With the blessing of Session, the RPC Mission and Outreach Committee has decided to split this year's Lenten special offering.

50% will go to direct LA fire relief primarily through the Bel Air Presbyterian Church. Through conversations with their pastor, we have learned of their work not only with families in their own church who lost their homes, but with churches and people in both Pacific Palisades and Altadena. We're introducing a new program at RPC! Join us for our first run on Friday, March 21, at 6:00 a.m.


Friday mornings at 6:00 a.m.
