

Through all the Pages – one constant remains...God's Forgiveness.

God is with us every minute of every day of every stage, phase, age and page. We are blessed.

REFLECTION

Pray Every Day

How did your first week of praying every day go? Were your energized? Did you start strong and find yourself fizzling? Reach out to a fellow disciple, especially one who is on fire, and ask them for advice. This is what community is for!

As you enter into week two of our challenge to pray every day, I would invite you to consider your heart to be the dwelling place of God – always. It is in your heart that you can access God at any moment. At any moment, you can have a moment of encounter with the Creator of the Universe, the creator of you, His beloved. "The heart is the dwelling-place where I am, where I live... The heart is our hidden center, beyond the grasp of our reason and of others; only the Spirit of God can fathom the human heart and know it fully...It is the place of truth, where we choose life or death. It is the place of encounter...it is the place of covenant." (And You Will Find Rest, Sattler, Sophia Institute Press, 2024, p. 22). It is the place where you can find rest.

The best prayer happens when a disciple allows time to sit quietly and be still. To shut out and shut off the world in order to access the Godshaped place in your heart. Once there, there are three types of prayer to engage in: vocal prayer, meditative prayer, and contemplative prayer.

Vocal prayer means speaking to God. Talk to Him truly and sincerely about anything and everything. There is no reason to hold anything back for He really wants to hear the good, the bad, the ugly in order to heal your heart.



Meditative prayer is an activity of the mind. It isn't about your words. It is about allowing your mind to be open to what God is showing you as you think about the events of your day and burdens on your heart and mind. "Meditation is above all a quest. The mind seeks to understand the why and the how of the Christian life, in order to adhere and respond to what the Lord is asking" (The 10:10 Challenge, Lesperance and Jackson, Evangelical Catholic, 2024, p. 15). Ask God to show you what He needs you to see and do for Him—what is His will.

Contemplative prayer moves beyond words, mental ponderings, and active dialogue with God. For many people of the modern era, this is the most challenging but the most rewarding form of prayer, as it is the prayer that allows us to dwell in the presence of God. It is a prayer of silence, trusting Him to hold us in love and work deeply in our soul – even without us noticing (The 10:10 Challenge, p. 16).

The beauty of prayer is that you can't do it wrong. God delights in hearing from you no matter what, when, why, where, or how! It doesn't matter how you pray, but that you pray. If you are struggling with prayer, contact Jill Fischer at jill.fischer@stdominic.net or 262.781.3480, Ext. 252.







Lectio Divina, Explained!

Lectio divina ("divine reading") is a practice of praying through the reading of Scripture, opening oneself to the inspiration and communication of the Holy Spirit.

The practice of Lectio divina dates to ancient monastic communities, but it has gained popularity in modern times as a way to meaningfully engage with the Word of God.

The formula for Lectio divina is simple and follows four steps. The text of the Scripture is read (lectio) multiple times, and the reader takes note of any words or phrases that resonate with him in a particular way. The reader then reflects deeply on the passage (meditatio) and the words that he noticed, turning them over in his mind. Following this, the reader prays with the passage (oratio), and dialogues with God, inviting him to illuminate the reader's understanding of the text. Finally, there is rest and contemplation ©LPi (contemplatio).
