

#### Crossing the Street

It takes a cold, hard, godless heart to step over a wounded man on the street.

We all know the parable of the Good Samaritan, the priest, and the Levite who comes across a half-dead traveler. I think we picture them stepping over the man in our collective imagining of this story, but the words of the Gospel are quite clear. "When he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side," Jesus says of both.


So they saw him. They saw his need. It made them uncomfortable; it confused them — many scholars have said that Judaic law concerning the touching of dead bodies might have made them reluctant to approach — and so they decided the simplest way to file this situation in the Not My Problem category was to cross the street.

But that still leaves a half-dead guy on the road. And we all, 2,000 years later, still think of the priest and the Levite as cold and hard and godless — even if they didn't want to be, even if they didn't think of themselves that way — because the bottom line is, they didn't see the half-dead guy as their problem.

As Christians we know that everyone is our neighbor. It's drilled into us from the first time we hear this story.

Well, I don't know about you, but I find myself crossing the street a lot more than I should.

There is so much pain and suffering in the world. We certainly can't begin to alleviate it all. But we have to start with the pain and the suffering that we see, that's right in front of us—even if it's something we really, really want to ignore. Even if we find it inconvenient or confusing or scary or weird.



The heroism of the Good Samaritan wasn't in his selfless actions, although those were certainly commendable. It was in his courage. "He approached the victim," Jesus said.

Can we approach the victims we see? Do we have that courage?

#### REFLECTION

#### Prayer: A Genuine Love Relationship

Prayer is a relationship of genuine love between us and God. In order to pray from the heart, we have to remind ourselves that God truly loves us. If we think God doesn't care about us, or is just waiting for us to mess up, or is removed and uninvolved, or angry with us, it's going to be pretty difficult for us to open our hearts to Him. But the Scriptures remind us, "God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). There's nothing you can do to earn (or to lose) God's love, but you can grow in your capacity to accept and respond to this great gift.

If you have been rejected, criticized, or trained to please others to receive love, it can be hard to accept the unconditional love God wants to give you. But He knows you better than you know yourself. And He loves you. He loved you into being. You are His beloved child. Sit in that truth. Let God love you today and every day.

Prayer suggestion: Through Baptism, we share in Jesus's identity as God's beloved child. Take a moment to sit in God's love. Turn off the noise and be still. Imagine Him looking at you with joy, cherishing you, being well pleased with you despite everything or because of everything.

What is this like for you? Is it beautiful and reassuring? Emotional? Difficult? Boring?

If you were to live without fear, in total confidence in God, what would that be like? How would you be different?



Tell God about any anxieties or doubts you have about being beloved by Him or anything else. Ask Him to give you more confidence in His love and care for you.

Prayer is not so much about giving, although sharing everything with God is so important, it is much more about receiving what He has to show you. You can't grow in that awareness unless you unburden yourself to Him. Remove the barriers created in your mind and heart to allow Him to enter in. Jesus is a perfect gentleman and will only do what you ask Him to do. He will only do so in faith. Spend time with Him in giving and in receiving. He is showing you your heart's desire, His desire. Pay attention. It may be more than what you bargained for.





# OUR CATHOLIC FAITH LITANY

#### Litany, Explained!

A litany is an ancient form of prayer incorporating repetitive refrains (often "hear our prayer" or "pray for us"). Litanies are used in a variety of liturgical settings and in both private and public acts of devotion.

The basis of the word "litany" comes from the Greek word for "supplication" or "petition." In a litany, the leader will make an appeal or a statement and the congregation will make the response. Litanies can also be said by one person acting as both the leader and the respondent.

Many litanies have been written, including litanies to the Holy Name of Jesus, the Sacred Heart, the Most Precious Blood, litanies appealing to the intercession of various saints, and litanies to the Blessed Mother under her different titles. There are also litanies composed for the attainment of graces and virtues, including the Litany of Humility and the Litany of Trust.


