Dr. Korey Maas is an associate professor of history at Hillsdale College and an ordained minister in the LCMS. He is both an historian and a theologian and you will have the opportunity to hear him speak on both topics the weekend of June 7th-9th beginning with an RSVP-only barbeque dinner on Friday, June 7th at 6:30 PM. The topic of his presentation that evening will be: "The Significance of Christianity in the Study of History" He has also been asked to say a few words about Hillsdale College, which, many of you know, is a small conservative Christian college in Michigan. The next morning, Saturday June 8, Dr. Maas will give a presentation at a brunch for the men's group at 10:00 AM. The topic will be the "The Significance of History in the Study of Christianity." I am told this presentation will lean


heavily in the direction of Christian apologetics. Then on Sunday, Dr. Maas will preach at both divine services and lead the Bible study. This is a great opportunity to interact with a leader in our church body and an excellent scholar. All events (except the Divine Services!) will have opportunities for Q&A.

Korey and I have been friends since we attended seminary together in the late 90's. Then after graduation, we both ended up in Southern California. Korey taught at Concordia University in Irvine while I was a pastor in Pomona. Korey went to England to get his PhD at Oxford and finished in 2006. His doctoral thesis was on the English Lutheran Reformer and martyr, Robert Barnes. Barnes was a friend of Martin Luther and someone you should know about. If you are curious to learn more you should look him up online and, of course, you can ask Dr. Maas all about him since he (literally) wrote the book on him!

Before moving to Hillsdale in 2010, Korey and his wife Kate attended St. Paul Lutheran Church in Pomona where I was the pastor and he was an elder and regular guest preacher.

I hope you will take advantage of this opportunity and attend some of the events to hear him speak. I think you will enjoy learning from him as much as I and so many others have.

Trip to the Dominican Republic?

As many of you are well aware, our congregation has been involved in supporting missions in the Dominican Republic for many years. It started when my brotherin-law, Joel Fritsche, was called there in about 2014 and we agreed with the LCMS Office of International Missions to support him for several years. Now a portion of our offerings go to support Concordia Reformer Lutheran Seminary and Mercy Center in Palmar Arriba, Dominican Republic. That came about when, in 2020, just days before the Covid lockdowns, a group of ten members from Lord of Life traveled to visit the seminary and the mission congregations in and around Palmar Arriba. It was an inspiring trip as we were privileged to see God at work in and through the missionaries in the Dominican Republic blessing many people and making the Gospel of Jesus known. A year and a half after our trip, and after the worse of the Covid lockdowns ended, our congregation collected a large love offering to support the seminary and missionaries. We collected \$52,000 which, last I heard, is the largest offering from any short term team to visit the seminary.

Another interesting development that has happened since, is that we now support Lutheran missions in Cuba as one of the seminary students we met in 2020 is now serving as a pastor in Holguin. (You may recall I traveled there late last year to attend his ordination.)

Recently, the suggestion was made to send another group from Lord of Life to visit the missions and see how we might be able to assist them. To that end, if you would like to visit there with me and a group of folks from church, would you please email me (pastorshaltanis@yahoo.com) and let me know? We are looking at travel dates in early September of this year or early March of next year. Those dates are not absolute, and depending on the number of people interested, we may decide to attend another time altogether. Costs are largely dependent on airfare, but last time our group had a wonderful experience for a very reasonable price. Just let me know your level of interest and we can see where this leads.

This is my formal acceptance of the deaconess internship assignment offered to me by my brothers and sisters at Lord of Life Lutheran Church in Plano, Texas. I am very excited to begin the ministry that the Lord has in store for me to do, and I am honored to be able to do so by starting my service here with you and for you. I enjoyed talking with Rev. Shaltanis about what my service here at Lord of Life may all entail! I think it's nice that Lord of Life has not had a deaconess intern in the past, and I have never been a deaconess intern – so we all have the chance to learn and grow together in this new experience!

While I will do my best to get to know each of you during my time here at Lord of Life, it might be nice for you all to know a little bit about me too. I was born in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, as the 2nd oldest of 5 kids.
