Reading

Hebrews 10:16-25 (NVSVue)

Greeting

Pastor Dave: Christ himself bore our sins in his body on the tree.

The Seven Last Words

The First Word from the Cross:

Luke 23:33-34 (NRSVue) When they came to the place that is called The Skull, they crucified Jesus there with the criminals, one on his right and one on his left. Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing." And they cast lots to divide his clothing. [The first candle is extinguished].

The Second Word from the Cross:

One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

[The second candle is extinguished].

The Third Word from the Cross:

Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.

[The third candle is extinguished].

The Fourth Word from the Cross:

Mark 15:33-34 (NRSVue)

John 19:25-27 (NRSVue)

When it was noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. At three o'clock Jesus cried out with a loud voice, "Eloi, Eloi, lemasabachthani?" which means, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Luke 23:39-43 (NRSVue)

The Fifth Word from the Cross:

After this, when Jesus knew that all was now finished, he said (in order to fulfill the scripture), "I am thirsty."

The Sixth Word from the Cross:

John 19:29-30 (NRSVue) A jar full of sour wine was standing there. So they put a sponge full of the wine on a branch of hyssop and held it to his mouth. When Jesus had received the wine, he said, "It is finished."

[The sixth candle is extinguished].

The Seventh Word from the Cross:

Luke 23:45-47 (NRSVue) While the sun's light failed; and the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Having said this, he breathed his last. When the centurion saw what had taken place, he praised God and said, "Certainly this man was innocent."
