Radiant Hope

At the beginning of August a group of middle and high school students attended Life Teen/Edge summer camps in Georgia. This year, the overarching theme for Life Teen/Edge is Radiant Hope. During camp students reflected on various ways that the Blessed Virgin Mary gives us hope for eternal life in heaven, and how we can radiate the light of Christ to all we encounter in our daily lives. This weekend's Gospel is a perfect example of Radiant Hope.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines the virtue of Hope as the following: Hope is the theological virtue by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit. (CCC 1817).

Hope is not relying on our own strength but on the help of the Holy Spirit, trusting that we will be provided with all that we need in order to enter the Kingdom of heaven. Jesus notes in today's Gospel that many will try to walk the narrow path and many will not be strong enough. We are called to be a radiant hope to the world, to shine brightly with hope even when we face sufferings and temptations and the road to heaven seems too narrow and steep, there is still hope! There is still

hope because we have a God who never gives up on us.

One of my favorite prayers is the Radiating Christ prayer, a prayer that the Missionaries of Charity, Mother Teresa's community, pray every day after Holy Mass. The prayer asks Jesus to help us be His light to all the world. The line from the prayer that I often ask the Lord to grant me in my life is: let them look up and see no longer me, but only Jesus! This one line summarizes what it means to radiate hope, to live so closely connected to Christ, that those around us see Him and not us through our actions and our words. Through radiating Him we offer others the hope of heaven, and we can offer strength to others when the road becomes narrow and hard.

For the next ten months, we will be diving deeply into habits that can help us begin to radiate Christ more brightly to others. No matter where you are in your life with Christ, no matter how you have previously spread His light and hope to others, Christ will always call you deeper. This year our students are going to be challenged to be that Radiant Hope to the world. I encourage you to join us on the journey these ten months to discover how you can begin or continue in a deeper way to radiate Christ's light and hope to the world.

TOPIC: The Joy of Prayer

As we focus on the habit of praying every day, come learn how to rediscover or discover the joy of prayer in nine days, based on the book by popular author, Fr. Jacques Philippe.

REFLECTION

Prayer: A Pouring Out and a Filling Up

You have been chosen. You have no choice in the matter. God chose you and you are His. You can't do anything to be unchosen. It isn't possible.

How does that strike you?

Understanding this can shape how we relate to God tremendously. As we begin our month focusing on our prayer, I wish to remind you of a basic tenet: You can not pray wrong. Prayer is a word that captures, very simply, how you relate to a God that loves you beyond measure. You can talk and talk and talk all you want, and He will continue to smile at you as if you were starting fresh every moment. He is just so overjoyed that you are talking to Him. Would He be even more overjoyed if you would allow Him to have a word in edgewise? Absolutely! He will keep coming back to listen to you no matter what. You need to merely say His name. He will listen unfailingly because He can't wait to hear your voice.

On a recent retreat I was reminded that God wants to hear everything. EVERYTHING. While we know that He already knows, He wants to hear it from you. In hearing everything, it is

how He can heal the hurts, mend the heart, celebrate the joy, and bestow grace upon grace. Our prayer should be a pouring out AND a filling up. Here is a prayer strategy to consider. It is a strategy known as ARR. Caution: This can not be done quickly so give this strategy some time.

Call upon the Holy Spirit to open your heart to the presence of God. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you to all those places that need God's attention in your life; the good, the bad, the ugly.

Acknowledge your need.

Relate that need to Jesus, especially those things that are embarrassing and hard. Exhaust yourself.

Stop talking. Receive what Jesus is pouring into you, what He is revealing to you.

Respond to what God does and show gratitude.







Ignatian Spiritual Exercises, Explained!

The Ignatian Spiritual Exercises are prayers and meditations developed by St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Society of Jesus (commonly referred to as the Jesuits).

St. Ignatius of Loyola (1492-1556) was born to a noble Basque family. In his youth, he spent time at the Royal Court of Castile and fought in the Spanish army. He experienced a profound religious conversion during a long period of convalescence following a battle injury. Living in a cave outside of Manresa, he began to keep the journal that became the basis of the famous Spiritual Exercises.

The Spiritual Exercises are meant to accompany souls on a journey toward deeper contemplation of God's love and a more meaningful understanding of his call to discipleship in the life of each person. Divided into four stages, or "weeks," the exercises focus on the interior movements of the heart to unveil the will of God.


