockenspiel; the twintowered Frauenkirche, the most familiar landmark of old Munich; town hall; and the royal boulevard with its triumphal arch and victory gate. Celebrate Mass at the Church of Our Lady (Frauenkirche). Independent lunch. Free afternoon. Festive farewell dinner at a traditional Bavarian-style restaurant in Munich. Overnight at our Munich hotel.

### Day 10: Thursday, August 20: Return to the USA

This morning, transfer to Munich Airport for our return flight home.
