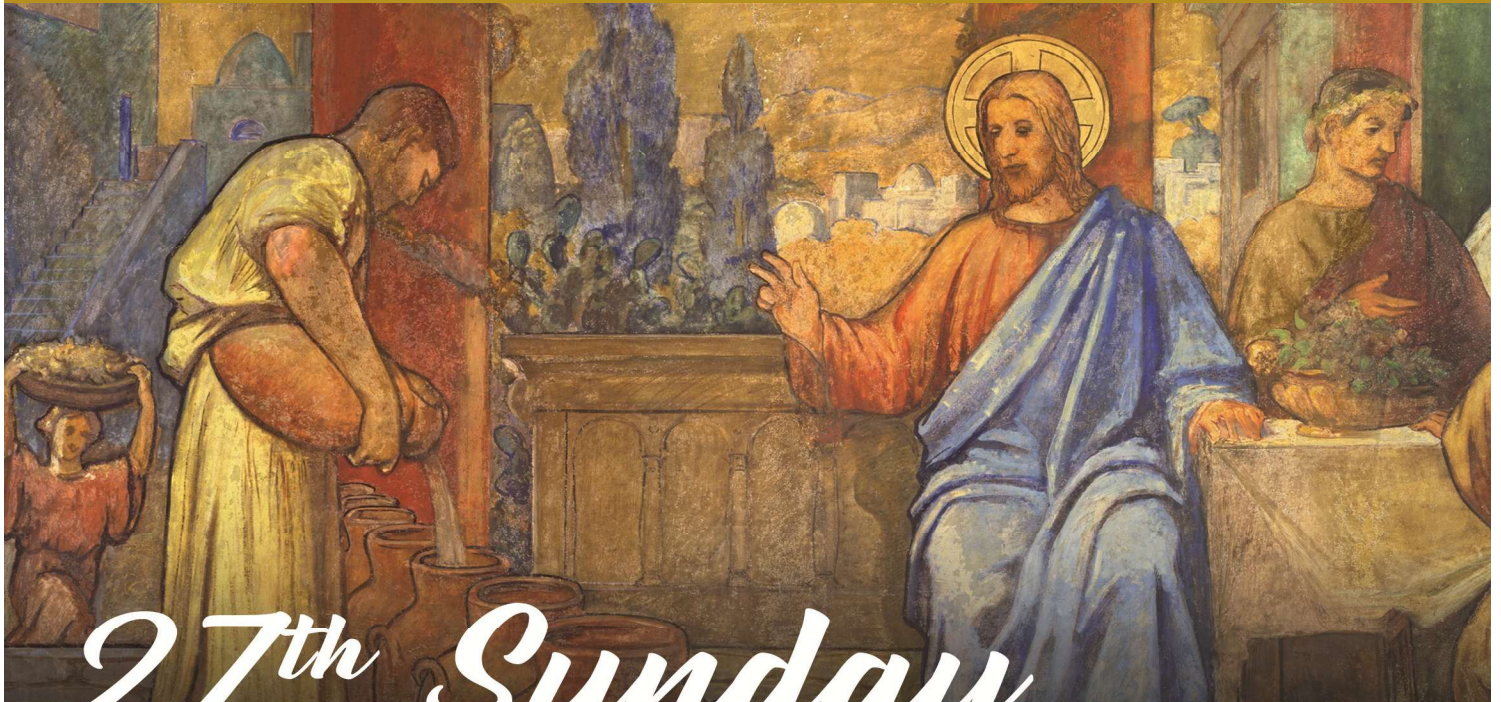

REFLECTION

Mary Lestina has been working in ministry all her life, thanks to the example of her parents who instilled in the family a love for God and sharing faith with those around us. As a pastoral associate, she serves those who are seeking to join the Church, engaged couples preparing for marriage, and providing compassion to those needing prayer and support.



In June, I was blessed to walk the Camino de Santiago. I met many people along the way, who shared their stories, why they were walking the Camino, and what their hopes were for the pilgrimage. It was a gift to accompany these men and women. As they walked on ahead of me, I asked Jesus to bless them. This is called relational discipleship; walking with those who God sends our way, sharing our stories and praying with and for one another.

Weeks later after I returned home, I was awakened by my brother at 3:00 AM. He had just learned that his son had committed suicide. He needed to talk. We cried together, trying to make sense of it. I walked with my family and loved ones on this journey of trying to understand why and where to find strength to carry such a cross. We might not have the answers as we accompany others, as often this process is messy, because it is real life, but it is not always what we say that matters, but that we are present.

Today is Respect Life Sunday, a time for all of us to reflect on the gift of life. Our Church embraces a consistent ethic of life, often called the “seamless garment,” which affirms that every person bears the image of God and is deserving of dignity (cf. Gn. 1:27). From the unborn child to the prisoner on death row, from the refugee seeking safety to the neighbor facing poverty

or addiction, our Church proclaims that all human life is sacred and inviolable. This value is counter-cultural in our present day world. Jesus is calling us to be bold, to open our eyes and ears to those he sends us, to enter their struggles, pain, and woundedness. He invites us to get involved and make a difference. We can do it every day by offering kindness and respect toward others, especially those that are challenging, affirming and making others know that they are loved. In my office hangs a framed towel with a depiction of Jesus washing the feet of another with the inscription, “Do what I have done”.

Jesus give me the strength at all times to be the voice of the vulnerable, to stand firm in our teachings, to walk with those wounded, and carry those who are hopeless. Jesus it is you that heals the broken. Open our eyes to see you in everyone we meet and to proclaim that life is precious.

