THE RESPONSE

ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS, AND COMMISSIONING OF TRUSTEES

OPENING WORDS

Pastor: There are many gifts,

People: but it is the same Spirit that gives them.
Pastor: There are many ways of serving God,
People: but it is the same Lord who is served.

Pastor: God works through different people in different ways,

People: but it is the same God whose purpose is achieved through them all.

Pastor: We are all called into the church of Jesus Christ by baptism, and marked as Christ's own by the Holy Spirit. This is our common calling, to be disciples and servants of our servant Lord. Within our common ministry, some members are chosen for particular work as elders, deacons and trustees. In ordination and commissioning we recognize these special ministries, remembering that our Lord Jesus said: "Whosoever wants to be great among you must become the servant of all, just as the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life that others might live."

THE PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATES

*THE APOSTLES' CREED

THE ORDINATION QUESTIONS FOR ELDERS AND DEACONS

Pastor: Friends, God has called you by the voice of this congregation to serve Jesus Christ in a special way. As you begin this new chapter in your discipleship, I ask you these questions:

Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through him believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit?

Elders and Deacons: I do.

Pastor: Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church Universal, and God's word to you?

Elders and Deacons: I do.

Pastor: Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Elders and Deacons: I do and I will.

Pastor: Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture and be continually guided by our confessions?

Elders and Deacons: I will.

Pastor: Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit?

Elders and Deacons: I will.

Pastor: Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Elders and Deacons: I will.

Pastor: Do you promise to further the peace, unity and purity of the church?

Elders and Deacons: I do.

Pastor: Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination and love?

Elders and Deacons: I will.

Pastor: Will you be a faithful deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need? In your ministry, will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Deacons: I will.

Pastor: Will you be a faithful ruling elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

Elders: I will.

QUESTIONS FOR MEMBERS OF THE RYE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Clerk: Do we, the members of this church, accept these men and women as ruling elders and deacons of the Rye Presbyterian Church, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

People: We do.

Clerk: Do we agree to pray for them, encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is head of the church?

People: We do.

THE COMMISSIONING OF TRUSTEES

Clerk: We now commission Bob Connor, Don Davis, John Holland, Christina Mohraz, and Terry Stack as trustees in the service of Jesus Christ.

Pastor: The grace bestowed upon you in baptism is sufficient for your calling because it is God's grace. By God's grace we are saved, and enabled to grow in the faith and to commit our lives in ways that serve Christ. God has called you to particular service. Please show your purpose by answering these questions:

Pastor: Do you affirm Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior?

Trustees: I do.

Pastor: Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his Word and showing his love?

Trustees: I will.

Pastor: Do you welcome the responsibility of this service because you are determined to follow the Lord Jesus, to love neighbors, and to work for the reconciling of the world?

Trustees: I do.

Pastor: Do you promise to give the business affairs of this congregation your devoted attention, to encourage generosity, and, in all your dealings, work to further our service of Christ in the world?

Trustees: I do.

Pastor: Will you serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination and love, relying on God's mercy, and rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit?

Trustees: I will.

CONGREGATIONAL AFFIRMATION

Clerk: Do you, members of this church, confirm the call to these men and women as trustees in the service of Jesus Christ?

People: We do.

Clerk: Will you support and encourage them in this ministry?

People: We will.

ORDINATION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS (*The candidates to be ordained are invited to kneel.*)

Pastor: The Lord be with you. **People: And also with you.**

Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People:** It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Pastor: Gracious and eternal God, with joy we give you all thanks and praise. In every time and place you have chosen servants from among your people to point the way to salvation. We are grateful for ancestors in the faith who followed without fear, placing their trust in you alone. We thank you for men and women in every age who have nurtured your people in faith and faithfulness. Above all we praise you for Jesus Christ, who came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life to set others free. Anointed by your Holy Spirit, he proclaimed your reign on earth, revealing your saving love in all he said and did.

All: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon your servants whom you called through baptism as your own and marked as your own. Grant them the same mind that was in Christ Jesus. Give them a spirit of truthfulness that they may show the compassion of Christ in the actions of daily living and rightly govern your people. Give them the gifts of your Holy Spirit to build up the church, to strengthen the common life of your people, and to lead with compassion and vision. In the walk of faith and for the work of ministry, give to your servants gladness and strength, discipline and hope, humility, humor, and courage, and an abiding sense of your presence.

Pastor: Gracious God, pour out your Spirit of power and truth upon the whole church that we may be for you a holy people, baptized to serve you in the world. Sustain this congregation in ministry. Ground us in the gospel, secure our hope in Christ, strengthen our service to the outcast, and increase our love for one another. Show us the transforming power of your grace in our life together, that we may be servants of the gospel, offering a compelling witness in the world to the good news of Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**


Childcare for ages 3 months through 3-year-olds is being offered this Sunday! Childcare can be found on the first floor of the Education
