

REFLECTION

Hope Beyond Hope

I lost my wallet this year. It was such an annoyance to replace everything in it. A friend, moved by sympathy, gave me a beautiful new one. One month later I lost that one, too, with all my newly replaced cards. No matter what I did, I couldn't find what I had lost. I resigned myself to never seeing either of my wallets again.

Fortunately, the Lord Jesus is not like me in this regard. In today's Gospel (John 6:37–40), he says, "This is the will of the one who sent me, that I should not lose anything of what he gave me." Jesus, unlike me, is ever vigilant with what the Father has given him. He searches for every lost soul — as the shepherd leaves the

ninety-nine to pursue the one lost sheep, or the woman rejoices upon recovering a lost coin — and even descends to the depths of loss on the cross and into the realm of the dead to recover that which seems forever lost.

On All Souls' Day, as we remember our faithful departed, these words kindle a hope beyond hope in our hearts. Even the dead are not lost to Jesus, though they may seem so to us. Nothing entrusted to him by the Father is ever truly lost. So, we may hope that every soul, no matter how wandering or forgotten in life, is secure in his loving care and destined to be raised on the last day. Of what the Father gives him, he loses nothing.


10 Habits of a Disciple Habit #3: Repent & Believe

REPENT & BELIEVE—HABIT #3

Repentance? Believe...in what?

As disciples building spiritual habits, we must take heed of a very particular message that is sprinkled throughout Scripture – repent and believe. To repent is to feel or express sincere regret or remorse about one's wrongdoing. To believe, in the sense of this habit, is to accept as true the healing that comes from reconciliation with God through the sacrament. This requires courage, humility, and commitment.

First, this habit requires courage because there is nothing more uncomfortable than having to admit you aren't perfect. However, consider this: good habits can feel bad at first. Owning our faults, the good habit, can elicit a level of nerves that is uncomfortable, in addition to the anticipated consequence of being held accountable. The discomfort is what feels bad. Many things that feel good temporarily, such as pleasures or vices, are ultimately bad for us. Such a conundrum! This is why many of us don't like admitting it when we do something wrong - it is the right thing to do but feels uncomfortable. We would rather hide much like Adam and Eve. God never intended this for us. If you recall, He walked with Adam and Eve in friendship just like He wants to do with you. Don't hide. Be courageous.

Second, this habit requires humility because one must recognize the disordered nature of our soul and mind. That is uncomfortable. We have intentionally put vice in front of a virtue and must realign ourselves

with what God wants for us. Repentance puts things back in proper perspective and forces us to stay there or at least work to stay there. Repentance is a radical turning around, a change of ones' perspective and entire direction away from sin and evil, towards goodness and God (10:10 Challenge, Andre Lesperance and Andrea Jackson, Evangelical Catholic, 2024, p. 81). When we make gods of ourselves or other things, this realization propels us to humility. Not sure you understand? Take a look at the Litany of Humility, it might help.

Third, this habit requires commitment. A commitment to being better, not for God's sake, but for your own. Salvation depends on our ability to humble ourselves before God. By the mere fact of our Baptism, we are united to God, but more is required. More is desired. Remember, Adam and Eve were not alone with God. There was another being there who is also vying for your attention. As St. Peter exhorts, "Be sober and vigilant. Your opponent the devil is prowling around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, steadfast in faith, knowing that your fellow believers throughout the world undergo the same sufferings" (1 Peter 5:8-9). It doesn't take much for the devil to swav us. Once he does, he has a foothold. Don't give it to him. Repent and believe.



PRAYER FOR THE DEAD

Prayer for the Dead, Explained

It may seem strange to pray for someone who is already dead and who, according to our earthly reckoning of time, has already undergone judgment. But God is not subject to the constrictions of time as we understand them. Our prayers for the dead are, like our prayers for the living, an expression of charity and the unity that exists between all members of the Body of Christ.

"By virtue of the 'communion of saints,' the Church commends the dead to God's mercy and offers her prayers, especially the holy sacrifice of the Eucharist, on their behalf," says the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 1055).

The most common Catholic prayer for the dead is as follows: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace."








Tuesday Time-Out Book Discussion


