

#### REFLECTION

Sami developed a personal relationship with Jesus in college, spending more time studying Scripture and theology than her class work. After graduation, she was a Director at Eagle Lakes Camps of the Navigators where she developed a passion for young people and helping them know Christ.



At first glance, today's gospel passage can make us feel really uncomfortable. Jesus says he has come to bring fire and division, not peace. So it seems contradictory to the message of peace we often associate with Jesus. But he's not talking about the peace that we associate with comfort. Jesus speaks of bringing fire—a symbol of judgment, purification, and the Holy Spirit. It's the fire that refines, that tests the heart, that reveals what is true. He follows it with a reference to His coming "baptism," which alludes to His suffering and death. The fire can't fall until the cross is endured. The cost of love is high.

And then comes the paradox: the Prince of Peace bringing division. But this division is not His desire—it's the natural consequence of His presence

in a world that must choose to follow Him. The gospel doesn't allow neutrality. When Christ enters a life, a home, or a society, He draws a line: Will you follow me, or not?

This passage reminds us that real discipleship has a cost. Sometimes the deepest loyalty to Jesus will create rifts in our closest relationships, the ones we hold most dear. Our faith may cause confusion, resistance, even rejection from those we love. But Jesus is clear: following Him means allowing truth to disrupt comfort. The division He speaks of is not for destruction, but for revelation. He shakes us not to cast us away, but to wake us up. The gospel divides only so that it might refine us on a deeper level, drawing us closer to Himself, who is our peace.



#### God's Love For Us



Where do you experience God loving you? What was that like? Do you want it all the time?




How many times have you told the Lord that you love His presence?


Watching for God in our everyday lives, living like God wants us to live, and sharing the Good News with others, are some of the ways that we can live our faith out loud!



## Gregorian Chant, Explained!

Gregorian chant is an ancient form of sacred music used in liturgical worship and prayer. Defined by a monophonic (meaning a single melody without harmony or chords), unaccompanied song, this type of chant focuses the singer's mind on the content of the prayer being sung, which makes it uniquely suited for use in the Mass.

Dating to the first millennium, it derives its name from Pope St. Gregory the Great, though scholarship is unclear on when exactly this type of chant originated. Prior to the Second Vatican Council, it was standard to use Gregorian chant in the Roman Rite Mass. Sacrosanctum Concilium, the Constitution on Divine Worship promulgated by Pope Paul VI in 1963, asserts that Gregorian chant is "specially suited to the Roman liturgy...(and) should be given pride of place in liturgical services."
