We renewed our commitment to assist on the improvement of the trade school curriculum. Our goal is to enable students to make a living right after high school graduation.

This year we will also help open a technology room that will include a computer center and a science laboratory.



We made a lot of progress in the three new programs implemented last year!



Through the Program for Development of Personal and Social Wellbeing, we helped build a cafeteria for students and for teachers. We also supported the development of recreational programs and spaces for the students to gain a healthier lifestyle by participating in programs like soccer, volleyball, and others. Further, we assisted on opening a clinic that benefits the school and the community. This clinic offered its first vaccination campaign last month.

Through the Program for Religious education,

we helped explore options for religious education on campus. Students and staff started celebrating religious holidays with all students and facilitated forming a pastoral youth group. This group organizes activities and talks to strengthen Christian, human, and civic values of the students. We are helping expand the chapel to include a vestry and a bell tower.



Our Tutoring Program via Zoom grew immensely!

Several adults of our community offered FREE tutoring and reading sessions to students of all grades at the Bilingual School weekly for one hour.
