Advent Study


Sundays at 10:30 am - December 1, 8, 15, and 22 LIGHT OF THE WORLD A Beginner's Guide to Advent

FOOD PANTRY REPORT

During November 179 families were served which provided food for 508 people. After 72 families signed up for Thanksgiving dinner menu meals it was a surprise that only 50 families came to pick up the items. Forty turkeys were picked up by Mickey Koehler from Porter Regional Hospital.

It was awesome that more turkeys were offered but pantry freezer space was limited. A variety of pies received from Strack's on Calumet were offered for dessert. Holiday bags from Strack's on Calumet and Hwy. 30 along with more from Town & Country have been a great help in helping to fill the near-empty pantry shelves. Christmas dinner items will be offered with a choice of a ham or a turkey. A number of holiday monetary donations will cover the cost of the hams. The families picking up the holiday meal items are appreciative of these special offerings and it is convenient that they can be picked up on the same day as when they come for their regular food items. Of course, basic foods are needed as each family is eligible to be served twice a month. Donations of the traditional 'basic' items are always needed and appreciated. Cereals, tuna in water, peanut butter, 1# pkgs. of rice, spaghetti sauce, canned fruit, pork 'n' beans and mixed veggies are examples of 'basic items.' Kleenex, paper towels, laundry and dish detergents along with cleaning or personal health supplies are also appreciated. And as mentioned each month - any kind of pantry 'help' is greatly appreciated by clients and volunteers.

December Mission of the Month **ZOE EMPOWERS**

Week 2: HOW IT WORKS



1) Supportive Community: Zoe staff (indigenous to each country) work with local leaders to identify the most vulnerable children living in extreme poverty with no adult able to care for them. These isolated youth (15-19 yrs.) attend a meeting where they are told of God's love for them, share their stories, and meet others who share their struggles. Thev are placed in empowerment groups of 25-30 families, whose oldest members meet weekly to individual and mutual help plan activities. For example, they all gather

at one member's home to plant or harvest crops, or build a house.

2) Trainings and Mentors:

Zoe provides holistic local trainings on health/hygiene, child rights, modern farming methods, animal husbandry, entrepreneurship, and business management/finance. Small start-up grants help launch income generation, and the group chooses a local mentor to support them.



3) **Building on Successes:** As the children begin generating income or crops, they are taught to save, diversify, and invest in new businesses, involving their siblings also. They gain self-confidence and community respect and have pride in sending siblings to school and attending church in decent clothing. Once they have basic needs met, they often share and teach other vulnerable children, even adopting other orphans. Zoe groups reach out and serve the elderly and disabled in their villages, sharing the love of God they have received.
