A year ago in this space, I wrote a note entitled Change is Gonna Come. From where I sat then in blissful ignorance, it was a lighthearted musing on the inherent irony of the Christmas season – that we celebrate the arrival of the One who comes to change us and all the world, with traditions that remain firmly unchanged, year after year. "We welcome the One who calls us to new life - to change and to grow into our God-given purpose. And we do so with traditions that we hold with the tightest of grips."

The symbol a year ago was our vertically challenged Christmas tree out on the lawn in front of the sanctuary around which we gather and sing every year at the start of Advent - our beloved and longstanding tree-lighting and dessert tradition that ushers in the Christmas season.

But as I noted last year, the day is coming when it will no longer be feasible to light that particular tree. The tree is too oddly shaped, having lost its top in a storm, and the lights are giving out. Soon we will need to light only the new smaller tree. Change is coming, and when it comes to Christmas traditions, I'm not sure any of us are fond of too much change.

Here we are, just one year later. And change is here. Some of it arrived during the pandemic, with people moving in and out of town, with new habits established and old habits altered. In the last few months, John Miller announced his retirement, and I now face a chronic health condition. Not to mention all that troubles our hearts and minds and relationships from the news around the world.

Change...is here. Sometimes we welcome it. Sometimes we don't.

So perhaps this year we view this month and the Advent/ Christmas season with different eyes and from a different angle. Instead of the Christ child coming to disrupt and rearrange the world, this year may we all sense in a deeper way the presence of the One who comes to bring "comfort and joy." One who like the steady, quiet flame that we will hold in our hand at the tree lighting on December 3, brings us a reminder of God's faithful presence with us amid the tumult of change, and amid the shadows that creep in. May we know the One who promises to meet both our hopes and our fears.



In addition, the orchestra will offer selected movements from the *Orchestral Suite in D*, also by Bach, for the prelude, offertory music, and postlude. Following the service, a festive reception will take place in the Assembly Room. Coming Home

In 2023 we were able to successfully relaunch our Coming Home after three years off due to Covid. If you aren't familiar with COMING HOME, it is an extension of our long-standing Prison Ministry at Rye Presbyterian Church. The program seeks to empower those who are returning to the community from incarceration. The 18-week program pairs RPC congregants with the formerly incarcerated to help them transition back into the community. Teaching sessions and a shared meal are on Thursday evenings. In 2024 we plan to begin on February 1 and conclude with graduation on Sunday, June 2.



This ministry offers several volunteer opportunities, including serving as mentors, who are paired with participants, supporting and encouraging them during the course of the program; as well as cooks who prepare and serve a meal enjoyed by the participants and RPC congregants who share table fellowship together. As always, we need a committed group of volunteers who will once again serve to make Rye Presbyterian Church a place of welcome to those who are returning home from prison.
