Someone once said, "God is not so concerned with how fast you run but how far you run." The real test of your religion is not whether you can live by it, but can you die by it. In Hebrews 11, we find Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and Joseph at the end of their lives, looking back and also looking forward. John MacArthur said, "God is glorified when His people leave this world with their flags flying at full mast."

A faith that finishes well strives to:

Hebrews 11:17-22

- · Leave a legacy of faith
- · Make an impact with faith.
- Encourage a forward focus with faith.
