Hopefully you've had a chance to visit Northwood in the past month to see first-hand the updates being made to enhance our facility. We hope you are pleased with the vision to update and create a more open and inviting space. A lot of items were listed in the Annual Report under the Stewardship, Finance and Property (SFP) Team including but not limited to painting, installing new carpet and baseboards in hallways, opening a wall for a Gathering Place and creating a new space for the Parlor. We've tried out different furniture arrangements and wall art and we are very close to the finished product. We have been very fortunate to have funds available in reserve to cover all the costs to-date and the SFP team members have been good stewards of those funds.

The SFP Team has more projects that are being prioritized for this year like the gymnasium floor, cabinets in the classrooms and kitchen counters. The Sanctuary was recently painted and new baseboards installed and there are more maintenance projects that we will oversee like carpet and upholstery cleaning and landscaping. Our facility will always require something to be done next.


