ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (#1514-1515) teaches that this sacrament is not only for those at the point of death, but for anyone seriously ill or facing serious surgery. In fact, it is preferred that parishioners entering the hospital for surgery should ask the priest for this sacrament before being admitted. Parishioners should never wait until the last minute to call. We encourage parishioners facing surgery to let the parish priest know of their condition before entering the hospital so that they can be anointed before admission.





EXPLORING THE WORD

REJOICING IN THE LORD

In the first reading, Ezra gets a strange reaction from the people to whom he reads the book of the law. First they lie down, with faces to the ground, and then they all are weeping. Remember the background of this reading. The people of Israel had returned from exile and needed to become a unified nation. Most had never heard the laws, so when they learned what was expected of them and realized how much of the Law they had broken, they wept from shame. Many probably didn't know that they had been breaking the law. Others might have been overwhelmed with all the requirements of the law.

Ezra and Nehemiah console the people by reminding them that their return makes this a day "holy to the Lord" (Nehemiah 8:10). He adds that they would draw strength from "rejoicing in the Lord." That may be good advice for us also.

We might find ourselves so trapped in sin that we think we could never be forgiven. We need to remember that Jesus loved sinners so much that he gave his life on the cross to free us from sin. No sin can be so bad that God's love cannot forgive it. In other words, God's forgiveness is only limited by our failure to ask for it. As the psalms say, God's mercy endures forever. In fact, the more I have to repent, the more God wants to forgive. So we can rejoice in the Lord's forgiveness and the Spirit will give us the strength to change our lives.

And what about those who find the law overwhelming? That usually means a lack of faith in God's willingness to help us or in our ability to do the best we can to live as Christians. It can also be because we have forgotten Jesus' saying that all of God's laws are contained in the command to love God and love our neighbor as we love ourselves. The more we come to accept God's presence in our lives and see God in others, the easier it becomes to keep the law of love.

<u>Lent</u>

Lent is the season that prepares us to celebrate Easter. The main reason Lent is important is that Easter is more important. On Easter we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, whose passage beyond death into life offers redemption to believers. The Resurrection is the cornerstone of Christian faith. The mystery of Christ's rising from the dead is so deep that the Church invites us to six weeks of preparation before we fully celebrate it. We call that period Lent.

For the faithful, Lent is a time of penitential practices and spiritual discipline. During this time, we acknowledge our sins and seek God's help to overcome them. Traditionally, we engage in acts of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Together these actions show our dependence on God, our renunciation of the fascinations of this world, and our desire to better the lives of others.

For the elect, those preparing for Baptism, Lent is a time of intense spiritual preparation. They will celebrate Baptism at Easter because in this sacrament they enter the mystery of Christ's dying and rising. They die to their former way of life and open their hearts fully to discipleship in Jesus. For the elect, this is a season of purification and enlightenment. The prayers of this season help scrutinize and purify their intentions, removing whatever might block their commitment, and strengthening their resolve. They will become fully illumined with the light of Christ when they celebrate initiation at the Easter Vigil.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends before the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Shepherd's Corner

I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me

As I was growing up, I can't recall how many times my mom would say to me, "Didn't you hear what I asked you to do? What's wrong, did it go in one ear and out the other?" This would happen when they asked me to do chores, to come home at a specific time, or in countless other scenarios where I heard what was being said but didn't follow through. Did you ever hear that expression, or something like it, as you were growing up?

In reflecting on Scriptures, I'm sure Jesus had to utter something similar in his lifetime as well. I think of how often he would say things and his disciples didn't get it. Or, if they did get it, how often they were quick to fall back into the same pattern of life as they had in the past. Two examples that come quickly to me is when Jesus says: "love your neighbor," and soon after that, the disciples want to call down fire from the sky on the Samaritans. Or when he tells them that he will suffer, die, and rise again, but right after the crucifixion they run back to their old ways of life: their fishing boats.

In our second reading from St. Paul to the Corinthians, Paul writes something we have all heard before in one fashion or another; "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ." (1 Cor 12:12) I've seen adaptations of this theme cross-stitched on pillows, framed in wall hangings, and sung in church. Many of us know the song, *We are Many Parts*. In fact, if you listen closely, you may hear people humming this if they're reading the bulletin before Mass.

Yes, in baptism we become part of the Church, the mystical body of Christ. And Paul reminds us that although we are one body, we all bring different gifts to the Church. And yet more times than not, it seems the way Jesus asks us to live goes in one ear and out the other.

In 2011, I was repulsed watching a scene in Bethlehem where two groups of monks were cleaning the Church of the Nativity in preparation for the Christmas celebrations. It seems one group of monks pushed his broom into the space another denomination of monks were in charge of. That action led to a literal fist fight captured by the news media and still available on places like YouTube. If this repulsed me, I can't image how Jesus must have been.

And while this is an extreme example, I have heard words exchanged in a church parking lot over parking spaces or in the gridlock that can occur when Mass is over. I'm not talking about Good Shepherd (that is, unless you feel your conscience being pricked). Or what about on the highways or in the workplaces. Would Jesus be proud of our actions?

We profess we are one body of Christ, yet there's a lot of division between us as we each want things to go our way. Christianity is not for the faint of heart. It is difficult to die to our own selfishness each day, but we're asked to be imitators of Jesus. May the Eucharist we share grant us heartfelt compassion and just maybe, a little more patience with one another.

Saturday, February 1 & Sunday, February 2 At all Masses - Church

At the end of all Masses the weekend of February 1 & 2, we will celebrate our devotion to Saint Blaise with the Blessing of Throats.

As part of the church tradition, we have the blessing of throats on the feast of St. Blaise (February 3rd). St. Blaise was bishop of Sebaste in Armenia in the fourth century. Before being martyred, he is said to have healed a boy who was choking. Since the eighth century, Saint Blaise has been venerated as the patron of those who suffer from diseases of the throat. As we receive the blessing of the throat, we ask for protection from afflictions of the throat and from other illnesses. The blessing of Saint Blaise is also a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick.






