## The Four Rs

## The Four Rs - Example

### **Respond**

Think about someone you know who might benefit from hearing about God's comforting presence. Share this passage and its meaning with them.

## SOAP METHOD

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### **S - Scripture:**

Choose a passage of Scripture to focus on. Read it carefully, noting key verses or phrases that stand out to you.

### **O - Observation:**

### **A - Application:**

Think about how this passage applies to your life. What is God teaching you? Is there a specific action you need to take or a change in perspective?

### **P - Prayer:**

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## SOAP METHOD - Example

The SOAP Study Method is a simple yet powerful way to delve into Scripture. Let's use it with James 1:22 as an example of how to apply this method.

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### **James 1:22 (ESV)**

"But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves."

#### **S - Scripture:**

Read James 1:22 carefully, noting keywords or phrases that stand out to you.

#### **O - Observation:**

Observe the context of James 1:22. What is the author saying about the importance of action in response to God's Word? Read the verse or two before and after as well for more context.

#### **A - Application:**

How does James 1:22 challenge you personally? What action steps can you take to apply this principle in your life? Write these down and choose to take steps towards whatever the Holy Spirit places on your heart.

#### **P - Prayer:**

Respond to God in prayer, asking for His help in being a doer of His Word and not merely a hearer.
