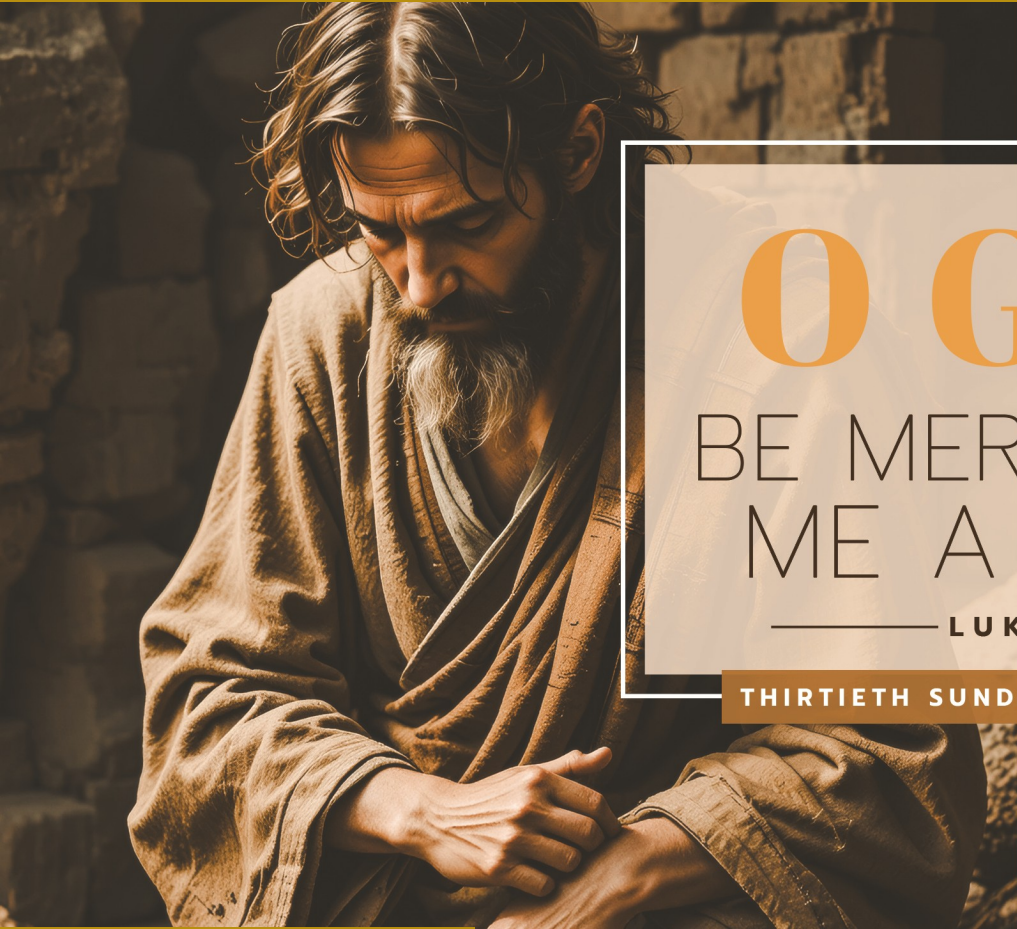

"Prayer is the raising of one's mind and heart to God or the requesting of good things from God." But when we pray, do we speak from the height of our pride and will, or "out of the depths" of a humble and contrite heart? He who humbles himself will be exalted; humility is the foundation of prayer, only when we humbly acknowledge that "we do not know how to pray as we ought," are we ready to receive freely the gift of prayer. "Man is a beggar before God." CCC 2559

In today's Gospel Jesus gives us a specific teaching on the need for humility in prayer through the use of a parable. I recently had a priest friend who challenged me to grow in the virtue of humility. He had been reading a book by St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross which spoke about how if we want to grow in our life of prayer then we need to grow in the virtue of humility, and if we want to grow in the virtue of humility, then we need to pray. Prayer and humility go hand in hand and the Catechism of the Catholic Church speaks to this connection perfectly, even quoting the end of the Gospel passage that we hear today. I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." For humility is the very foundation of prayer.

In the parable, the Pharisee spoke to

God from a place of pride, assuming that because he adhered to all of the pious practices according to the tradition, he would automatically receive God's divine blessing. He overlooked the important need for the God's mercy. The tax collector, however, spoke to God from a place of need—a place of depending on God's mercy, and in that moment opened his heart humbly to the workings of the Lord. In this man's humility, God is able to wash him clean in His mercy and exalt him, for he came to God with an open humble heart.

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta writes that: "Humility is the mother of all virtues; purity, charity, and obedience. It is in being humble that our love becomes real, devoted, and ardent. If you are humble nothing will touch you, neither praise nor disgrace, because you know what you are. If you are blamed, you will not be discouraged. If they call you a saint, you will not put yourself on a pedestal."

It is in being humble that our love becomes real, the tax collector's love of God was real, whereas the Pharisee's was out of duty. As you go forth this week, ask the Lord to grant you more humility in order that your love, your service, your very life may result in true love and worship of God, the one who humbled Himself to become man in order that we might live with Him in heaven and be saved.

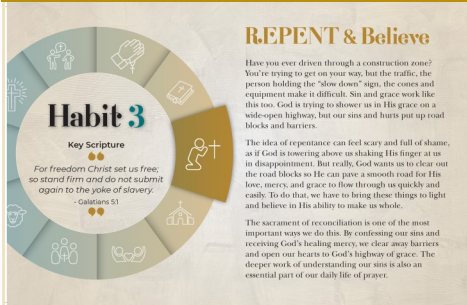

HABIT #3



REPENT & Believe

Have you ever driven through a construction zone? You're trying to get on your way, but the traffic, the person holding the "slow down" sign, the cones and equipment make it difficult. Sin and grace work like this too. God is trying to bring us in His grace on a wide-open highway, but our sins and hurts put up road blocks and barriers.

