





Holy Ground

“Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? ...for the temple of God, which you are, is holy.”

— 1 Corinthians

This weekend the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica—the cathedral of the Bishop of Rome, our Holy Father Leo XIV, the Pope. Many people think St. Peter’s Basilica is the pope’s main church, but it’s actually St. John Lateran that holds that honor. It’s called the “mother church” of all Catholic churches in the world, a sign of our unity with the successor of St. Peter and with the universal Church.

When my family and I visited the Lateran Basilica in 2018, we were struck not only by its beauty and history, but by the sense of standing in the heart of the Church. Truly, holy ground. Beneath its grand arches and ancient mosaics, one could almost hear the prayers of countless generations who have worshiped or made pilgrimage there before us. It reminded me that the Church isn’t just one place—it’s all of us, united in Christ across time and space.

Today’s readings bring that truth home. Ezekiel describes water flowing from the temple, bringing life wherever it goes. St. Paul reminds us, “You are God’s building... the temple of the Holy Spirit.” And in the Gospel, Jesus speaks of His body as the new temple, raised up in three days.

Just as the Lateran Basilica is holy because it houses the Body of Christ, we too are made holy when we receive Him in the Eucharist. Christ dwells in us! Our bodies become living temples, which enables us to bring His love and light into the world.

As we celebrate this feast, let’s honor both our church buildings and the sacred dwelling of our own hearts. May we always be living stones in God’s house—strong in faith, united in love, and alive with His presence.

Loving God, you have made your Church a living temple, built of people from every nation and place. As we celebrate this feast, unite us more closely to you and to our Holy Father, the successor of Peter. Fill our hearts with your Spirit, that we may be holy dwellings of your presence and signs of your love to the world. Amen. Happy Sunday, friends!

HABIT #3



REPENT & Believe

Have you ever driven through a construction zone? You're trying to get on your way, but the traffic, the person holding the "slow down" sign, the cones and equipment make it difficult. Sin and grace work like this too. God is trying to shower us in His grace on a wide-open highway, but our sins and hurts put up road blocks and barriers.

The idea of repentance can feel scary and full of shame, as if God is lowering above us shaking His finger at us in disappointment. But really, God wants us to clear out the road blocks so He can pave a smooth road for His love, mercy and grace to flow through us quickly and easily. To do that, we have to bring these things to light and believe in His ability to make us whole.

The sacrament of reconciliation is one of the most important ways we do this. By confessing our sins and receiving God's healing mercy, we clear away barriers and open our hearts to God's highway of grace. The deeper work of understanding our sins is also an essential part of our daily life of prayer.



REPENT & BELIEVE

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

An important element to this month's habit of discipleship is the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If you haven't been to confession in a while, I invite you to have courage, humility, and commitment to this month's habit by giving it a try. Allow me to share these suggestions from Luisa Restrepo for ChurchPOP.com.

1.) Examine your conscience sincerely. Use tools such as the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes, or a set of examination questions to guide your reflection. Setting aside a few minutes each day for self-reflection will make each confession clearer and more thorough. See our website for sample exams at <https://stdominic.net/10habits>

If your examination of conscience is rushed or superficial, you may forget important sins or overlook patterns of behavior that keep leading you into the same sins.

2) Sorrow for our sins (contrition). Be sorry for having offended God—not just out of fear of punishment, but out of love for Him and a desire to grow in that love. If your main concern is avoiding hell or preserving your image, your focus is still on yourself rather than on God.

3) Confess with clarity and honesty. Once you've prepared, find a priest and a confessional. Confession is a dialogue in which the priest listens and offers guidance and counsel. Name your sins without justifying, hiding, or downplaying them.

Deliberately omitting a serious sin

renders the confession invalid. If you feel embarrassed, remember that the priest acts in persona Christi (in the person of Christ) and he, too, goes to confession.

4) Complete your penance.

Carry out the penance the priest assigns as soon as possible, with a spirit of reparation and reconciliation. If you forget or delay, do it as soon as you remember, even if some time has passed.

5) Have a firm purpose of amendment. Even if you might fall again, approach confession with the genuine intention to change your habits and avoid situations that lead you to sin. If you confess without any real desire to change, your confession loses sincerity and becomes empty.

A quick self-check before you leave the confessional:

- Did I prepare with prayer and a thorough examination of conscience?
- Was I honest and clear about my sins?
- Did I feel sincere repentance?
- Do I truly want to change and avoid sin?
- Did I complete my penance?

The Sacrament of Confession restores the grace lost through sin, strengthens us for the journey ahead, and keeps us humble and ready to follow God's plan for our lives.





Simbang Gabi, Explained


Simbang Gabi is a Filipino tradition that originated in the 17th century through which Advent expectation realizes the fulfillment of Christmas joy. During Simbang Gabi, early morning Masses are offered over a series of nine days leading up to Christmas. Celebrations follow Mass, where delicacies like baked rice cakes and breakfast rolls are enjoyed.

During Mass, the priest wears white vestments and the Gloria is sung, a practice for which the Holy See has given special permission. Traditionally, the nine-day sequence ends with Midnight Mass on December 24.

The tradition has been adapted to fit the needs of Filipino communities throughout the world, and the Masses might not even be offered in the morning at all, but in the afternoon or evening.





St. Michael's is home to many different cultures. It distributes food, clothing, and toys to members of the community who are in need—welcoming displaced people, refugees, and immigrant families.


St. Vincent de Paul