What will you do for Respect Life awareness? As I walk as a relational disciple among those God sends me, I pray that my love and respect for them will move them to do the same for others. Lord, increase my faith. Use me as your disciple leading others to you, for you are the Way, the Truth and the Life.

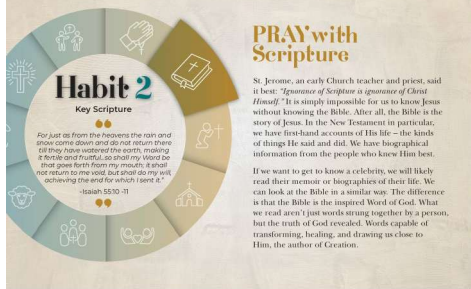

REFLECTION

In the Gaze of Love



Praying with Scripture is a new thing for me. While raised in a Catholic home, attended Catholic schools for

elementary, high school, and college, and worked in the Church, the experience of using Scripture as a prayer tool was never shared. I learned Scripture, I didn't pray with Scripture. Thanks to my colleagues on the second floor of the parish center, I have now learned how to do this. I continue to grow in it. Truthfully, I sometimes think that I am doing it wrong, only because I am comparing myself to more seasoned practitioners. I need to reject that thought because what I am doing is the good and right thing to do. I am simply doing it the way that I am doing it, and I am affirmed in that. The Lord will lead me if only I choose to follow.

If you are anything at all like me, I have some helpful tips for you to get started in this habit from the National Conference of Diocesan Vocation Directors (Have I Been With You, Father Paul C. Hoelsing, 2014, p.26).

Begin to prayerfully read a Gospel passage every day. The desire for a new priority of prayer will run into old priorities and stubborn affections. The catechism calls this the battle of prayer. Do not be discouraged by it. Let the sign of the cross begin the time of prayer. Ask the Holy Spirit to quiet and inspire you. Then, in the space of an Our Father, "consider how

God our Lord looks upon you." The Father desires to speak to your heart. The passage you have in front of you has been given to you personally.

In the gaze of love, read the Gospel passage.

- What stands out in the scene?
- Where are you drawn?
- What is it like to be in the scene?
- Any thoughts, feelings or desires that are prominent for you?
- What are you aware of as you read the passage, slowly and simply?

The answers to these questions are a powerful starting place for a conversation with God about what He wants to reveal to you and wants you to know. You need to sit with Him. Be open, so that you might receive. Receiving is the heart of prayer.

One could stay with the same Gospel passage or move to another. It depends upon what has been stirring in our prayer. Sometimes it will seem like a passage has chosen us, or more keeps coming up, or so much is filling our attention. In that case, stay with the passage as long as necessary. If you are knocking on doors, looking for a friend in the apartments and we find that person, we do not move to the next door. We stay in that place for a while.

Special Note for both Emmaus and Edge on October 6/7

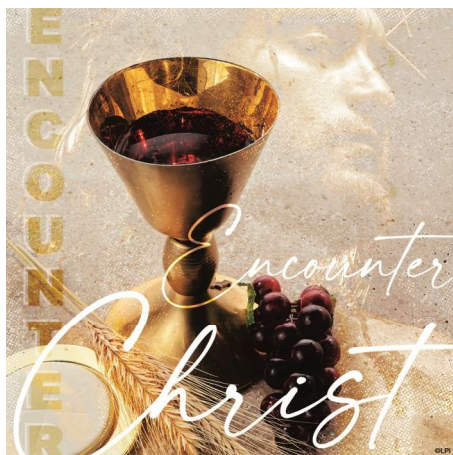

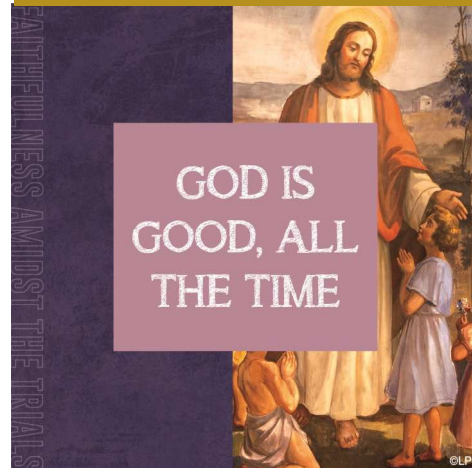

GOD IS
GOOD, ALL
THE TIME

God is Good, All the Time, Explained!

This is a familiar saying in our school. Someone says, "God is good!" And those in the audience respond, faithfully, "All the time." In turn, the speaker repeats: "All the time." And the audience affirms: "God is good!"

A collective affirmation of God's faithfulness amidst the trials of life, this refrain communicates a theme presented again and again in Scripture: Come what may, God will be with us.

There is no official consensus on the origins of this saying, though it is often associated with African Christianity. Whatever this saying's roots, its message is truth: "For the Lord is good; His mercy is everlasting; and His truth endures to all generations," says Psalm 100:5. "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever," echoes 1 Chronicles 16:34. Jesus confirms this in Matthew 28:20: "I am with you always, even to the end of the age." ©LPI

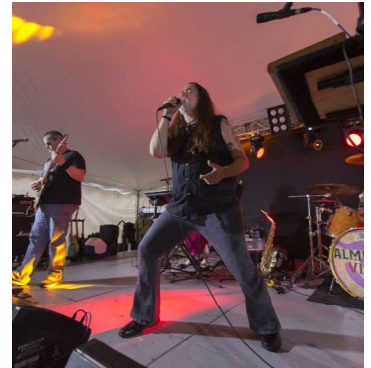


