

# Engaging with the World: God's Mission

Some of you may remember the movie *The Blues Brothers.* I know, this seems like a really odd way to start an article about God's mission but, bear with me. The movie features two ne'er-dowell brothers, Jake and Elwood who were raised in an orphanage (founded by the Roman Catholic Church). Early in the movie, while visiting one of the sisters from the orphanage, they learn that the orphanage may have to close due to financial problems. Jake and Elwood decide to get their old blues band back together for a concert in order to raise funds to save the orphanage. As they seek out the other members of the band, they begin telling people they encounter that they are on a "mission from God." Now Jake and Elwood are not what you would call devout followers of God. But God moves their hearts to help the orphanage out of its financial problems. And, in the process not only is the orphanage saved but Jake and Elwood might have learned something about serving God. After the concert, Jake and Elwood get arrested and thrown in jail. But a "mysterious" benefactor intervenes on their behalf, and they are released from jail. While we don't know who the benefactor is, I like to think that perhaps God moved another heart to help in the redemption of Jake and Elwood - literally and spiritually. I can think of no better way to grow in faith than to join with one of our

partners in God's mission. Personally, I remember a trip to Syria a few years ago where we had visited several churches and some refugee camps. Here is an excerpt from a blog I wrote while in Syria, the entry is entitled, "I am the pauper": I come from a land of abundance to a land of limited resources, only to discover that I am the pauper. For two days, I have heard amazing stories of faith from the people and churches in Syria. They are stories of needs met and sometimes unmet, stories of courage and vision that have left

me awed and overwhelmed. To be sure, I have been uplifted and inspired, but I have also seen the depths of my spiritual poverty. I know this is not a competition, but I find myself wondering how I would deal with the staggering threats and the towering needs. I came to help and encourage, but I find that I am the one who needs the help and encouragement. And I have found it in the words and deeds of the churches in Syria. Nowhere have I seen a more vivid realization of Paul's words: "We are afflicted in every way, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies." (2 Corinthians 4:8-10). I listened to story after story of a church not shrinking from service, not seeking self-preservation, but seeking to reach out beyond its walls.

One pastor remarked that "This is what we must do. We cannot become a club of saints meeting once a week to pray and sing. To do so would be to fail Jesus and to fail as the church that is called to serve." I listened to dreams and plans to expand schools, enrich communities, buy buses, create new programs. Of course there are also needs of blankets, food and hygiene care, but I heard of plans to shift gears as the fighting comes to an end and to engage in a new struggle. The new struggle will not be against the ravages of war, but against ideologies of hate and isolation. If Jake and Elwood can become engaged in God's mission, surely we can as well. And we are! West Hills is engaged with God's mission in the world in a variety of ways. Locally, we partner with ministries like Abide, the Good News Bears, Heartland Hope, Intervarsity, Youth for Christ, Young Life, and the Arab Christian Fellowship. Hopefully, this last May during our Local Mission Partner Sunday when our partners visited West Hills, you were able to get better acquainted with their work. And maybe you learned of ways to join with them as volunteers in their work. West Hills is also engaged with several international ministries. Every October, we celebrate our international mission partners: Christian Women of Vision (CWoV ) in Cameroon, the Evangelical Theological Seminary in Cairo (ETSC), PCUSA Middle East Liaison, Reliant Missions - Bosnia, Pastor Rafael - Ecuador, For His Children - Ecuador, and 410 Bridge - Guatemala. Now, if you are looking for a way to become more deeply involved with one of our international mission partners, West Hills is organizing a short-term mission trip to For His Children - Ecuador in July of 2025. For His Children is a Christian oriented orphanage with whom West Hills has been in partnership for many years. 
## Atonement Child Care

"Ms. Elaine, Ms. Elaine," the sound of the children's voices brought several people to look out the Chapel windows and see a swarm of happy and excited little children surrounding Elaine Lewis as she walked onto the playground after Thursday morning Bible Study. Some of these little ones had surrounded her legs while others looked up at her with their happy faces, waiting for their turn to hug her. Elaine is one of those special people who volunteer at Atonement Child Care Center. Atonement Child Care Center needed to relocate due to changes at the church where they had been offering low cost Chirstian based child care for over 20 years. We have been blessed to have them relocate to West Hills Church in March of 2023. Unlike a number of child care facilities, Atonement offers a Christian curriculum,







according to Executive Director Shari Boudle, including activities and learning experienes in language, math, dramatic play, science, social skills, gross and fine motor skills, music, reading and pre-writing skills for children from 6 weeks through 12 years of age. The children's attendance ranges from 6:30 am to 6:00 pm, Monday through Friday. The staff and volunteers are dedicated to sharing their love of God with each child. Children are served breakfast. lunch and a late afternoon snack. You may have even encountered these beautiful children as they are led by a caring staff member to one of the many activities or meals in the church on any weekday. Marti Bloes, or as the children greet her "Ms. Marti" has volunteered to teach Bible lessons to the children. With her wonderful love for God and his children, and her special teaching skills, the children are learning and growing in their love for our Jesus. Jessica Scheopner also volunteered to teach a summer class for the school-aged children to help them explore the life of Jesus and how Jesus related to their life. In talking with a number of parents who bring their children to Atonement, they have shared about their, "search for a safe environment" for their children and how happy their children are every morning they drive to Atonement. If you have an interest in volunteering at Atonement feel free to call them at 4O2-572-6917. You may want to assist the staff with one or more of the many activities the children are involved in, or perhaps just take an hour out of your week to read a story to them. For whatever interest you may have, one thing is certain: Your time will be well-spent! 




# **Book Suggestion**


# May Session Notes
