



7 Steps to Holiness

We are called to be saints. The only alternative is too awful to think about: an eternity separated from God. In order to become saints, we must pursue holiness in our lives. We must seek to live authentic Catholic lives, seeking God's will in all we do.

You might ask: how do I become holy? Here are 7 steps you can take to achieve holiness:

- We must desire holiness. We are called to be holy. We are called to be saints. What is more important to you than becoming holy?
- We must surrender our lives to Jesus. When we seek God with all our hearts, hunger and thirst for Him, we will receive the grace for holiness.
- 3. We must repent of our weakness and sins on an ongoing basis. We must seek God's mercy and be merciful to others. Have we forgiven ourselves? Have we forgiven others?
- 4. We must ask for faith, faith that moves mountains and leads us to deeper holiness. Through faith we experience miracles and the mercy of God. Faith, through the

love of Jesus, heals us.

- 5. We must learn to pray fervently, to pray from our hearts, beginning with praising God for who He is. Prayer and praise lead us to be thankful for what God has done for us. We are connected to God through prayer, praise, and the sacraments; we are doing His will. When we do the will of God, we live in holiness.
- 6. We must love fervently. Ask God to teach you how to love. It is the most important act you can perform. It starts with God teaching you how to open your heart to receive the love God has for you.
- 7. To be holy means you are living a sacramental life. It requires leading a life in which you hunger and thirst for the Mass and Eucharist.

Have the courage not to compromise your desire for holiness. God has called us to be holy, He has called us to Himself and wants to give us every spiritual gift and blessing in the heavens.

REPENT & BELIEVE

Distractions & Excuses



The habit of repenting and believing is a challenge. There is no measuring stick for how well you do it apart from

your own growth. Are you making progress? Have you challenged yourself in new ways to align yourself with Jesus? As you progress in striving to give God full access, do not be discouraged or surprised by distractions. The devil will try to talk you out of these good habits in your own head, using your own voice. That said, consider this:

God is not surprised by your past; so don't waste your time trying to hide those facts from Him.

God is not shocked by your present distractions and impurities; He sees them before they are even on your mind.

God is not worried about your future, so keep it in His hands.


The best you can do with distractions you encounter, as you prepare a quiet place to welcome the desired guest of your soul, is to give those distraction straight to God.

Remember our first habit, pray every day. The technique of Notice, Tell, Invite, Listen, has this built right in! Notice that you are distracted, tell God about it, and invite Him to help you get over it. If you can't leave your distractions at the door, bring them in with you and give them to God! Remember a distraction is something that keeps you from the desired goal. It is something to persevere through. An excuse, however, gives you permission to return to what you find more immediately gratifying. Excuses are the devil actively at work. Both distractions and excuses must be rejected when striving to be a better disciple.

Advent Wreath, Explained

The Advent Wreath as we know it today is a modern spin on an ancient practice — or rather, several of them.

Christians have always utilized candles to illustrate the metaphor of Christ as the "great light" shining on a people waiting in darkness (Isaiah 9:2). Historians tell us that pre-Christian societies in Europe also viewed candles as symbolic of the coming light of spring, and may have used wreaths of natural material along with these candles.

An Advent Wreath consists of a circle of evergreen and four candles, one for each week of Advent. Three of the candles are purple; one is rose, representing Gaudete Sunday, a time of rejoicing at the closeness of Christmas. In Catholicism, Advent Wreaths are blessed on the First Sunday of Advent. For Advent Wreaths in private homes, it is appropriate for a family member to perform the blessing.


