About the Cover: As Jesus set His mind on things that are above, His zeal simply could not allow His Father's house to become an earthly house of trade (see Colossians 3:2). The religious leaders despised the Lord's purpose of the temple and would later seek to destroy the temple of His body, wherein God tabernacled among His people (see John 1:14). Christ was crucified, died, and was buried. But He has been raised for our justification (see Romans 4:25).
