


Proper Preface

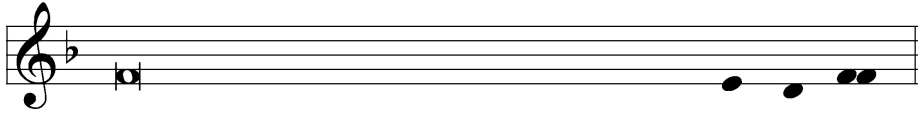

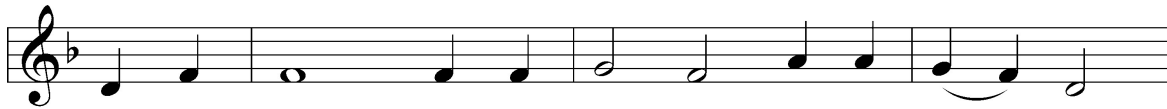

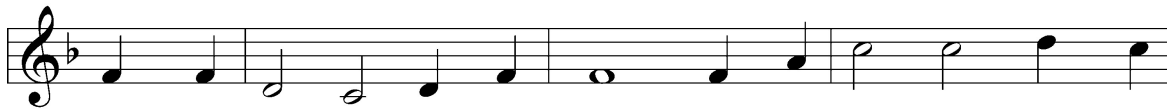
