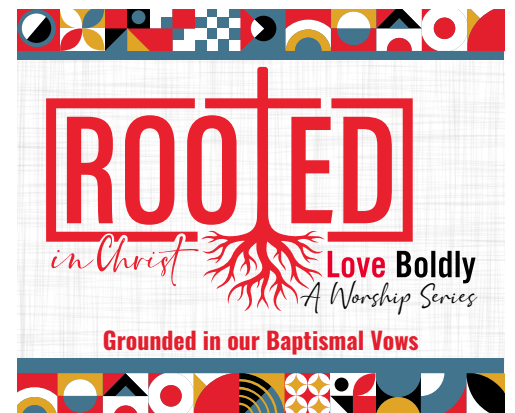
INCLUSIVE LANGUAGE

The Cokesbury Bell originally rang in students at Cokesbury College, Abingdon, MD, the first Methodist College in the World. After the school burned, the bell eventually found its way into the collection of Rev. Dr. John Goucher who used it for many years to ring in the students at the Woman's College of Baltimore (now, Goucher College). It is on permanent display at the Lovely Lane Museum & Archives, Baltimore, MD, who loaned it for this service.

ROOTED IN CHRIST THROUGH CREATIVE EXPRESSION

Liturgy means “the work of the people.” As United Methodists, we gather each Sunday to worship God – contributing all that we are to praise, prayer, thanksgiving, confession and commitment to discipleship. But each day, we also worship with our hands, our voices and the hundreds of small actions and responses we make in the world. Our gifts allow us to praise and worship God. So does our imagination and creative expression. We worship a Creator God, a God who planted a spark of wonder in each of our hearts.

In these next pages are the stories of United Methodists in this Area who use a variety of different arts to stay rooted in Christ.

DANCE:

JOSIE HOOVER

Sacred dance is a powerful and transformative form of creative expression that fosters spiritual renewal, connection, and growth. When shared with others, it creates opportunities for spiritual renewal, connectivity, and transformation. To me, this is “embodied theology,” and is a physical connection to the Divine, to creation, and to oneself.



Embodiment can be understood both practically and theologically. The dictionary describes it as giving tangible form to an abstract idea, while theologian Gregg R. Allison defines it as the fundamental state of human existence, fully living in our bodies. Together, these perspectives reflect how I live out my vocational call as both a dancer and a theological higher education administrator. Dance, for me, is intentional and incarnational. It moves beyond simple motion and engages the whole self, physical, emotional, and spiritual, transforming movement into sacred expression.

Through embodied movement, scripture becomes alive and active. Dance shifts from performance to proclamation, offering a prophetic witness rather than mere entertainment. When we connect more deeply with ourselves, we become more capable of authentic connection with those around us.

In both dance and education, embodied theology grounds me and sharpens my awareness of others' humanity, especially in times of distress. It encourages people to show up fully and authentically.

I am grateful for the opportunity to interpret Ephesians 3:16–19 through dance at the Baltimore-Washington Annual Conference. Through this offering, I hope to embody the theme, *Rooted in Christ: Love Boldly*, while creating space for reflection on God's presence and call in each life.

As we enter a liturgical season of growth and faithful living, may we all embody our faith boldly, wherever we are called.

ALTAR CROSS:

REV. BONNIE HAWK

“Working with wood keeps me rooted in Christ, who was likely a carpenter himself, and most certainly knew how to see the beauty in creation and make all things new.”



The altar cross is inspired by the processional cross, a collaboration with sculptor, Lauren Hill. Both pieces integrate multiple mediums to express the diversity and unity within our Area. The altar cross is made with wood from retired pews from churches throughout the connection.

As a pastor and furniture-maker, craft is a spiritual discipline that roots me in the physical world of creation. My grandfather taught me that wood must be respected and revered as it is crafted into beautiful objects. The woodshop teaches many of the virtues of Christian discipleship – patience, gentleness, kindness, and above all—humility.

Rev. Bonnie Hawk is an elder in the BWC and a professional furniture maker. She serves Mt. Carmel UMC in Frederick and is a porch-swing-enthusiast.

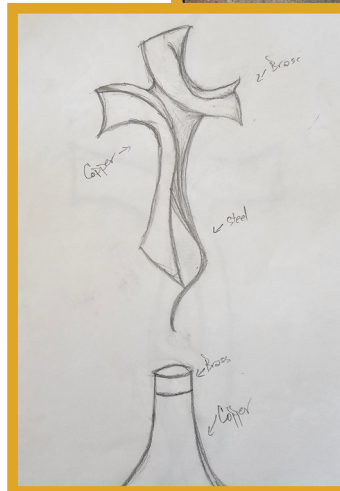

PROCESSIONAL CROSS:

LAUREN HILL

Using brass, copper, and steel to express movement and unity, this design was inspired by growing roots, flowing water, and burning flame. My hope is that this processional cross carries with it a deepening sense of the unending grace we all receive through Christ. With an intentional choice of using three metals, I also offer artistic expression to the Holy Trinity.



The creative process is how I feel most connected with the Lord and the world around me, and every moment at the forge is a humbling, grounding experience. Through the heat of the flames and strikes of the hammer, it is an honor to carry on this centuries old craft as a spiritual offering. I am grateful to have collaborated with Furniture Maker and BWC Elder, Bonnie Hawk, who incorporates the wooden element for this design, adding another visual expression of unity as we bring these two materials together.

