You can help our JBJ Garden Grow! Attention all Gardeners and Gardener-Wannabe's! Everyone knows that gardens produce best when organic-rich soils are used. One of the best ways to enrich soils is household compost. Starting Sunday, May 4, our Church will assist the JBJ gardeners by collecting compost materials from your homes. It's as easy as can be. Here's all you need to do. Using a coffee tin or similar container (one with a lid), place it near the kitchen sink. As you prepare or eat certain foods, any fruit or vegetable scrap (peels, ends, cores, etc.), egg shells, coffee grounds and filters or tea bags can be placed in the container. You may wish to keep the container — or a second perhaps larger one - in the refrigerator if leaving it out produces odors or fruit flies. Then, every Sunday, bring your compost to the Church and place it in one of the designated labeled compost bins. One bin will be downstairs outside of the Fellowship (pickleball) Hall kitchen and a second bin will be in the mail room just outside of the Sanctuary — ask an usher if you are unsure. You can leave your container next to the bin and collect it on your way out. The gardeners will then collect the donated compost and put it in the garden's compost unit.
