## **Instructions for Eucharistic Adorers:**

- Eucharistic Adoration is usually located in the Daily Chapel.
- Please remember to sign in. Scheduled Adorers just tap their names on the iPad. The iPad is located near the Narthex door.
- Remember that as a scheduled Adorer, you are also the **guardian** of the Blessed Sacrament, so please *never leave Our Lord alone*.
- Out of common courtesy all Adorers should be on time. **Please be prompt.** The Adorers you relieve might not be able to stay.
- Please do not leave until at least one scheduled Adorer (or sub) from the next Holy Hour arrives. If no one arrives, please call the Hour Captain (number is on the screen of the iPad.)
- In case of emergency, all three doors from the Daily chapel take you almost directly to the outside.

## If you cannot attend your Holy Hour:

Please email or text your prayer partners and your Adoration Hour Captain. Adorers sharing the same Holy Hour are considered "prayer partners." We try to have at least 3 or 4 people, prayer partners, scheduled per Holy Hour. This way subs are already built into each Holy Hour. If two scheduled Adorers will be there, it is not necessary to find a substitute.

If your absence will mean only one scheduled Adorer will be able to attend, please consider asking someone to substitute, such as a family member, friend, neighbor, parishioner. A wonderful way to evangelize!

If you still need a substitute, please use the WE ADORE HIM program to request a substitute or ask your Hour Captain to request a sub.

## **Additional Thoughts:**

The Holy Eucharist is the continuation of Christ's Incarnation on earth where the same Jesus born two thousand years ago in Bethlehem is as truly present with us now as He was then. Again, He comes quietly and humbly. Again, only the humble can see, with eyes of faith, the humble Jesus hidden in the Blessed Sacrament. This is the faith that prompts you to come and adore Him. If we could see Him (in human form) with our eyes, everyone would run out to welcome Him. But He remains Hidden in the Blessed Sacrament because He is calling us to faith that we may come to Him in humility. *Just by the fact that you get into your car and come to visit Him with the intention of a quiet hour of Adoration is in itself a prayer of great faith!* 

The best, the most effective, and the surest way of bringing lasting peace on earth is through the great power of Eucharistic Adoration. Just as you can't be exposed to the sun, without receiving its rays, neither can you come to Jesus exposed in the Blessed Sacrament without receiving the divine rays of His grace, His love, His peace. Come and pray for peace in our families and in our world.

When St. Faustina was praying before Jesus in the Holy Eucharist, He showed her a vision. Each time a person entered the chapel and visited Jesus exposed in a monstrance, she saw His Divine Rays of Love and Mercy burst forth and encircle the whole world and everyone in it with graces and blessings! **Thank you for all the blessings your hour of adoration will bring!**
