Prof Insights - Care of Souls in a Sexualized Society

A year ago, Lord of Life hosted Rev. Dr. Korey Maas to give a scholarly lecture and preach and teach on Sunday. This year we are hosting another Lutheran scholar but the details are a little different. Every summer at churches throughout the country, professors from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis teach continuing education workshops for pastors and laypeople. This series of lectures is called Prof Insights and this year, Lord of Life will be hosting Rev. Dr. Rick Marrs on June 30-July 2. This workshop will consider the positive aspects of our bodies and sexuality and how pastors and churches can teach parishes about the gifts God has given. The workshop will also explore the challenges that our corrupted sexual nature brings to pastors who teach and lead congregations, e.g., homosexuality, cohabitation, promiscuity, internet pornography, trans-sexuality, polygamy and divorce."

Russian Missionary visit to Immanuel Lutheran Church

Rev. Dr. Alexey Streltsov, Rector (President), Elena Streltsova (theological translator) and Rev. Dr. Timothy Quill (Director of Fundraising for the SLMS) will be at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Fairview on Tuesday, June 3 starting at 7:00PM as part of a three-week tour organized by the Siberian Evangelical Lutheran Church and Seminary (SLMS). Dr. Quill served as the Director of the Concordia Theological Seminary Russian Project since it was established in 1996. Dr. Streltsov earned a Master of Theology and Master of Sacred Theology from CTS and a PhD from the

University of Novosibirsk where he also serves on the faculty and as a Fellow. The purpose is to update people about the work of the Lutheran Church in Russia during the current cultural changes and challenges due to the war between Russia and Ukraine. Light refreshments will be served after.

Salvation Outline

The following seven points summarize the basic information about the human condition and God's saving grace. You may want to memorize these points so that you may share them with someone who does not yet believe in Jesus as his or her Savior.

- 1. *God loves you!* "For God so loved the world, that he gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).
- 2. You are a sinner. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23).
- 3. *God punishes sin.* "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (**Rom. 6:23**).
- 4. *Jesus took our punishment.* "But God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (**Rom. 5:8**).
- 5. *Jesus rose from the dead.* "For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures" (1 Cor. 15:3–4).
- 6. Jesus offers forgiveness of sins and eternal life to those who believe in Him. "Then he brought them out and said, 'Sirs, what must I do to be saved?' And they said, 'Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household" (Acts 16:30–31).
- Salvation is free—a gift from God. "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast" (Eph. 2:8–9).