Laurie is a commission-based Sculptor in Woodsboro, MD, and worship leader for Fairview Chapel, under the leadership of Pastor Scott Clawson, New Market UMC. Having grown up in the United Methodist Church, this Commission is an incredible honor and has been a joy to work on.

As an artist, I have long understood that whether creating art for my local church, opening a new exhibition of paintings, or creating and leading a community organization, my vision and my creativity are deeply rooted in God's infinite and inseparable love. From that place of connection there is nothing to distinguish between the sacred and the secular, for all of it is holy. All of it comes from the same source.

When first considering this year's conference theme Rooted in Christ: Love Boldly, I knew immediately I wanted root imagery to define the altar as the heart of our space. Working as I was, in the depths of a bitterly cold winter, I loved the joyous reminder that in spring and summer, new life bursts from old roots. I hope

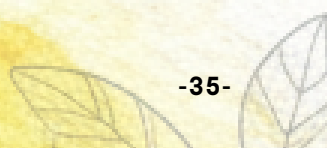
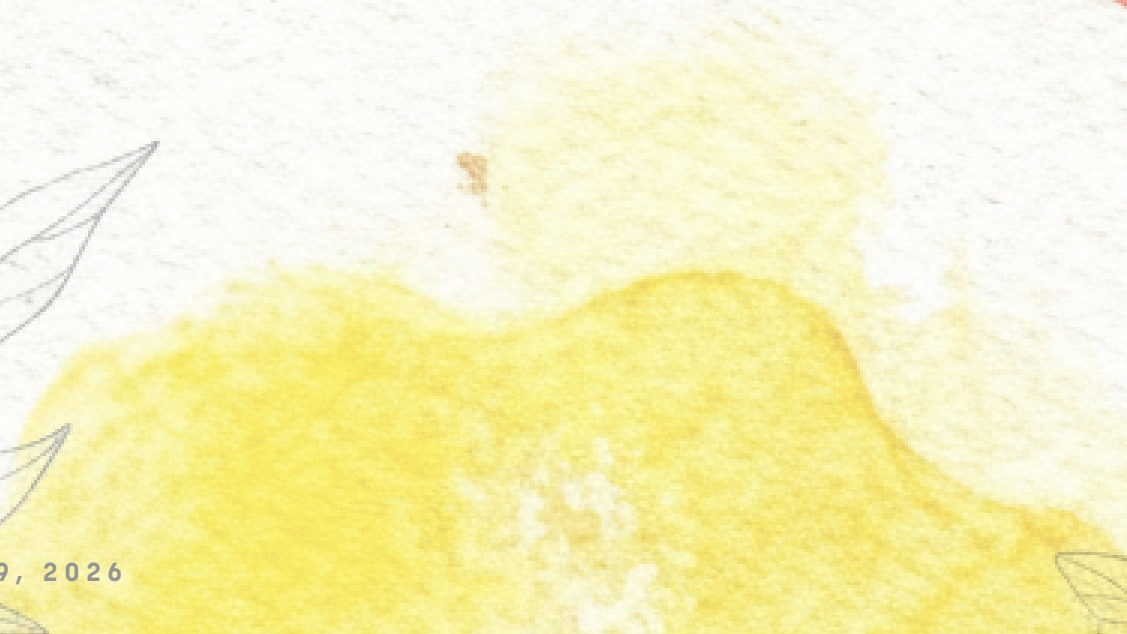
the altar reminds us that from pruned branches deep roots create abundant new growth.

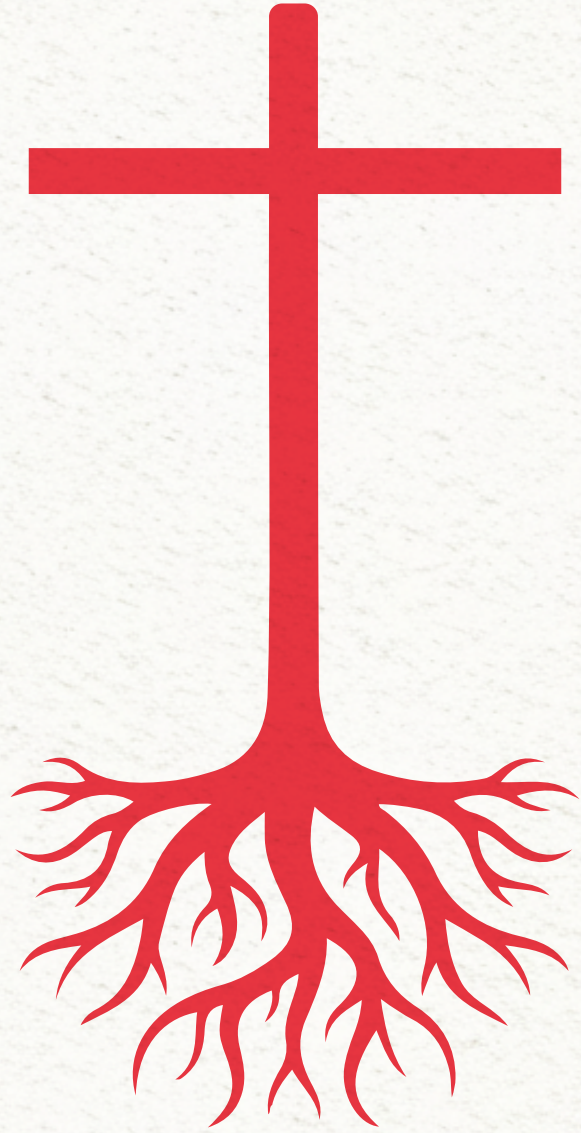
