### **Youth Notes in the Church Year from Higher Things**

Jesus is the Door and the Shepherd who goes to the cross for sinners. Though thieves remain, His risen voice still gives forgiveness, life, and salvation for you.

### **Stewardship Thought in the Church Year**

**1 Peter 2:21** – “**For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you might follow in his steps.**” Our heavenly Father wants us to grow into the image of His Son and to follow in His steps. Jesus suffered for us not only to redeem us, but also to show us what love looks like and to leave us an example of self-giving, sacrificial generosity. “Let us ever walk with Jesus, follow His example pure.”

### **A Life Thought in the Church Year**

The first generation of Christians were “selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need” (Acts 2:45). They did this because they recognized that the Gospel of Jesus grants worth and dignity to every person. This doesn't mean that each Christian needs to sell all they have. But it does mean that we would “die to sin and live to righteousness” (1 Peter 2:24), loving the poor and needy as well as the unborn, the sick, and the dying.

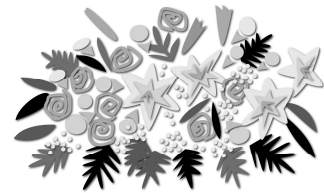