The idea of repentance can feel scary and full of shame, as if God is hovering above us shaking His finger at us in disappointment. But really, God wants us to clear out the road blocks so He can pave a smooth road for His love, mercy, and grace to flow through us quickly and easily. To do that, we have to bring these things to light and believe in His ability to make us whole.

The sacrament of reconciliation is one of the most important ways we do this. By confessing our sins and receiving God's healing mercy, we clear away barriers and open our hearts to God's highway of grace. The deeper work of understanding our sins is also an essential part of our daily life of prayer.

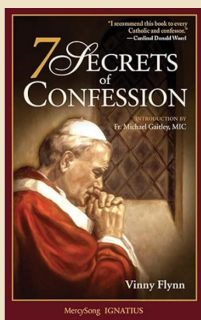
Habit #3: Repent & Believe

PRAYING WITH SCRIPTURE—HABIT #2

Engage in the Word of God

As we close out the month of **Praying with Scripture**, I hope you have developed a habit for how to engage with the Word of God. It is so energizing to hear directly from God in prayer! In this column, passages have been shared with you to try using when praying with Scripture. Using the prayer technique from the Habit of Praying Every Day – Notice, Tell, Invite, Listen was also suggested when doing lectio divina. In review, when exercising lectio divina, one must follow four main steps:

Read – read the passage slowly, noting any word, phrase, or image that catches your attention.

Reflect – read the passage again slowly, reflecting/pondering the word or phrase that caught your attention, asking God what He means to show you in these words.

Respond – read the passage a third time and consider how to respond to what you heard from God, talking to Him about what you are experiencing (Notice, Tell, Invite, Listen).

Rest – sit in silence and possibly journal what comes to mind.

It is okay to sit with the same passage for a period of time, for a few days or weeks. That is the beauty of having a journal or writing in your Bible, as it provides evidence of your growth.

A second technique that can be used when praying with Scripture hinges more on particular questions to guide your reading. These questions can also be used when reading spiritual texts, especially the writings of Saints or the Church Fathers. They are as follows:

What is he/she saying?

Why are they saying it?

How are you prayerfully responding? (Notice, Tell, Invite, Listen)

While these are suggestions and techniques for you, especially if you are a beginner, with practice, you may develop your own method. That is the beauty of prayer, be it with or without Scripture, you can't really do it wrong. After all, with prayer, it isn't what we do but what God does.

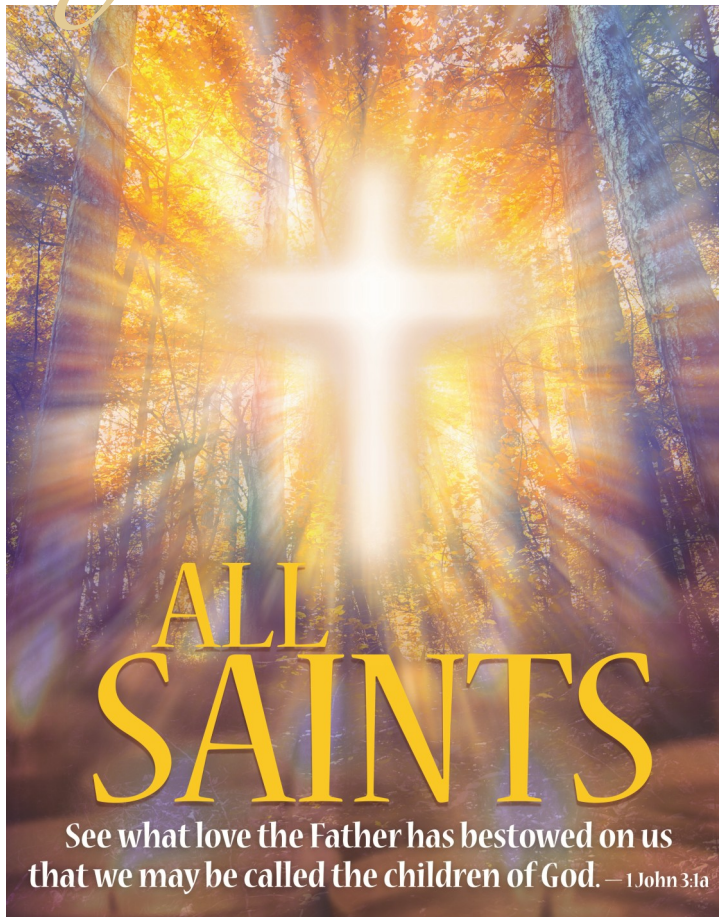

The Guardian Angel Prayer, Explained!

The Guardian Angel Prayer, also known as the Angel of God Prayer, invokes the protection of one's guardian angel. Often one of the first prayers taught to children, it consists of two rhyming couplets: "Angel of God, my guardian dear, to whom God's love commits me here, ever this day be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide."

The exact authorship of this prayer is unknown. Scholars previously attributed it to St. Anselm of Canterbury, though many now believe a version composed by Reginald of Canterbury in his "Life of Malchus" serves as the prayer's inspiration.

Guardian Angels are referred to in Scripture in the Book of Daniel (Dan. 12:1), the Gospel of Matthew (Matthew 18:10) and the Psalms (91:10-13). "From its beginning until death, human life is surrounded by their watchful care and intercession," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 336).

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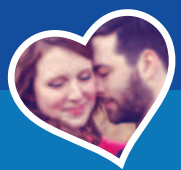
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
