LENTEN STUDY – "THE LAST SUPPER: CONVERSATIONS THAT LED TO THE CROSS" BY REV. DR. WILL WILLIMON: A wonderful new study from Bishop Will Willimon will be offered during this Lenten season at FRC. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday – February 18th. Here is a summary

of the study: "Travel with Jesus on the road to Jerusalem in this profound six-week Lenten study that explores the parables and stories Jesus told at tables along the way to his final meal. Will Willimon invites readers to experience how these table stories—about searching shepherds, welcoming hosts, prodigal sons, and rejected invitations—illuminate the deeper meaning of the Last Supper and Christ's sacrifice.
